
2021 Players Choice Awards


Listed below is the graphic distribution of voting allocations so you can see how you went compared to the winners.





Stu's record is now zero wins from eight attempts at winning the elusive Champion of Champions Jacket and even worse he is zero from 18 opportunities to win the Beer & Berrocca shield.

It was a crazy season in 2021. With Covid lockdowns cancelling rounds at the last minute, booking limits for tee times, vaccination status rules, preferred pronouns, the ever-changing rules of group activity, it has been tough and frustrating year, so it was great to be able to get out of Melbourne and Victoria for a few extra days and let the hair hang down.

For some of us the golf trip actually started at 545am on Wednesday morning when the Newell mobile pulled out of Faulkner Street to start the 3 day, 735km journey to Barham, via 6 other golf courses. It was dubbed the extended golf tip and it took us to some great places.



Douggo joined us for a quick 18 holes at his home track in Mansfield, then we racked up a few more km in the afternoon, before taking on the highly regarded Black Bull golf course in beautiful Yarrawonga. What a golf course, this will have to be a golf trip destination in the not to distant future, although be warned you will need to start saving your pennies and you should also ask everyone you know, to give you golf balls for all of your Birthdays and Christmas' until we book in at Black Bull just so you have enough in supply to navigate the 18 holes with water hazards on every single one of them.

Thursday's adventures took in Rich River Golf course and then a late after noon practice round at Barham. Even still it took 2minutes 59seconds before the pressure ball could be found, and it went on to last three more holes before Thomas produced a replica of his dad's famous cover drive and put the ball out of bounds and in to the next suburb.



On any golf course there are hazards and then there are are HAZARDS!!!!. The fifth hole at Barham fits into the category of the latter description. Any one who landed in the huge crater in the middle of the fairway blocking the green, found it tough going. We didn't hear of anyone successfully getting their ball out on the first attempt. On the otherhand the Newell's list was very strong. 7x Newell's in total, including one from the namesake himself. Colin Ewart had the most Newells, (two) amassing 22 strokes from his Newell tally. Cam Ross found himself 11 strokes worse off than when he started after he overcooked a putt for bogey on the Par 3 third hole. Cam was on the green for three, off the green for four when his putt rolled into the bunker and things went downhill from there. Evidently the 2nd hole was the most difficult hole in the golf course. It accounted for more than


50% of the Newells for the day and the hole averaged nearly 2.5 strokes over par which means it played half a stroke harder than the next most difficult hole.

Newell Richards made the Par 4, 11th hole look difficult. Other than his blowout on the 2nd hole, Newell had Brent Douglas starting to feel a wee bit nervous, Newell had a lot of good holes on the front 9 whereas Brent was finding the Barham Course a challenge. After gaining a 2 shots advantage on the 10th hole Newell had the upper hand on the head to head match play.

But, Here is how Brent Douglas described the turning point of the afternoon.

“Newell’s drive on the 11th on the Saturday really helped my nerves go down a notch, I was starting to choke there for a bit 😅 but Newell took his foot off my throat when he stuffed up his tee shot.”

Newell had the honor after making a par (3) on the 10th hole. When he teed off, the ball shot out sideways and crashed into the safety fence at the end of the tee box, before ricocheting backward towards the tee markers. Newell's ball not only failed to go past the ladies tees, it almost didn't go past the mens tees. With a bit more force and the ball may have almost come so far back that it would have hit the golf carts.



Phil Plane did actually manage to hit his golf ball through a cart and he did so while Andrew Clarke was sitting in it. Phil hit his ball a bit wayward and it went between the golf clubs, over the storage cage, and passed directly over Andrew Clarke's shoulder. The ball exited at terminal velocity via the gap where the perspex windscreen was folded over to let the breeze in. According to Clarke it is the closest he has ever been to getting hit by a golf ball and if the windscreen had of been up the ball would have smashed it or bounced back into Clarke's head.



The only thing coming through the front and rear windows of the Newell vehicle was dust, it seems out on the country roads if you miss your turn off and when you are relying on google maps to get you back onto the correct route, there is a high probability you will end up driving on corrugated dirt roads. I would not want to criticize our pilots driving ability and navigational skills however our trip to Barham saw us driving on no less than 6x different gravel roads for periods ranging from 5 minutes to 45 minutes of tail sliding adrenaline fueled rally driving.

When it came driving on the longest drive hole, Peter Alphabet was very unlikely to get lost. His ball never travelled far enough to get off the beaten track. It is probably inappropriate to even use the word beaten when it came to his impact on the ball because he barely grazed it. Mick Harper won the longest drive hole with a 276 meter drive down the middle of the fairway, it was not as long as some drives he has hit in the past however when you put it in context and consider that he out drove Peter Alphabet by a mind boggling 268 meters it still sounds like a monstrous shot.



To make matters worse Peter was still 268 meters behind Micks drive after his 2nd swing because the ball did not appear to move.

Cam Ross may have been voted the least improved player in 2021 however he showed some promising signs on Sunday, interestingly he only just hit his golf ball past the Peter Alphabets longest drive mark on Sunday, however on this occasion the ball had to travel 287 meters down the fairway to do so.

The golf trip was fun for all. It is always a good way to catch up with a group of mates, drink beer and have a little bit of exercise in between the laughs and camaraderie.

The Barham course was a majestic setting to play, the course was awesome, pure fairways, long sweeping golf holes, hundreds of strategically placed bunkers and let us not mention the water hazards, most of which were hidden out of site until it was all too late and you had hit your ball into them. There was no questioning the fact that the golf course was hard and the scores reflected it, although I think even those of us who landed at the back end of the field would still say it was a great golf course, just a little bit long and hard. The layout was always interesting especially when it came to the long Par 3 holes, especially the 15th hole which at 190 meters up hill and into the wind meant most of us could not even get there with the driver off the tee.



The wind played havoc in Saturday morning, with strong cross winds blowing across the fairways it was tough to keep the golf ball in play. Consequently, it was a real challenge to keep the pressure ball in play. Two teams managed to play all 18 holes whereas the others fell short at either the 4th hole or the 7th hole.

Steve Powne had little trouble hitting his ball around in the wind. Steve demolished the rest of the field. For the second time in 2021 the Blue Smurf had a runaway victory (6 strokes) and he claimed the champions of champions title and the FEDEX points cup trophy. There were only three candidates left in contention by the time we took to the fairways at Barham on Saturday morning, Brent Douglas held his nerve and was able to do just enough to keep ahead of Newell and the fast-finishing Mick Harper who danced his way into his favorite position, Bridesmaid (2nd Place). Mick has been in the top billing playoffs 9 times and from those attempts he has won once and been bridesmaid 8x times.

Obviously, as the winner of the December title Steve Powne had already booked himself a ticket to the big dance after winning the April round at Dorset so the golf trip victory was just icing on the cake and a way of keeping a potential competitor at bay.

One could be forgiven for thinking Steve must have had inside knowledge about which holes were going to be included in the Champion of champions playoffs. He accrued an incredible 25 stableford points on the 9 mystery holes. Incredibly, Steve parred 5 of them.





The Social club runs as a neutral organization and all of the money we raise each year is spent on prizes and we start each year with basically a zero \$\$\$\$ bank balance. As was to be expected the fine jar kitty was drunk almost drunken dry in the early hours of Sunday morning although there was a couple of hundred dollars which will be filed away to be used for BBQ's and stock purchases at the start of the new season. All of the proceeds of the social club activities which includes green fees, and beverage & merchandise sales were invested in the form of prizes for the end of year trip and the raffle draw. In total we had more than \$4000 worth of prizes to give away. The spoils were spread over many of our members.

The raffle is conducted by issuing every player a ticket for each round of golf that they play over the course of the year. If a player wears the Sunday Leave Pass Club shirt to the round, they are given a second raffle ticket. We also run an 18x hole skins competition where every hole is worth one raffle ticket and a player wins raffle tickets for scoring a better stableford score than the rest of the field. In the skins competition whenever 2 or more players have the best score on a hole the raffle tickets carry over and jackpot until a unique hole-winner is achieved. Some players had some significant Jackpots through the year where they won 6 or more skins at the one time. This dramatically increases the number of raffle tickets a player has but at the end of the day the raffle all comes down to chance. As a matter of fairness, a player is only entitled to take home one prize no matter how many times their name is drawn in the raffle. A player is entitled to upgrade to a better prize if their name comes out again and the lesser prize is redrawn. In order to qualify for the Major Prizes a player must have played at least 6 rounds with the club or be in attendance at the Golf Trip to claim the prize. Congratulations to all of the winners.


