As you are all aware a round of golf with the social club always culminates with a few beers in the car park, however this month I may have unknowingly overstepped the boundary, and my golf day was met with strong disapproval when I arrived home a little bit too late and a lot too messy. As it happened, when I arrived home from Amstel the family were not there, since they were all still at the Birthday Party I was supposed to

Don't forget that it is very important to count all of your shots, rounding down your score is not an acceptable practice. One or two strokes doesn't sound like much, over 18 holes, but it can often be the difference between 2<sup>nd</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> position on the points tally. Penalty strokes, air-swings or missed gimmee putts all need to be counted or else you might find your name being engraved on the leather-wedge trophy at the end of the year. **(BY THE WAY HAVE YOU PUT YOUR VOTES IN YET?)**

#### Handicaps

Once again the Amstel track has got the better of us. With 20x players blessed with perfect playing conditions you would expect a few guys to play to Par or better, but it wasn't the case. Incredibly not one player came close to playing to their handicap and therefore everyone going on the golf trip will get an extra 0.1 shots and for the others guys who don't play again until 2011 the 0.1 adjustment becomes inconsequential since we will be starting to use the new PGA Slope handicapping system from the start of 2011.

There are a few significant changes to a few players' handicaps, especially those guys who haven't played many games yet. The system is structured for golfers who have played 20 rounds or more although the program had been designed by the PGA to be functional once a player has submitted 5x scores.

In summary the slope handicap is calculated by taking the most recent 20x rounds of golf and averaging the best 10 scores x0.96 to create the handicap. For example.
