Bayview's Golf Results

July



Well it wasn't quite a Nett Score of 51, however it was on a real golf course with a real score card and the putter responded the way you thought it should on what can only be described as some very testy greens. This was our first venture out to Bayviews golf course and for the middle of winter the course did not disappoint. The views were spectacular.



The fairways were firm and offered plenty of run, and the greens were like lightning, even if a little difficult to read. According to the locals the secret to scoring well and putting at Bayviews is to know that the ball always rolls towards the water no matter how you think the break on the green reads.



This was no urban myth either, Putting was the biggest problem for most of the players on Sunday. Many a time the ball would roll up the slope. A putt towards the beach would take off like lightning and almost roll off the green. Whereas a putt away from the water would fall well short of the hole no matter how hard you smashed it.

Greg Parsons had 25 slaps with the flat stick on the front nine and when you consider he only amassed 30 putts over the entire 18 holes at X golf just 2 weeks ago it shows how tough it was to get the ball into the hole. Many other people struggled to come to terms with the gravity defying greens which were almost magical because they often contradicted the laws of physics.

Sadly for Chris Sfiligoj any chance of catching up a few points on Tom Kellythorn blew up during his round on Sunday when he 5x putted the 9th Green and that was after a four putt on the 7th hole. The back nine didn't get any easier for him either, Chris three putted 3x more greens after the turn which left him wearing the yellow vest and even worse in last position for the day. So he will be dressed in the pink vest next month as well.

Highway invested heavily contributing to the fine jar by 4 putting on successive greens on 10th and 11th holes.



Tony Mac got his day off to a rough start, his first drive disappeared into the car park never to be seen again and then he bludgeoned his next ball whacking it 12 times including a four putt to earn the yellow vest on the very first hole.

Col Ewart racked up a Newell (score of 10 or more) on the first hole and it was an uphill battle from there. It should be noted however that Bayviews is Col's favourite course and he often uses Bayviews as his home course over the summer months.

The local knowledge obviously came in handy because Col was one of the few players who excelled with the flat stick, needing only 33 putts to negotiate the entire 18 holes.

Col finished in the top half of the field and has already posed a submission for the club to add a BBQ to the Bayview round in 2018. Hopefully the course continues to poll votes as a course of choice because it is definitely one of the better courses, we have played even if the scoring was tough.



Damien rolled his 4th putt into the 12th hole, for a score of nine, however that was not nearly as devastating as Cliffy's four putt on the same green which converted a makeable birdie opportunity into a double bogie 6. Cliff also accrued 4 putts on the ninth hole and he turned birdie chances on the first and sixth greens into bogies by his incompetence with the flat stick and inability to read the natural pull on the green towards the water.

Both Barry and Greg Parsons had the worst outcomes with the putter, both of them had 44 swats with the flat stick. Greg made 25 putts on the front nine and Barry had 25 putts on the back nine. However, when it came to putting woes they weren't alone. Amazingly 10 out of 22 players had more than 40 putts for the day whereas only 6 players were on the positive side of the ledger. Only Stu, SOS, Mick, Col, Leigh and Grumpy all averaged less than two putts per hole.

Stu Coops was the best putter for the day. Stu holed 5 one putts and twelve two putts for a tally of 32 strokes. Tony Mac was also economical with the putter, holing a gobbler from off the green for a par after failing to hit his drive passed the ladies tees on the 14th hole.



Big Mick shot the lowest gross score for the day. Interestingly Micks score of 81 even included a shank and an airswing. Mick only had one three putt green and he the coasted around the course racking up abirdie and nine pars for the day

Mick needed only to use his putter 33 times and his Greens in regulation was running at a very impressive 66.66% greens hit.

Mick did have a few issues of his own though. Even before he teed off with his first drive he was having problems with his golf bag which he needed to tape to his buggy using gaffa tape just to make sure it didn't fall off because he had left the straps at home.

Luckily for Mick the forecast rains for Sunday never came and the weather held out for us because the dim wit had actually taped his umbrella to the buggy so if it had of been wet he would not have been able to get it out anyway.

Barry Hemsleys day started off badly and it got worse from there. Barry arrived at the golf course only to discover that he had left his golf shoes in the front garden and even worse he realized that he had some how manage to lose his pitching wedge and sand wedge at the X Golf round a couple of weeks ago.

When he called his wife to ask her to make the 1 hour trek to Rosebud to bring the shoes to him Barry was told un no uncertain terms that he would be sleeping in the doghouse for the next month. Needless tosay the shoes never arrived and Barry had a very difficult day. In the end he finished in 21st position only 1 stroke away from being awarded the beer wench status.



Chris Sfiligoj was the player who did finish up with the pink vest. Chris has been having a stellar season in 2017 and he was sitting in 2nd place on the points championship only 1 good round from catching up with Tom Kellythorn. Unfortunately for Chris his ship has sailed and his 1 point round compared to Tom's 14 points pretty much sank his chances of winning the seasons championship. With a gap 22 points between them now you could say that he has missed the boat.

It all went wrong for the left hander when Chris started his day on the wrong foot and evidently things got worse from there. Although Chris didn't leave his shoes at home like Barry did. He actually managed to wear them on the wrong foot. So it's little wonder he was unable to walk in the footsteps of greatness.



The challenge for all concerned now, is that with Chris Sfilogoj out of the equation who will be able to head Tom Kellythorn off at the pass. Tom played yet another solid round and unfortunately the handicapper is not taking shots off his generous handicap quicker than his golf is improving. In order to achieve optimal performance Tom actually booked himself a room at the Rosebud caravan park during the past week and charged it all back as a work expense claim telling his bosses he was on a job that required him to stay on site. Coincidentally he was a regular patron of the Bayviews facility for the last 7 days. When we all arrived at the golf course on Sunday Tom was already on the practise green working on his short game and according to the pro he had been there since before they arrived at sun rise.

Practise makes perfect and Tom is living proof. He finished in second place again this month. Incredibly Tom is averaging a place ranking of inside the top 7 this season, and he has only failed to score multiple points twice for the year and those were with his blemishes at both Warburton and Dorset.

Next month is at Toms local course and since it is so close to his home he will undoubtedly be very tough to beat at Werribee Park especially since he wont have to travel to make his regular practice rounds.

Leigh MacIsaac was on track to have a blinder, he birdied three of the first eight holes and was only 40 strokes completed when he was at the turn including a nine on the first hole. Unfortunately the steep hills got the better of his skinny young little legs and he grew tired causing his swing to deteriorate once the fatigue kicked in. Leigh just fell short of a hole in one on the 123 meter par 3 eleventh hole by a matter of 115 meters. He copped a \$2 fine for failing to get passed the womens tees. From then onwards everything imploded and it all went pear shaped for Leigh. On the 16th hole he racked up a couple of lost balls from the tee and accrued a Newell (score of 10 or more) plus 2 ending any hope of recovering his great start to the round. Leigh was 17 shots worse on the back nine than the front hitting 57 to end the day with his highest gross score for the year. (97)



Rick Turcinovic smashed his first drive down the middle of the fairway with a perfect drawing flight path, so long was his shot that his ball nearly landed in Damien Vanterpools back pocket while he lined up to play his second stroke. The funny thing about Ricks drive was that he actually smashed it in mid air from a moving golf ball that had been thrown towards him. While he was waiting for the group in front to clear, during one of Ricks practice swings Stu Coops had thrown a ball at his golf club as a joke. Rick said to Stu, **“that would be fun do it again and I will try to hit it.”** You can call him Dexys Midnight Runners (they sang C’mon Eileen) beacause Rick is a one hit wonder, with his first attempt he nailed the shot and the ball took off with more power and accuracy than any shot Rick has ever played before in his previous 87 rounds with the Sunday Leave Pass Social Club.

Had it been a legitimate stroke Ricks drive might well have actually knocked off Dales drive which won him his fourth ever career longest drive title.

Brad Hughes used his long drive on the 9th hole where he knocked his tee shot onto the front edge of the green. He was unable to convert his putt for eagle on the 279 meter par 4 however he did make the easiest of pars. Stu Coops had flashbacks to X golf when he knocked his drive pin high on the same hole. As was the case at Knox, Stu missed the eagle, failed to roll in the birdie, missed a gimmee for par and closed out the hole with four strokes with the putter for a bogie.

Andrew Clarke and Tony Mac caused carnage in their golf buggy. How they didn’t end up on their roof is hard to believe, there were several holes when the cart was on two wheels on a 25degree gradient. Andrew claims they were never at Risk because Tony was always on the low side and according to Andrew he is a lightweight. But it certainly looked like they were on the verge of rolling over.

In the end it was Stu who achieved the best result for the day. Despite starting double bogie, double bogie and finishing double, double the work he did in the middle of the round was enough to elevate him into first position.

Brad Hughes finished in 5th place with 84 off the stick.
