Beacon Hills Golf Course Results

June

What a difference a fortnight can make. As we passed over the winter solstice, the effect that the middle of winter has had on the scorecards was dramatic. Only the Parsons family members were capable of posting a sub- par round whereas the majority of the field experienced scores that had us all wondering whether the pink dress might be passed in our direction. It became more important whether you had beaten someone rather than whether you had beaten everyone, and there was a sigh of relief whenever you found a player who had gone worse than you did.

The day didn't start off very well for a large proportion of our golfers. By the time most players stood up on to the first tee they were already disheveled and distressed after spending hours driving around the back streets and gravel roads of Upper Beaconsfield and Cardinia Reservoir trying to find a route to the golf course. As it happened the local council had closed what seemed like every road in the district for repairs and bridgeworks making it near on impossible for people of the modern, google maps and navman generation who can't read a Melways to find their way into the car park.

Greg Parsons will rue his putting woes, especially once he discovers that the successive three putts on the 17th and 18th holes cost him the monthly title. Greg played brilliantly on the front nine and like so many before him he was starting to rehearse his victory speech as he approached the closing holes. Unfortunately the 20 shots (8 over par) that he hit on the last three holes was sufficient to whittle away his significant lead opening the door for his old man Ronnie who was out for vengeance after being protested out of 2nd place last month at Spring Park.

Ronnie's fatherly love and charity towards Greg was expired on the 2nd hole when the old fella knocked his ball onto the green improving the NTP position. The *Golf Digest* study even breaking the odds down by quality of play:

- Professional Tour player making an ace: 3,000 to 1
- Low-handicapper making an ace: 5,000 to 1
