



## SUNDAY LEAVE PASS 2006

PLEASE NOTE: There is still a bit of confusion on how to score penalties for, Out of Bounds, Water Hazards and lost balls so we have included the explanation of the rules at the end of this email. Please take the time to read it so we have consistency with everybody scoring the same penalty strokes.

# **Beacon Hills Results**

Our first bash up at Beacon Hills was enjoyable even if the scores were not the greatest. The course had great views it was challenging with tight fairways and there was plenty of water to make things interesting, even when the holes were only short.

Of the 14 people who made the trek up to Berwick, not one player played to their handicap.

Even still there were a few good performances, Darren Higgs still drunk from celebrating Indoor Cricket Grand Final victory and his Best and Fairest trophy on Saturday had flashes of brilliance, he hit 2x Birdies, 2x Pars, 6x Bogies and the rest were shockers.

Adam Cooper proved a master of the short holes, he had Pars on 3x of the 5 par 3's on the course and bogied the other two. Using Tiger Woods' strategy Adam left the driver in the bag all day, hitting irons off the tee helped him finish with a respectable round of 94 Nett 70 and walk away with the trophy on the day. He was also the only person to land on a NTP hole.

There seems to be a bit of a changing of the guard on the leader board, it's a bit unusual not to have Gerard up at the top but he isn't and what's more he is also rapidly falling further and further behind. Rick McEvoy has taken up first position with 52 championship points and is 3 points clear of his nearest rival. He followed up his win at Warburton with a 2<sup>nd</sup> place finish at Beacon Hills.

Third place this month was Fitzy, he shot 94 off the stick, newcomer Graeme Heft hit the lowest score for the day, playing off a 10 handicap his round of 87 strokes was only good enough for 4<sup>th</sup> spot. Gerard rounded out the top 5 with a Nett 77.

Brunto, with his custom fitted golf clubs and using his professionally tuned new golf swing (YES boys he's getting serious he is having regular golf lessons) failed to live up to expectations. Other than taking out the longest drive and a few skins with a Par on the last hole the small he invested into lessons only saw him improve 4x shots and 1 position in the field.

This month there were many players who finished with the same nett score. In the event that more than one player has the same score, the points distribution and place rankings are calculated using a formula that takes into consideration the players score on the back nine holes, this compares the total Stableford points scored on the back nine and then works backwards from the 18<sup>th</sup> hole until an outright winner is found.

- e.g. 1. Graeme and Gerard both had a score of 77 but Graeme scored 13 stableford points on the back nine, compared to Gerard who had 12 points, therefore Graeme finished with a higher ranking.
- e.g. 2. Daniel and Darren both had Nett 78 and 12 points on the back nine, both scored 2 points on the 18<sup>th</sup> hole but Daniel scored 2 points on the 17<sup>th</sup> hole whereas Darren didn't score any so in this case Daniel finished with the higher position.

Coops, Jamie and Sunday Leave Pass:

PS: There is still a bit of confusion on how to score penalties and lost balls so we have included the explanation of the rules at the end of this email. Please take the time to read it so we have consistency with everybody scoring the same penalty strokes.

1. If a ball is hit out of bounds and there is no doubt that it has definitely finished OOB. (Then the player should hit another ball from where the last one was struck and the player incurs a 1 stroke penalty) This means the player counts the stroke that went out of bounds, plus a 1x shot penalty plus the stroke to put the next ball into play from the same spot the first one was hit. E.g.) 3x off the tee or hitting your 4th shot from the fairway.

- 2. If a ball is hit close to the area marked as "Out Of Bounds" or hit into thick rough and there is doubt whether the ball is "Out Of Bounds" or you are unsure if you will be able to find the ball, then a player should have another shot from the same location where the last ball was hit, calling it a "provisional ball." This ball does not come into play, unless the first ball is later deemed to be lost or OOB. (The provisional ball can be played as many times as necessary up to the point where the ball original ball is thought to have finished up.) The player may then search for the first ball for up to 5 mines. Before deciding whether it has been lost. If the original ball is found and is deemed to still be in play, the player must use that ball regardless of where it lies on the course. Once the original ball is found the provisional ball may no longer be used. If the ball is OOB or lost and the provisional ball is used, all strokes played with the original ball are counted, plus the player incurs a 1xshot penalty for the lost ball plus all subsequent strokes with second ball are then counted as per normal.
- 3. If the ball is hit into a hazard such as a lake, creek or any other hazard area (usually identified by red stakes). The ball may be dropped with in 2x club lengths of the hazard along the line of entry and the player incurs a 1x stroke penalty. E.g.) 1x shot which was hit into the hazard, 1x shot penalty and the next shot is being played from behind or beside the hazard.
- 4. If the ball is hit into the rough or another part of the course that is not considered a hazard or OOB and the ball is unable to be found, and the player did not hit a "provisional ball". The player must either:
  - A) Go back to where the ball was last played from and take a 1x shot penalty, or
    - B) They must drop a new ball where the ball was thought to be located and take a 2x shot penalty.
  - E.g.) If the player lost their ball after their drive then they have the choice of either running back to the tee too play their 3<sup>rd</sup> shot or they can choose to drop the ball approximately where the ball has been lost and will be hitting their 4<sup>th</sup> shot from there.

I hope this clears up any scoring issues and provides consistency amongst all of the players.
