



SUNDAY LEAVE PASS 2006

Albert Park Results

While there were no signs of the Formula One race cars, there was still plenty of action this weekend at Albert Park Lake. Although the roar of the engines had dissipated the golf course was still buzzing with the roar of laughter as our motley group hit off from the first tee. Gerard nearly put his first drive through the windscreen of a Toorak tractor on Lakeside Drive and Darren Higgs inspired by his new handicap managed to shank his drive 90 degrees away from the direction of the green and Rick McEvoy got caught in the draft behind him and followed in the same direction. This months golf was not unlike the grand prix race, there was a lot of carnage left out on the course, only a select few that had very good finishes, while the majority were happy enough to make it to the end and get it over and done with.

This month we had the closest results that we've seen for a while, unlike recent months where one player has had a stand out winning score, this month the leader board and monthly prize was determined by a count back. Two players came in with a Nett 67 (5 under par) and another came in with a Nett 68. Greg Parsons played an absolute blinder he shot 92 off the stick playing off a 25 handicap. He was unlucky not to pick up the 10 points which were awarded to Roger Powne who shot the lowest score for the day with 82. Since both players finished on the same score, a count back is done on the back nine holes. Consequently the final results came down to the fact that the 10 that Greg had on the 11th hole while he was starting to writing his acceptance speech after a great front nine cost him the match. The count back takes into consideration the number of stableford points scored on the back nine, Roger had 22 points and Greg had 20 points. It's important to note that Roger played his 3rd round for the club this month and finally got his official club handicap, Roger has taken the billing as the lowest handicap player, admittedly he deserves the title too, he had 10 pars and 6 bogies so he is definitely the

most consistent player we have at the moment and I am certain that it won't be staying at 13 for very long either.

Only one stroke behind Roger & Greg was Adam Cooper who played his best round with the club, he hit a 95 playing off his 27 handicap, that won him 8 points and elevated him into 6th position on the championship points tally. Adam is only a new comer to the club but since joining us, both he and Rick have featured in the top 10 every month that they have played. Lets hope a few handicap adjustments will make their lives a little more difficult.

Following in his fathers footsteps was Steve Powne who played a good round also, he ran 4th with a Nett par round. Our old mate "Mr. consistent, Gerard had according to him a shit house round, but 88 off the stick including the longest drive was still a good score and landed him in 5th place. It was great to see Garry Couper make his debut for 2006, his absence has been a major topic of conversation over the last few months, his comeback is definitely noteworthy as his 6th place finish was better than most of the games he played last year. Maybe the extended break has done him good. Hopefully Coups will be seen again soon We are still waiting for Luke Dumbrell to show his face aswell, so if you see him in your travels then give him a prod and see if you can get him down to Ivanhoe next month.

We had 16 players play this month. So there's plenty more room for the guys who didn't play this month.

Remember that the more times that you play during the year, the greater the chance of winning a prize. For every month you play you are given a ticket for the end of year raffle draw. Being a raffle it gives everyone a fair chance of winning a prize and the regular players are rewarded because they have more tickets, so please make the effort to become a regular. Bonus tickets can be picked up along the way through the skins competition. Skins are calculated using the handicap system so anyone who has a good hole (better than what they usually have, i.e. **Birdie for a low handicapper or Bogie for a high handicapper**) could pick up a skin or two.

Skins were distributed to those players good enough to win a hole outright. If more than 1 player got the lowest score on a hole it is Jackpotted until an outright winner occurs.

Handicaps

The handicapping system is adjusted monthly, dependent on the players recent results. A poor round where a player scores worse than a Nett Par and their handicap goes out 0.1 shots on the other hand a good round and the handicap is reduced according to how much less than par they scored.

Congratulations to Roger Powne who played his 3rd round to get an official handicap. Questions are being asked as to whether he laid down on the first two to get a higher handicap. However the handicapper will get into him soon enough.

This month we started to use duplicate score cards. We were finding it very difficult to read all of the cards that were being handed in, so by asking each player to score for a playing partner plus add their own score in the marker column we are better able to decipher the handwriting and cross reference any inconsistencies.

Example on how to mark the card.

Roger would score Steve's card plus put his own scores in the marker column and visa versa.

This also gives you chance to check the adding up has been done correctly. You can tally up the scores at the end of the 9th hole and 18th holes and if you both don't get the same score it is easy to compare the scores on each hole and work out where the mistake has been made. This is the first time that we have done it and it was very successful, for the first time ever every players card added up correctly and there was no doubt that the scores were all correct..

Here's a little bit of trivia for you. If we take all of the scores for each player from last years results and calculate their best score (ECLECTIC SCORE) based on the best 4x scores they had on Par 3's and Par 5's and their best 10x scores on Par 4's for the entire year. The results were interesting:

Rob Edwards obviously our best golfer had an Eclectic score of 63 including an Eagle, 7x Birdies and 10x pars.

Luke Dumbrell was the biggest improver over the year his score dropped by 43 shots, he started with a first round of 121 but by the end of the year his eclectic score was only 78. Damijan was close behind improving by 42 shots over the duration of the year.

The average score per player in 2005 was 83 how did you fare.
