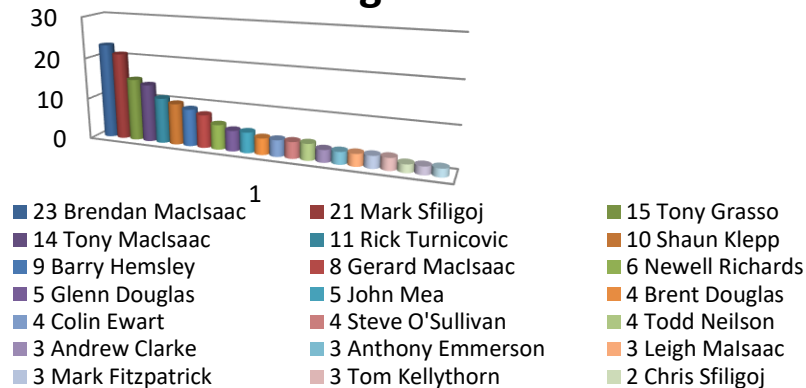

2020 Players Choice Awards

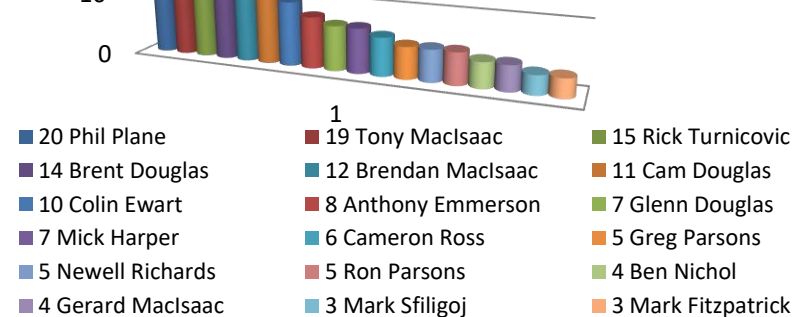

Listed below is the graphic distribution of voting allocations so you can see how you went compared to the winners.

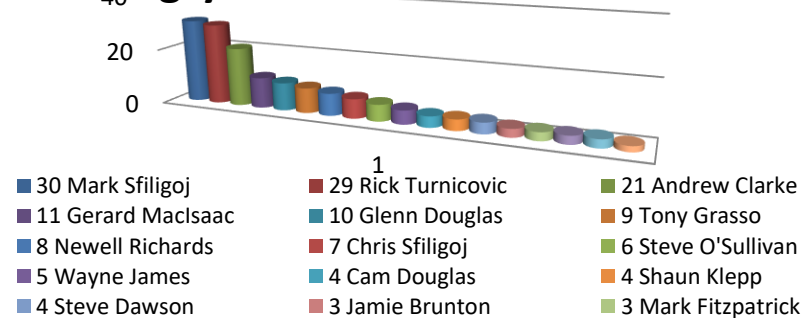
Leather Wedge Award Nominations



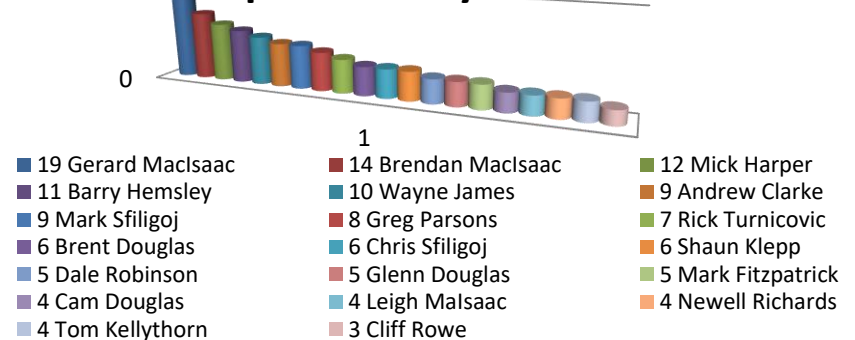
Most Improved Player Nominations

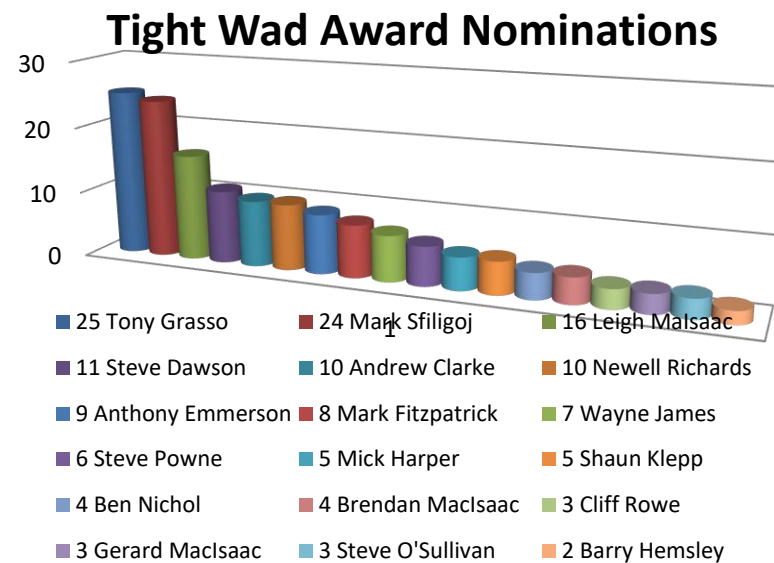
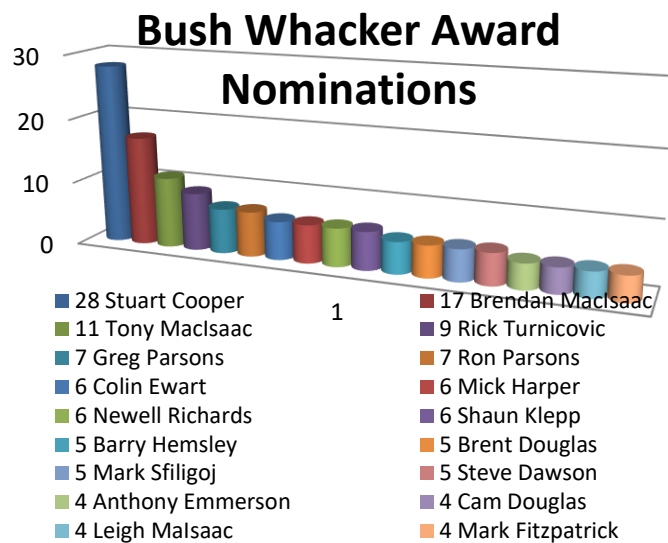


Angry Man Award Nominations

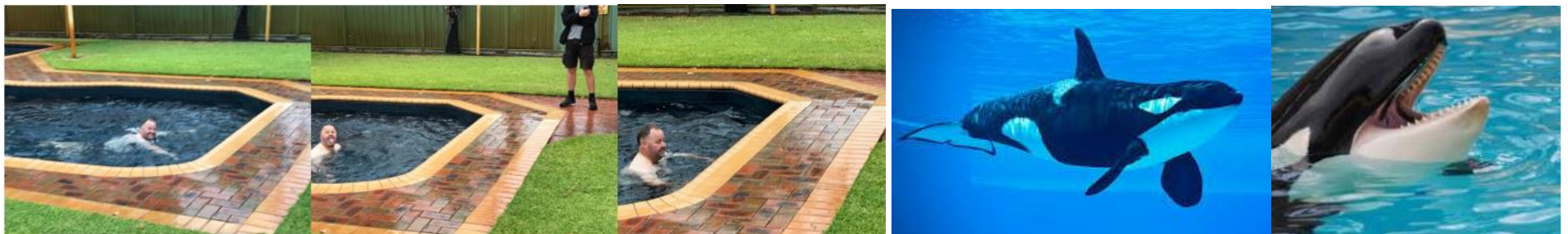

The 9th hole was the demise of several rounds, most importantly it was one of the mystery random holes used in the Champion of Champions competition and also in the battle of the beer wenches. This was devastating outcome for Greg and Ron Parsons who both racked up big numbers on the hole. Ron bounced from bunker to bunker and then back again as his quest for the blue jacket disappeared before his teary eyes. By the time he finally finished the 9th hole Ron had racked up a Newell and a half (score of 15) and had dropped out of contention for the Champion of Champions title. Although Greg did not have a 15 written on the scorecard he was no better off, he too had his second Newell for the day on the ninth hole and that all but eliminated his chance at winning the Free Drinks prize in 2021.



The ninth hole also got the better of Rob Underwood (Newell) and even Andrew Clarke went from the greenside bunker for 2 shots to in the hole for 9. At 285 meters and a drivable par 4 this hole certainly bared its teeth and made our golfers work for their scores. On Friday during their practice rounds both Mick Harper and Stu Coops drove the green and made 2 putt Birdies but then when the scoring counted, they were a long way off the mark. The ninth hole played on average nearly 2.5 strokes above par, proving it was a challenging hole despite its length.

With a score of 70 strokes on the front nine Greg Parsons was a shattered mess, he was resigned to the reality of being the 2020 beer wench. His day was miserable and his demeanor was dour, that was until he ran into Rick and discovered that Rick had shot a 69 on the front nine. It was also obvious by the screams resonating around the fairways that Rick was carrying his poor form after the turn as well. 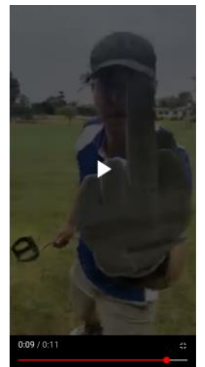

According to Jamie Brunton, it should come with an asterisk because of the COVID-19 shutdown and the fact that we only played half the season, however Steve O'Sullivan has still claimed his first ever annual points championship title. There were only two candidates left in contention by the time we took to the fairways at Barham on Saturday morning although given that the one person challenging him was Mick Harper it was inevitable that SOS would win the trophy and in doing so hand the big poof yet another seat in the Bridesmaids shower.

Congratulations to Steve O' Sullivan who after ten years of chasing the coveted title, he has finally won the points championship by a very convincing 10-point margin. SOS finished in 16th place on Saturday for a return of only 1 point therefore he had opened up the door for Mick to have a chance to win back to back titles, however Mick failed to finish in the top 3 rankings which was what was required in order for him to accrue enough points to jump to the top of the leaderboard.

And didn't SOS enjoy his win, he did a tour of all the tables to make sure he was congratulated by all 30 members of the group and to remind them that he was the Annual Points champion without even winning a monthly title. In truth SOS has been a regular feature at the top of the points leaderboard ladder despite not winning a monthly title since 2017.

It is fair to say SOS was a very happy man, he had a smile from ear to ear, and he jumped into every photo whenever a camera was getting ready to take a shot. Steve celebrated with conviction and by the time we finally got into the Barham RSL Club at 830pm to sat down for dinner he was speaking in the same language as Stevie Powne does on the golf trips. They were both able to have a complete conversation in fluent slurrish which no one else in the group could possibly understand a word of.





Unlike SOS, Newell was much more reserved in his celebrations, Newell completed the perfect Steven Bradbury finish and coasted into the Champion of Champions title by steering safely past the finish line while all of the other competitors in contention crashed and burned around the golf course.

In winning the December round he therefore qualified to compete for the champion of champions title, and given that three of his 5 competitors shot a Newell (score of 10 or more) on at least one of the mystery holes, he was a clear favorite to win despite his score being calculated over only 8 holes compared to the other players who used 9 holes.

Newell was a last minute qualifier to join the other five players competing for the Champion of Champions title, having won his qualifying entry at the golf trip and even the one hole handicap it could not prevent him from getting his hands on the best prize Sunday Leave Pass has to offer.

The **Champion of Champions** competition was played off between all of the players who won a monthly competition during the year; the champion of champions is the player who has the best score from all of the monthly winners who attended the golf trip. This competition was played off over 9 mystery holes on the Saturday competition with the player who scored the most stableford points taking out the title and adorned the coveted winner's jacket. Obviously, as the winner of the December title Newell had automatically had a good score and therefore, he was handicapped accordingly. History says very few Sunday winners have been able to claim the title due to the handicapping process. Whichever way you look at it, on this occasion Newell managed to play a few good holes in the correct place and at the end of the day his 18 Stableford points from only 8 holes was good enough to win him the title. Newell can credit his win to the par he made on the 18th hole and probably the fact that Egg (Anthony Emmerson) score a Newell on the 2nd hole also helped as the blow out on the 2nd hole cost him the 3 extra stableford points Egg needed to boost his score to get to the front of the field.

If he manages himself correctly, he should be looking at up to 50 free beers or soft drinks over the next 12 months. Now that is a prize worth aspiring for. The other condition is that Newell must be the person who consumes the drink meaning he cannot use his power to buy beverages for anyone else and the drink must be opened and consumed at the time of purchase. The Social club runs as a neutral organization and all of the money we raise each year is spent on prizes and we start each year with basically a zero \$\$\$\$ bank balance. As was to be expected the fine jar kitty was drunk almost drunken dry in the early hours of Sunday morning although there was a couple of hundred dollars which will be filed away to be used for BBQ's and stock purchases at the start of the new season. All of the proceeds of the social club activities which includes green fees, and beverage & merchandise sales were invested in the form of prizes for the end of year trip and the raffle draw. In total we had more than \$3500 worth of prizes to give away. The spoils were spread over many of our members.

The raffle is conducted by issuing every player a ticket for each round of golf that they play over the course of the year. If a player wears the Sunday Leave Pass Club shirt to the round, they are given a second raffle ticket. We also run an 18x hole skins competition where every hole is worth one raffle ticket and a player wins raffle tickets for scoring a better stableford score than the rest of the field. In the skins competition whenever 2 or more players have the best score on a hole the raffle tickets carry over and jackpot until a unique hole-winner is achieved. Some players had some significant Jackpots through the year where they won 6 or more skins at the one time. This dramatically increases the number of raffle tickets a player has but at the end of the day the raffle all comes down to chance.

As a matter of fairness, a player is only entitled to take home one prize no matter how many times their name is drawn in the raffle. A player is entitled to upgrade to a better prize if their name comes out again and the lesser prize is redrawn. In order to qualify for the Major Prizes a player must have played at least 6 rounds with the club or be in attendance at the Golf Trip to claim the prize.
