

Despite some pretty testy conditions, some very good scores were posted. First position was decided on a countback system because Warren Stewart and Jeremy Cliff both scored Nett 70, however Warren was the ultimate winner since he scored better on the back 9. In the event of 2x or more players finishing with the same Nett score then the place rankings are determined based on the number of stableford points scored on the back nine. If the players also have the same Stableford score then the count back continues using the number of points achieved on individual holes starting from the 18th hole, then the 17th hole, 16th etc until a winner is found.

This month the scores were tightly packed and count backs were required to differentiate between 1st and 2nd (Nett 70), 3rd & 4th (Nett 72) 6th and 8th (Nett 74) and even the places between 9th and 11th spot (Nett 75) each came down to a countback.

Congratulations to Warren because he has played some brilliant rounds of golf and has been the bridesmaid so many times that he deserved a victory in 2009. Incredibly despite only playing 4x rounds for the season warren is one of the few players who are left remaining that could possibly wrangle in Greg Parsons commanding lead on the seasons championship, but given that he is not coming on the end of year trip mathematically it is going to be a tough ask.

With Chris out injured for the next couple of months suffering a broken leg and Warren missing due to work commitments perhaps only Jeremy with yet another strong 2nd place finish could take the title of seasons championship from GP who has already started drafting his victory speech and telling his school students about his momentous victory.

Tony MacIssac despite a major choke on the 17th hole still managed to finish in 3rd place, just nudging out Saturdays competition winner Brendan, who qualified for his official club handicap of 18 since this was his 3rd round with the club. With scores of 73 and 74 Burnsie and Lukey D who are usually strangers to the top 10 finished in 5th and 6th place respectively.
