## BAY VIEWS GOLF COURSE



The curse of the monthly title seems to continue to enforce its mighty powers on the reigning champions. Once again it was a case of "from the penthouse to the Sh! $7 \# 0$ use." This time it was Tony Grasso whose good form appeared to be stripped off of his golf clubs. After a convincing win at Spring Park, Tony tumbled down the competition rankings and finished only 3x players in front of the Beer Wench position. Tony drove extremely well however his short game went missing and with it also went his confidence with the putter. Tony had a run of 5 three putts in a row on the front nine which contributed to a total of 7 three putts for the day including a total of 42 putts in 18 holes.

Fast sloping greens and a strong wind made putting the most difficult challenge at the Bayviews golf course, and this was reflected in the scores. As a collective group we had a club record highest putts per player average. 38.2 putts per player which makes good scoring a pretty tough ask and hence the three-putt monkey vest was doing the rounds as it passed from player to player on almost every hole.

El Presidente used the flat stick uncharacteristically badly. SOS had 5 three putt greens and equaled his career worst putting performance with 40 putts. Brenton Douglas was travelling Ok on the greens for a while however he ended his round by posting 7 three putts in the last 11 holes. The worst putter for the day was Highway. Newell just could not come to terms with the way the ball always breaks towards the water. Newell refused to be told and the end result was a disastrous 44 putts for the round including seven 3putts and a 4putt green. Brendan MacIsaac managed to use the putter five times on the fifth green as he racked up his only Newell for the day. (It was actually a Newell Plus 2 (score of 12).

While most struggled with the putter, there were an elite few who managed to hole a few putts and therefore keep the averages lower. The best of the best was Shane Cumming (Cider). Shane got around the 18 holes with just 27 putts and even more impressive was the fact that he only had the one blemish, a 3 putt for bogey on the $11^{\text {th }}$ hole. Mick Harper built his brilliant score around excellent putting. Mick had a 3putt free round and he even chipped in for par from off the side of the green with a noner on the second hole. Mick had 28 putts and 48 strokes during his brilliant round of 76 off the stick. Stu and Mal also chipped in for gobblers from off the cut surface however neither of them were able to report a noteworthy scorecard.

For many golfers the day did not start off very well. Ronnie opened his account with a Newell (Score of 10 or more) on his very first hole. Col Ewart, Tony Mac \& Stu Coops all ended their chances of a good score when they all posted a 9 on the easy par 5 first hole. Glenn Douglas knew he was in trouble pretty much straight away especially after he set himself up for a severe roasting by teeing his ball up from the lady's markers instead of the men's tees.



It is one thing to tee off from the wrong tees but when you are also standing on the wrong side of the club, you are really asking for trouble. Having said that, we did capture a few photos of Stu Coops trying to replicate the grace and poise of Douggo's backwards golf swing. Evidently the set up and take away are pretty good however the follow through still needs a little bit more work.


There are a few other guys in the Sunday Leave Pass group who might also want to have a go at switching hands. It seems the current technique is not quite working for Barry Hemsley who made a full-bodied swing at the golf ball only to take such a huge divot that the ball only moved a foot in front of him. Steve O'Sullivan failed to even get club on ball during one of his swings. SOS was asked to contribute $\$ 2-00$ into the fine jar when he had an air-swing after his club got caught in the bushes during his take away. Stu Coops' swing path was uninhibited when he also had an airy while hitting an approach into the $13^{\text {th }}$ green. He reckons he just lifted his head to take in the beautiful view of the hole however he was charged the \$2-00 admission price for the privilege.



Phil Plane kept his head down while trying to hit his ball over a small log which stood in between him and the desired line of direction to the flag. Witnesses say Phil made excellent contact with the ball, probably the most powerfully struck shot that he had hit all day however it evidently had a very short flight path. When Phil looked up to watch his ball soar towards the green, he could not see it anywhere. It was only when his playing partner told him to look at the bark in the stump was Phil able to realize why he could not see the ball racing down the fairway. It had wedge to itself beneath the bark of the tree stump and he was left with no other alternative other than to take an unplayable lie.

Phil wasn't the only player to get himself entangled with the local flora. After three rebounds off trees on the first hole Tony Grasso was eventually forced to take a penalty drop when he could no longer freely swing at the golf ball.

Stu Coops made a mess of the $13^{\text {th }}$ hole when he tried to punch a 7 iron down the hill towards the green only to see the ball bounce back towards him after ricocheting off a tree trunk. His next shot was even worse because his gentle little 8 iron never fell back to earth. His chip flew directly into the fork of a tree trunk and that is where it decided to stay.


Tony Grasso all but drove the green on the very same hole yet, Tony finished with almost exactly the same score. Tony chipped his ball sideways into the bunker, then skinnied his ball almost out of bounds over the back of the green from out of the sand, then once he chipped back on and three putted he had made a score of seven from the front edge of the green for 1 . That was the start of the end for the carry over monthly title holder. He accrued three guaranteed angry man votes from his playing partners after he let out a barrage of Italian profanities which would have had all of his ancestors turning in their graves. None of his partners spoke a word of Italian however they knew exactly what Tony was talking about. A word of advice for all golfers, "Angry does not lead to improvement" because on the very next hole Tony racked up an 8 on the very simple par 3 because he had 5 attempts to chip his ball up into the green however each time the ball fell short and rolled back further than it had previously been played from. Obviously, Tony did not read the player notes in preparation for his game as he did exactly the opposite to what the golf pro had suggested.

A delightful par three with beautiful bunkering
reminding many of the famous Melbourne sandbelt! Gently rising uphill, golfers only require a short iron to a green with a steep backdrop returning some balls towards the green. Players must ensure they have enough club as anything short of the green will trickle back leaving a tricky chip shot. Pin position will play a big factor in determining your score.

## Reminder

The ball must be clearly on the CUT surface of the green or fairway to win NTP or longest drive. If it is not on the fairway it doesn't count.

Each player won 1 ball each.


Cliff Rowe was very lucky to win the NTP prize especially since his snap hook off the tee on the $6^{\text {th }}$ hole somehow managed to follow the contours of the land. Evidently his ball was struck 70 meters to the left of the flag stick and it somehow managed to miss all of the trees and obstacles and roll from behind the adjoining fairway back into play. Apparently, the ball only just missed falling in for a hole in one before it finished only 7 feet from the cup. Given the journey he had made to get there it is probably fair and reasonable that he didn't make the birdie or win any skins for his terrible shot but good outcome.


With the strong tail wind behind the golfers there was some very big drives on Sunday. Leigh MacIsaac nearly drove the green on the Par $47^{\text {th }}$ hole. Leigh crushed his drive and his ball landed with in meters of the 284-meter hole. Leigh like Mick and Stu also saved and used his best drive for the Par 5 fourth hole only to be disappointed to see that the prenominated longest drive hole was missing the longest drive marker. Evidently the first group out on Sunday, who were responsible for putting the long drive marker out decided that since none of them managed to land on the fairway on the fourth hole that they would move it to a different hole which better suited their games.

Unfortunately, it took until the $8^{\text {th }}$ hole before Wayne, Newell, Barry or Phil actually managed to hit a drive on the fairway so that was declared the longest drive hole for the day. The fact that the hole was playing into a 30 -knot head wind, and the fairway sloped away on a 45 degree angle making it almost impossible for a good drive to hold the fairway did not seem to worry them. Nor were they concerned by the fact that the $8^{\text {th }}$ hole also plays over a mound meaning there is a blind spot from the tee so no one could actually even see that the longest drive marker was in place. Unfortunately for some, there was some very good drives which on any normal hole would have landed in the middle of the fairway and been contenders for the longest drive, but instead the ball followed the contours of the land and eventually rolled into the rough.

The longest drive competition was ultimately won by Big Mick Harper. Given that he couldn't see the marker from the tee box because it was blind-sided over the over the hill Mick didn't even know he was chasing the prize. Even still, Mick waited 5minutes to play his shot while he waited for the wind to die down and when it did ease off, he smashed a monstrous drive. Mick's ball successfully negotiated the right to left slope of the fairway and managed to defy gravity and the pull of the water to the left. When it came to rest stay his ball had defied the odds and managed to stay on the cut surface and therefore, he was a justifiable recipient of the long drive prize, especially since he had hit his ball 300 hundred meters into a howling gale force wind. Micks Ball was only 20 meters short of the green. Once it was realized that the $8^{\text {th }}$ hole had been declared the longest drive hole and his ball had stayed on the cut surface Mick had to send Shanno back 120 meters to retrieve the longest marker so he could put his name on it.

## Longest Drive Winner Mick Harper (Par)

The sloping gradient on the $8^{\text {th }}$ hole is so severe that an errant shot could end up absolutely anywhere. There are stories of a players drive in the middle of Summer during the drought of 1992 when a ball ran from the middle of the $8^{\text {th }}$ fairway across three holes and end up resting against the boundary fence on the fourth hole. Not really a good choice to put the longest drive hole. Having said that, it can still work to a golfer's advantage too! Stu Coops spent 2 minutes and 59 seconds looking for his wayward approach to the green before Glenn Douglas pointed out to him that his ball wasn't lost in the scrub to the 30 meters right of the green and that it was in fact sitting in the middle of the putting surface.

Speaking of hitting the ball on the green. What an exciting moment it was when Barry Hemsley nailed his drive straight down the middle of the Par 5 first hole. Then suddenly the world went into complete suspense, awe and wonder when he backed it up with a solid 3 wood which left him standing over a 130 meter down hill shot into the green.

For those who don't know him, Barry Hemsley has a career average GIR of 0.00 percent on par 5 holes. Meaning, to date he has never actually hit his ball onto a par 5 green in 3 strokes.

With his 7 iron in hand, and the slope of the land and gravity all working in his favor this was the most perfect opportunity to make history.

Below is a hilarious compilation video which will give you some memories to reflect on, when you feel like you are having a tough day on the golf course.



Anthony Emmerson managed to accumulate some good points this month. With the majority of the playing group performing badly. The Callaway handicapping system managed to elevate him up in the place rankings to $6^{\text {th }}$ position. What was interesting is that the switch across to an official club handicap has been brutal for Brenton. He was not aided by an accommodating handicap and suddenly he found himself right near the bottom of the pack. Egg has one more round playing using the handicapping system before he to will be given the challenge of playing to an official Sunday Leave Pass Club handicap. For those that have never read this far down into the blurb and if you are suddenly interested in how all the new members under the Callaway handicap system keep beating you, list below is a brief summary of how the system works.

Remember for the first three rounds the newbies play off a Callaway Handicap.


This system is used for determining fair allowances for social golf events that attract novices or occasional golfers. A player's Callaway handicap is
determined after each round by deducting from his/her 18 -hole gross score the scores of the worst individual holes during the first 16 holes of the round.

In the computation of handicaps under this system:
-No hole may be scored at more than twice its par,

- half strokes count as a whole,
the 17th and 18th holes are never deducted,
For example, if a player scores 99 on the day their handicap would be calculated as the sum total of their ( 3 worst holes) +1

If a player scores 82 on the day their handicap would be calculated as the sum total of their ( 1 x worst $+1 / 2$ the $2^{\text {nd }}$ worst hole) -1

If a player scores 120 on the day their handicap would be calculated as the sum total of their (five worst holes) +2

These handicaps are then taken off the players gross score for 18 holes to give a Nett score and therefore a place ranking just the same as we do with all members with an official Sunday Leave Pass handicap.

Congratulations to our June (2) winner. Mick Harper notched up his $10^{\text {th }}$ Sunday Leave Pass monthly crown. With a brilliant score of 76 off the stick in what can only be described as very difficult conditions, Mick was able to excel. Mick has proved why he is the lowest handicapper in the social club as he plays consistently and always finishes in amongst the big end of the points distribution. The handicapper has hit him again this month and suddenly he is playing off 7 meaning he has 11 holes where he doesn't get any shots and needs to make a par to break even. Obviously on a windy day, the big powerful hitters come to the fore. Leigh MacIsaac after a run of not so good rounds found his pure swing form and Leigh closed the day out in second place with a Nett score of 70. Cliffy, Cam and Shane Cumming finished in $3^{\text {rd }}, 4^{\text {th }}$ and $5^{\text {th }}$ position and therefore added significantly to their annual points standings.

For those players not familiar with the scoring process, listed below is the format we use in Sunday Leave Pass competitions. Once all of the players are ranked then the Seasons Championship points are allocated according to the position in the field.

The player in $1^{\text {st }}$ place gets 15 points, $2^{\text {nd }}$ place 14 points, $3^{\text {rd }}$ place 13 points, etc etc. Any player who completes the round however finishes ranked outside the top 14 and is placed between $15^{\text {th }}$ spot to BeerWench then they are all allocated 1 championship point for attending.

For the benefit of the newcomers or the uneducated we thought it would be a good opportunity to go through the player rankings and point scoring system again.

Sunday Leave Pass competitions are run using Stroke, so you need to count every shot that you play, and you need to finish every hole. Each players Nett total score is then calculated by deducting the players handicap from the Gross score. If a player doesn't have an official Sunday Leave Pass handicap, then a temporary played to handicap is allocated on the day using the Callaway handicapping system.

Once the players Nett score is calculated they are ranked from lowest score to highest score. (BeerWench) Where more than one player has the same Nett Score (such as in the example below the place allocations are decided based on a countback system.
The count back system is formulated as the following.
*Total number of stableford points scored on the back nine holes.
*In the event that both players have the same stableford score on the back nine it then reverts to the number of stableford points scored on the eighteenth hole. If this is the same then it goes to the $17^{\text {th }}$ hole, sixteenth hole, fifteenth hole until a player has a better hole and therefore has a higher stableford score than the other.

If one person plays 13 rounds for the year and the person in $2^{\text {nd }}$ place has only played 10 rounds but is close to the same score, then that is bad luck to the person in $2^{\text {nd }}$ place. All players are invited to play the entire fixture. We reward participation rather than perfection and performance so if you play more often you will end up with more points.

As a new member of the Social Club the Callaway Handicapping system is used to give the player a daily played to handicap for the first couple of rounds. Once they have played 3 rounds, they are given a temporary club handicap using the original AGU handicapping system. After 5 rounds they are then switched across to the current slope handicapping system.

For those people interested in the mechanics of the handicapping system it can be best explained as the following.

How to calculate a GA Handicap

To calculate a player's GA Handicap:

- you must firstly identify the player's most recent 20 scores,
- you then determine the 'Played To' value for each of these scores,
- you average the best 8 'Played To' values,
- and finally you multiply this average by 0.93 . The resultant figure (to one decimal place) is the player's GA Handicap.
* If a player's handicap record contains a lesser number than 20 scores, the number of scores used to calculate the player's handicap is as listed in the table below.
* There is no requirement for a player's most recent 20 scores to have been returned within a specific timeframe. For example, the most recent 20 scores may span a period of three years or they may span a period of three months.
* Once a player's handicap record contains 20 scores, the next score they return will result in the oldest of the existing 20 scores being removed (to be replaced by the new score).

Full Technical Procedure for Calculating a GA Handicap

STEP 1 - Use the table below to determine the number of scores to be included in the GA Handicap calculation:
Number of Scores in Player's Handicap Scores to be Used in the Record Calculation

Take Warren Perrett for Instance. He has now played 8 rounds with the club and his Best round was 13 over par and his next best round once again at Dorset is 27 over par or better described as a combined score differential of 40 . When this value is divided by 2 and is then multiplied by 0.93 his official handicap is 18.6 which was rounded to 19.0. If he had actually played 20 rounds and the scores listed above were his best 6 scores, then his handicap would actually be 33.25 . or rounded back to 33.3 .

The more rounds a member plays the more reflective the handicap becomes of their skill level. Once a player has played 20 or more rounds each month the $20^{\text {th }}$ round is dropped off and replaced with a new score. This is the point where a score inside the top 8 might drop off and be replaced by a higher score meaning the handicap goes up even though the player carded a decent performance.

The handicapper was in a little more slash happy this month. The handicapping scissors were taken to Barry \& Rick 0.7 strokes, Dale 0.4 strokes, Stu Coops was wiped of 1.2, Tony Grasso's victory cost him 1.1 and Tom and T Mac copped a little shave and Wayne James also dropped half of a full shot. At the other end of the spectrum Cam Ross, Cliff Rowe and Phil Plane were loaded up with almost a full extra shot for next month at Bayviews, and for some strange reason the current points championship leader was allocated a bonus 0.4 strokes as if he needs any help. Newell, Slinky and Douggo were given a little incentive bonus and Gerard MacIsaac has plummeted out to his highest ever Sunday Leave Pass Handicap after playing on Single figures for the last 140 rounds suddenly he has dropped out to an 11 handicap where he is sure to be dangerous.

[^0]:    In this instance from Dorset both Mick and Supercoach had Nett 66 after their handicap was deducted from the Gross Scores. So, we go back to a countback.

    In this example Mick wins and gets the higher place finish. Mick had 18 points on the back nine compared to Fil who could only conjure up 17 stableford points on the back nine and was therefore relegated down a place.

    If in the event that the countback then identifies that both players have had the same stableford points score on the back nine then we go back to the individual holes starting from the $18^{\text {th }}$ hole and compare results until a player had a standout result. In the example shown on the right from both Rick and Barry at Dorset, each of them had 18 Stableford points. Since Barry had a bogey for 2 points whereas poor Rick only had a score of 6 for 1 points on the $18^{\text {th }}$ hole therefore Barry wins the countback and Rick is relegated back to a lower place ranking. If both scores are equal then we go back to the $17^{\text {th }}$ hole, then the $16^{\text {th }}$, etc etc.

    PLEASE NOTE THAT THE COUNT BACK IS ON HOLES 10-18 irrespective of whether it is a two-tee start, a normal hit off from the first hole or as in the case of Warburton or Devils Bend where we hit off the $10^{\text {th }}$ hole and the $1^{\text {st }}$ hole. It is always the $10^{\text {th }}$ to $18^{\text {th }}$ holes and if one person starts on the $10^{\text {th }}$ hole and the other hits off the first hole then it still remains exactly the same formula.
