

## Amstel Results October

In the news for the last month everyone has been talking about the biggest and fastest plunge in history. Nobody thought it was possible and none of the experts even saw it coming. But it happened and now that it is here there is nothing we can do about it other than deal with our losses.



That's right for the past few months massive losses have been experienced by us all and the blame all falls back to the same spot no matter which way you look at it. In case you were thinking about the stock market, you are wrong, we're not we are talking about wall street taking a dive, the biggest plunge in history has been the one that of Alistair's handicap. He has cut 7 shots off his handicap in 5 rounds, which is an incredible feat and his golf is getting progressively better.

On a very tough layout around Amstel Alistair managed to blast his way around the course with an 84 off the stick including 3 Birdies and 4 pars. With Alistair now holding an unassailable lead for the points championship it is little wonder that Burnsie is too embarrassed to show himself in the car park anymore. The tap in birdie missed and ran beyond the hole, he then proceeded to shank the Par attempt and only just scraped with a lucky lip in for a 4x Putt bogie 6. He closed the last 3x holes with triple bogies, throwing away the 9x shots he needed to challenge Chris for the victory.

On what was otherwise a miserable day, Stu choking was one of the few things that could bring Steve Powne to a smile, that and Warren Stewarts attempt to capture his prize balls. Having played high-grade cricket for nearly 40 years as a wicket keeper you would think it would be safe to assume that Warren would be able to catch. Not so, without the gloves on his hands it appears that Warren couldn't catch a cold while skinny-dipping in an Arctic snowstorm. Warren failed to catch the prize balls thrown to him, in fact one bounced off his forehead, his second attempt knocked the ball down the roadway bounced off the bonnet of his new Lexus and then rolled into the gutter never to be seen again. Lucky he's a better golfer than he is a cricketer or he'd need to wear a helmet on the putting green.

Despite his fumble fingers Warren did finish at the top end of the leader board again. Congratulations to Dale finishing in 5<sup>th</sup> spot despite having his 14 on the 2<sup>nd</sup> hole. It takes a patient man to keep playing sensibly after a blow out like that.

Congratulations also to Jamie who won the longest drive hole. Unlike Warren he managed to graciously catch his prize ball, although he did hide it away in his bag really quickly. That might be something to do with the fact that 11x of the 22 players drove further than his but Jamie's was the only one that stayed on the fairway so perhaps he was a bit embarrassed to claim the prize of longest drive given the circumstances of the win.

This month our feature player is one of our major sponsors, Dale Robinson. Dale first joined the club in Sep 2004. Since joining the club he has accumulated 2718 shots and he averages around 104 strokes per round, although he has a personal best score of 89, which he racked up at Dorset earlier this year. Dale averages finishing in 8<sup>th</sup> position and has scored 50x pars and a birdie while playing with the club. Dale has won 5x nearest to pins and although he is yet to snag a monthly title he has had quite a few 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> place finishes.

Daniel DeMarinis, has always featured at the top of the leader board he averages a 6<sup>th</sup> place finish and his average score is a very respectable 92.31 shots per round. Since joining the club in September 2004 he has accumulated more victories than any other player. Daniel has won 6 monthly titles including back-to-back victories at Amstel in 2005 and 2006. His worst performance was back in December 2004 at Cobram when he shot a 102 which wasn't a bad performance considering the monster hangover that he was carrying after cleaning up at cards the night before during the golf trip. From 26 rounds, Daniel has accrued 105 pars and 11 birdies with the majority of each coming from the Par 4 holes. Daniels best performance was a sensational 83 at Werribee Park in February 2006, which also netted him his 5<sup>th</sup> monthly title.
