# Warburton Golf Course Results February

How anyone can not enjoy playing Warburton is beyond comprehension. There a members in the club who boycott the course on principle. Warby is a picturesque climb through beautiful countryside, the course itself is immaculately maintained and it offers a variety of different holes and gives back a lot of love by rewarding well-played strokes and punishes those who stray too far off the fairways. The eighteenth hole has to be the most spectacular golf hole anywhere in the world. The view from the tee box down into the valley on 18 is awesome and being able to watch a golf ball hang in the air for 15 to 20 seconds is just brilliant even if you finish the hole with a Newell or more.

Barry Hemsley made his maiden trip out to Warburton and there is little doubt that it won't be his last visit there. Barry hit 103 Nett 67 beating his previous Sunday Leave Pass career best score (109) by 6 strokes. Barry finished in 2<sup>nd</sup> place for the month and was it not for a poor putting day (39 slaps with the flat stick) he could have easily given Chris Sfiligoj a run for his money. Barry

was so captivated and awe struck by the 18<sup>th</sup> hole that he lapsed in concentration and after hitting his longest ever drive down the middle of the fairway on the last hole he then managed to choke, he skulled his ball into the water and racked up a score of 9 which arguably cost him the winner's title.

Even though he is yet to let us know if he is playing at Centenary Park or going on the Corowa Golf trip Barry has already confirmed his availability for Warburton in 2018, 2019 and 2020. Chris Sfiligoj averages 104.88 shots per round, and in his 66 rounds that he has played with the Sunday Leave Pass Social Club he has never really looked like breaking a score of 90, so he was delighted when the numbers on his scorecard tallied up to 89 Nett 63. This was good enough to earn him 15 championship points and his February victory gave Chris his 4<sup>th</sup> career title and his first win since the golf trip in 2012.

It would have made for an interesting conversation home in the Choc Top mobile. Greg Parsons was chauffeuring both the winner and the loser of the Warburton Round for the 2 hour drive back to Mount Martha. Will Fernie finished the day with 88, which wouldn't have been so bad had that not been his Nett score. Popeye had a spinach shortage during the week and the outcome was a lackluster performance on the fairways, a total of 100 hits was not a score that we were expecting to be posted from Will especially considering he has just upped the ante and is now playing regularly at his new course in Patterson River where they are already calling him a bushranger with a handicap of 14.

The club has officially reached its capacity so please put a hold on recruiting any new members for the rest of the year. We only have booked for 32 players for each course and our attendances this year have been 31 and 32 with many of the regulars being unavailable to play during those rounds.

The other thing to remember when you are on a recruiting drive is that at the moment it seems as though all of the new blokes that we are bringing into the club are actually all good golfers and they are making the rest of us look really bad. Each month it seems as though we are being raided and raped by a new recruit, last month we had to award Brad Hughes with 8 balls from the Eaglesnet, and then this month Brendan Waters carded his 2<sup>nd</sup> Eagle from 3 rounds with Sunday Leave Pass social club after he made a regulation tap in putt for an eagle 2 on the uphill 295 meter par 4 13<sup>th</sup> hole at Warburton.

If you look at Brendan's Eclectic score card after playing 2x Rounds at Warburton you wonder why he is a member at Albert Park and not Warburton. Taking his best score on each hole, he has actually played the golf course at 9 under par with two bogies left to haunt him.

Brendan wasn't the only person to be making birdies. There were a total of 13 sub-par hole scores carded and there was also a couple of other eagle putts that couldn't quite get converted. Even Will Fernie had a birdie in amongst his sevens and eights.

With so many good scores it was difficult to win a skin. Even Brendan Waters' eagle was for no reward as Dale Robinson birdied the same hole and therefore had the same number of stableford points (4pointer) so the hole Jackpotted.

Just a reminder that for every round you play you are awarded a raffle ticket to go towards the end of year raffle, then extra tickets are issued if you wear the official club shirt plus extra tickets can also be won by winning a hole in the monthly skins competition.

"SKINS" were distributed to those players good enough to win a hole outright. If more than 1 player got the lowest score on a hole it is Jackpotted until an outright winner occurs.

It wasn't just the 18<sup>th</sup> hole that proved difficult for Supercoach. He only managed to hit his drive on the seventh hole past the ladies markers because they were behind him. His second and thirds shots on the first hole travelled a combined distance of 57cm and they were played from only 40 meters in front of the tee box.

Despite his total lack of form the Supercoach still kept himself out of the beer wenching territory. Greg Parson was only a couple of shots shy of going back to back in the pink dress, however it was Will Fernie who played the worst round for the day.

Congrats to Brendan Waters who scored an Eagle 2 and interestingly he came very close to splitting the 6 ball Jackpot with himself, because he also had a 2 putt tap in Birdie 4 on the par 5 eighth hole which really should have been another eagle.

There were some brilliant rounds of golf this month. Chris Sfiligoj was definitely the best of the best. A career best 89 off the stick gave him a 4 stroke buffer over his nearest rival. Barry Hemsley had his maiden trip to Warburton and was rewarded with a 2<sup>nd</sup> place finish beating Leigh MacIsaac on a countback. The lowest gross score for the day was Brendan Waters who was generously given a handicap of 5 to start his Sunday Leave Pass journey although once he is converted to the slope handicap after round 5 his handicap will come down dramatically. Colin has shown that his handicap was his golf clubs and his new set has elevated him into top 5 playing status.

For the benefit of the newcomers or the uneducated we thought it would be a good opportunity to go through the player rankings and point scoring system again.

Sunday Leave Pass competitions are run using Stroke so you need to count every shot that you play and you need to finish every hole. Each players Nett total score is then calculated by deducting the players handicap from the Gross score. If a player doesn't have an official Sunday Leave Pass handicap then a temporary played to handicap is allocated on the day using the Callaway handicapping system.

Once the players Nett score is calculated they are ranked from lowest score to highest score. (BeerWench) Where more than one player has the same Nett Score (such as Tom Kellythorn and Tony MacIsaac) then the place allocations are decided based on a countback system.

The count back system is formulated as the following.

\*Total number of stableford points scored on the back nine holes.

\*In the event that both players have the same stableford score on the back nine it then reverts to the number of stableford points scored on the eighteenth hole. If this is the same then it goes to the 17<sup>th</sup> hole, sixteenth hole, fifteenth hole until a players has a better hole and therefore has a higher stableford score than the other.

PLEASE NOTE THAT THE COUNT BACK IS ON HOLES 10-18 irrespective of whether it is a two tee start, a normal hit off from the first hole or as in the case of Warburton we hit off the 1<sup>st</sup> and the 10<sup>th</sup> holes. It is always the 10<sup>th</sup> to 18<sup>th</sup> holes and if one person starts on the 10<sup>th</sup> hole and the other hits off the first

Once all of the players are ranked then the Seasons Championship points are allocated according to the position in the field.

hole then it still remains exactly the same formula.

The player in 1<sup>st</sup> place gets 15 points, 2<sup>nd</sup> place 14 points, 3<sup>rd</sup> place 13 points, etc etc. Any player who completes the round however finishes ranked outside the top 14 and is placed between 15<sup>th</sup> spot to BeerWench then they are all allocated 1 championship point for attending.

The player with the most points at the end of the year is crowned the Points champion irrespective of how many rounds a person has played. If one person plays 13 rounds for the year and the person in 2<sup>nd</sup> place has only played 10 rounds but is close to the same score then that is bad luck to the person in 2<sup>nd</sup> place. All players are invited to play the entire fixture. We reward participation rather than perfection and performance so if you play more often you will end up with more points..

PLEASE NOTE: This year the monthly winner has the option of exchanging the number of balls owed to Raffle tickets for the end of year prize draw.

The golf course conceded some pretty good scores and as a consequence the handicapper took the liberty to shave the handicaps of a large proportion of the field. The biggest movers in were Barry, Chris, Colin, Leigh and Todd and justifiably so.

From 32 players only Rick, Tom and Wayne James were audited with the red ink, meaning they will be given a little bit more on the handicap for Centenary Park

For the benefit of all concerned and especially the new comers we have included a detailed explanation as to how the handicapping system works. What is important to note is that during the early rounds your handicap is dictated by your best scores. If a player has a very low out of the ordinary round, this will become the anchor point and will hold your handicap down very low.

Ian Mutes for example has just carded his best round and the impact on his handicap was 7 strokes. Will Fernie has two rounds in the low eighties and the rest of his golf has been in the 90's his anchor score however is the lowest rounds and therefore his handicap is down at 12 rather than at 19 where he would like it to be. The more rounds you play the more the scores average out until you have completed 18 rounds or more where you handicap becomes a more accurate reflection of your playing ability. At this point your handicap becomes the average of the sum of your best 8 scores from the most recent 20 rounds multiplied by 0.93 which becomes your handicap.

Congratulations to Brad Hughes and Brendan Waters who both completed their 3<sup>rd</sup> rounds with Social Club so they have been allocated a starting SLP handicap which will switch across to the Slope system after 5 rounds.

With rounds of 85,85 and 85 Brads handicap is pretty easy to calculate. He is off 12.6 next month at Centenary Park. Brendan on the other hand might have come out of the Supercoaches handicap manipulation school. His first 3 rounds have been 72, 82 &73 so he has been generously given a handicap of 5.0.

#### **HANDICAPS**

The changes to player's handicaps are as follows:

**BOLD RED NUMBERS**- refer to players whose handicap has gone out


**BOLD GREEN NUMBERS-** refer to players whose handicap has come in

As a new member of the Social Club the Callaway Handicapping system is used to give the player a daily played to handicap for the first couple of rounds. Once they have played 3 rounds they are given a temporary club handicap using the original AGU handicapping system. After 5 rounds they are then switched across to the current slope handicapping system.



This system is used for determining fair allowances for social golf events that attract novices or occasional golfers. A player's Callaway handicap is determined after each round by deducting from his/her 18 hole gross score the scores of the worst individual holes during the first 16 holes of the round.

In the computation of handicaps under this system:

- -No hole may be scored at more than twice its par,
- half strokes count as a whole,
- the 17th and 18th holes are never deducted,

For example if a player scores 99 on the day their handicap would be calculated as the sum total of their (3 worst holes) +1

If a player scores 82 on the day their handicap would be calculated as the sum total of their ( worst + ½ the 2<sup>nd</sup> worst hole) -1

If a player scores 120 on the day their handicap would be calculated as the sum total of their (five worst holes) +2

After 3 rounds they will be allocated a temporary handicap using the old AGU handicapping formula and then after 5 rounds they are elevated onto the official Slope handicapping system which was use thereafter for all club competitions.

For those people interested in the mechanics of the handicapping system it can be best explained as the following.

How to calculate a GA Handicap

#### To calculate a player's GA Handicap:

- you must firstly identify the player's most recent 20 scores,
- you then determine the 'Played To' value for each of these scores,
- you average the best 8 'Played To' values,
- and finally you multiply this average by 0.93. The resultant figure (to one decimal place) is the player's GA Handicap.
- \* If a player's handicap record contains a lesser number than 20 scores, the number of scores used to calculate the player's handicap is as listed in the table below.
- \* There is no requirement for a player's most recent 20 scores to have been returned within a specific timeframe. For example, the most recent 20 scores may span a period of three years or they may span a period of three months.
- \* Once a player's handicap record contains 20 scores, the next score they return will result in the oldest of the existing 20 scores being removed (to be replaced by the new score).

Full Technical Procedure for Calculating a GA Handicap

STEP 1 – Use the table below to determine the number of scores to be included in the GA Handicap calculation:

# Number of Scores in Player's Handicap Scores to be Used in the Calculation Record

5 to 6	Best/Lowest 1
7 or 8	Best/Lowest 2
9 or 10	Best/Lowest 3
11 or 12	Best/Lowest 4
13 or 14	Best/Lowest 5
15 or 16	Best/Lowest 6
17 or 18	Best/Lowest 7
19 or 20	Best/Lowest 8

Note: When the handicap record contains more than 20 scores, the GA Handicap calculation uses the best 8 of the player's most recent 20 scores.

Take will Fernie for Instance. He has played 7 rounds with the club and his Best round was 13 over par or better described as a score differential of 13. When this value is multiplied by 0.93 his official handicap is 12.09 which is rounded to 12.0. If he had actually played 11 rounds and the scores listed above were his best 6 scores then his handicap would be 16.75
