Wow, how quickly the world can change. Two months ago, things were ticking along smoothly. The Sunday Leave Pass points leaderboard was taking shape, with the usual candidates rallying and mounting their charge towards the top and then suddenly Whammo the $5 \#!7$ has hit the fan. The share market crashed, society regressed and went back 100 years, and all manner of modern day to day activities have suddenly been cancelled or closed. There is talk about stopping everything, unplugging the year 2020 and rebooting to start the whole thing again. If it was possible, this is probably a good idea and I certainly would like to see it happen, especially when it comes to the Sunday Leave Pass golf season. The AFL are currently talking about shortening the football season and perhaps that is what we could also do with our SLP golfing fixture. If we start the points allocation from the Centenary Park round with every member on 0 points it would be a blessing and that would definitely improve my Wood ' $n$ ' Spoon ranking by 22.67 points. Mind you, it is not just me either, there are a few other attendees (we can't really be called golfers or players for that matter) who would by in this voting camp, Tom Kellythorn, Rick, Brent and Kleppy you would have to think would all, also be very happy to reset from scratch and start again because the season thus far has been a very tough one.

On the other end of the spectrum is Anthony Emmerson and Wayne James who are currently going head to head as the forerunners for the points championship competition. Egg has played 2 x games for two podium finishes. He had a very close $2^{\text {nd }}$ place at Gardiners Run and then he made a clear-cut gold medal finish at Beacon Hills. We are not sure who invited him into the group in the first place, but we are all gearing up ready to walk him back out of the club if he continues his current run of form. Egg has an incredible stats profile from his short Sunday Leave Pass career. 3x career titles from just 7 starts. His career average place ranking is just 4.86 which is clearly the lowest in the club. Hopefully the handicapper gets into Anthony soon because he seems to be carrying the skillsets of a golfer far in advance of what he has currently been allocated as a handicap.

Wayne James (2019 Champion of Champions title holder) is also presenting as a genuine golfer again this year. Wayne is consistently featuring at the top end of the points distribution and even more importantly he is quickly checking off his IOU hit list by wearing his jacket and collecting drinks from the playing group of Season 2019. Wayne has already received more fringe benefits from the Blue Jacket than did Douggo, Tom and Jamie combined during their reign over the entire season.

Although he is in $2^{\text {nd }}$ place and just one point behind Egg, Wayne is yet to win the illusive monthly title, which is the only way an entry ticket is available to go into the playoff to compete for the Champion of Champions jacket in season 2020 and be in contention to possibly be the first player to go back to back.

To qualify as the Champion of Champions title a member needs to win a monthly title. All of the winners from monthly championships who are attending the golf trip will then play off for the title based on total accumulated stableford points from 9 x Randomly selected holes. The Winner is the person with the most points over those holes, in the event of a tie a Countback applies.
NOTE: The Winner of the December title is eligible to win however they only get to count scores and use only 8 Randomly selected holes.

## Monthly winners eligible for Champion of Champions playoff in 2020

Points are hard to come by this season, with fields of players in excess of 30 players each month so far, it is a big ask to finish inside the top 14 to get multiple points. Every missed putt, each lost ball or duffed chip has a huge impact on the final place rankings and the count back system can be influential on how the day pans out for you. The scores on the back nine are very important as they are regularly the determinant of the end results because when more than one player finishes with the same Nett score then the places are calculated based on the total number of stableford points scored on the back nine and then narrowed even finer down to individual hole scores starting from the $18^{\text {th }}$ hole and working back.

The count back system is formulated as the following.
*Total number of stableford points scored on the back nine holes.
*In the event that both players have the same stableford score on the back nine it then reverts to the number of stableford points scored on the eighteenth hole. If this is the same then it goes to the $17^{\text {th }}$ hole, sixteenth hole, fifteenth hole until a player has a better hole and therefore has a higher stableford score than the other.

The Beacon Hills course was in fantastic condition, we had previously only ever played Beacon Hills in the depths of winter and it had proved to be a tough ask and a bit of a bog hole, that is probably why it fell out of favor of the voting for several years. As a Summer track it actually proved to be a lovely paddock although the scores were still reflective of a difficult and challenging golf course. Only Anthony, Wayne and Steve Powne managed to play to their handicap or better. SOS and Dale came very close. Basically, they were only one bad hole from posting a respectable score. From there onwards the numbers got bigger and bigger. There was no excuse about the conditions, the course was immaculate, having hosted a pro-am tournament last week the course was picture perfect, there was hardly a breath of wind to speak of and the temperature could only be classed as a beautiful Autumn's day.



It will be interesting when we put the ballot out to the members, to see if Beacon Hills gets enough votes to remain on the 2021 fixture, it's odds might be slightly improved because Wayne has always been a hater of the course however with a $2^{\text {nd }}$ place finish his opinion might have suddenly been skewed in the golf courses favor.

I cannot see Beacon Hills being very high up on my voting preferential list this year. Well maybe only some of it. I definitely, will not be voting for the $5^{\text {th }}$ hole anyway. My round became unraveled after what was a very promising start when the fifth hole did a number on me. It was the Nearest to pin $2^{\text {nd }}$ shot hole. A relatively simple, as a 317 meter par 4 , anyone could be forgiven for thinking it was going to be an easy hole. Unfortunately, it wasn't to be the case and it wasn't just me who suffered at the mercy of this evil golf hole.

Peter Alphabet hit a snap hook and his ball hit a tree branch and bounced back into the middle of the fairway. He thought he had caught a lucky break however he was very, very wrong. My snap hook followed suit but it was not quite as forgiving as Peters ricochet. After a 2 minute and 58 second search of the thick forest my ball was finally located buried in the grass up against a tree trunk.


Given I hadn't brought my chainsaw and axe with me I opted to be conservative and to try to chip the ball back out onto the safety of the fairway. The shot was magnificent and had it not been for a tussock of mountain sword grass which reach out and grabbed the golf ball from the sky and pulled it into its root system it would have been a great shot and a brilliant course management plan.

Although SOS saw exactly were the ball had been abducted, it still took a further 2minutes and 49 seconds before anyone could get a sighting on the AVX1 golf ball. Such was the strangle hold on the ball that there were only two possible options on how to approach the next play. It was impossible to chip back the ball back out onto the fairway this time so it was either take a penalty and claim an unplayable lie or just grip hard and try to dismember the bushes and hope to get some club on the ball and at least progress it forward to somewhere a bit more user friendly.


Naturally I made the correct decision and opted to sprain my wrist and back, disembowel $3 / 4$ of the native shrub and I did actually manage to move the ball just far enough for it to get stuck behind another tree trunk. A couple of shots later I had successfully maneuvered my ball the desired 317 meters from tee to green, if only a little bit off direction. I had positioned the golf ball in the bunker inside the bunker. Well it wasn't quite a bunker in the sand; however, it was in the deep furrow of some idiot's footprint who had forgotten to rake the bunker when they finished. Given the footprint was only 15 cm long and about 10 cm deep it wasn't hard to work out the possible perpetrators. First thing I did when I dragged myself back into the carpark was to check the sole prints on Steve Powne and Tom Kellythorn because they are the only 2-guys with feet small enough to fit into the footprints which had been left in the sand.


Incredibly even with all of the misadventures I had had on the $5^{\text {th }}$ hole and despite his fortuitous lucky break from the tee shot, Peter Alphabet still managed to rack up more shots on the hole than I did. Peter closed out the fifth with a Newell which was one of only 4 Newell's (Score of 10 or more) achieved for the day. Brendan Mac, Colin and Kleppy were the only other golfers to make double digits which was surprising considering how high many of the scores were. Obviously, most players lots of bad holes rather than simply having one big blowout hole.


Brendan MacIsaac is mounting a caucus to try to introduce a new competition into the monthly prizes. Brendan is strongly backed and supported by Stevie Powne who was heard after the round trying to get the longest drive competition rules changed to have it handicapped based on power to weight ratio.

Brendan is not interest in the longest drive however he is hoping to see the straightest drive competition introduced as well. Understandably so, especially after he nailed this one down the tenth hole.

Interestingly, Brendan walked off with a 7 on the $10^{\text {th }}$ hole and the longest drive winner scored a 6 despite having a 170-meter head start with the second shot.

The longest drive marker was passed from S. Klep to S. Coop.

Brendan and the entire MacIsaac family were quite easy to identify as the meandered down the middle of the fairway. At one stage three of the four of them were seen wearing the same wardrobe and Leigh was the only MacIsaac who didn't have the flouro yellow high vis gear on at the time and that was only because he had literally just passed it on to his Uncle Gerard.


Compared to Warburton the greens at Beacon Hills were much more user friendly. The average putts per player improved by nearly 3 strokes this month, although the vest was still seen doing the rounds, even if not so rapidly. It took Shane Cummings group 6 holes before anyone in the pairing had made a blemish with the flat stick, which was a brilliant effort and they most likely would have gone even further had Steve O'Sullivan put the mozz on them which resulted in Paul Marshall hollering after he missed a simple 3 foot clean-up par putt under the pressure of keeping the vest in storage and SOS's watchful gaze.

Cam Douglas, Mick, Steve Powne and Shane Cumming all went the full 18 holes without a blemish on the score card. Cam was the best with the flat stick making an impressive 8 one putts for a very impressive 28 for the day. Steve Powne used the putter economically and he even chipped in on the $12^{\text {th }}$ hole and joined the group of just 3 players who documented noner's ( 0 putts) on the scorecard. 124 one putts was on par for the season average however with just 75 , 3 putts and 8 four putts or worse it was a marked improvement on Warburton which yielded 116 three putts and 16 fineable $4+$ putter offences.

Shaun Klepp hit the ball 111 times on Sunday, yet interestingly he putted like a demon, Shaun only used the flat stick 31 times meaning he was ranked $5^{\text {th }}$ overall in the putting stakes. We can not quite work out where it all went wrong for Shaun because he also knocked a monster long and straight drive down the $10^{\text {th }}$ hole to see himself leading the long drive title almost up until the last grouping. Shaun could count himself unlucky because he was pipped at the post by Stu Coops who actually managed to successfully land a driver on the fairway. To rub salt in the wound Stu left Kleppy's name on the marker and replicated it with his own name underneath.


Where it all went wrong for Shaun we do not quite know, however we can confirm that the longest walk he made all day was the distance between the tee box and his drive on the $10^{\text {th }}$ hole however his second longest distance travelled was not far behind and that one was walking into the scrub on the $14^{\text {th }}$ hole after he launched his 7 iron in absolute frustration.


Rick Turcinovic might find himself with a little bit of competition this year and might start needing to look for another trophy especially since Shaun polled very well in voting for the angry man award after he was fined the maximum fine limit for throwing clubs on at least 3 separate occasions.

Luckily Rick is hedging his bets and he has a few other irons in the fire, Rick has secured his seat in the Beer Wench of Beer Wenches play off on the golf trip having come last at Warburton and he also could be a strong candidate for Least improved and Wood "n' Spoon trophies after yet another bottom of the table finish. Rick adorned the pink vest as a result of his performance last month and only finished 3 places a head of going back to back.


If Rick's day was tough on Sunday, it was still nothing compared to the 2018 season champions outing because Tom Kellythorn had an absolute Nightmare. As Tom shanked his tee shot into the scrub off the first tee, the newbies from the Douglas family tree got very excited. Heathy McLeod made the comment to his mates, "If that guy has won the seasons championship then this is the type of golf club that I want to be part of." Toms day did not start well and it didn't finish off much better. He scraped into third last position by a count back and he was only one shot behind capturing the beer wench vest yet again.

Something has definitely gone wrong with Toms game because he was once considered one of the most consistent performers in the club and he is now categorized as the 4-hour comedy entertainment booking for his fellow players. What we do know is Tom will not be cross contaminating and catching the Corona Virus because he invested in a brand-new glove which was free of germs and soil contaminants. The only issue was when Tom went to shake hands with his playing partner's he suddenly realized he was wearing the glove on his right hand, meaning he had bought a left-handed golfer's glove.

In order to recoup the cost of the 8 golf balls that he lost on Sunday; Tom is now running an auction for the glove to the highest left-handed bidder. Peter Alphabet continues to be a prominent feature at the top of the points distribution, hopefully now that he has an official club handicap and a few rounds under his belt the handicapper will be able to get into him and knock his scores back into shape.

For those players not familiar with the scoring process, listed below is the format we use in Sunday Leave Pass competitions.
Once all of the players are ranked then the Seasons Championship points are allocated according to the position in the field.
The player in $1^{\text {st }}$ place gets 15 points, $2^{\text {nd }}$ place 14 points, $3^{\text {rd }}$ place 13 points, etc. etc. Any player who completes the round however finishes ranked outside the top 14 and is placed between $15^{\text {th }}$ spot to BeerWench then they are all allocated 1 championship point for attending.

For the benefit of the newcomers or the uneducated we thought it would be a good opportunity to go through the player rankings and point scoring system again.

Sunday Leave Pass competitions are run using Stroke so you need to count every shot that you play and you need to finish every hole. Each players Nett total score is then calculated by deducting the players handicap from the Gross score. If a player doesn't have an official Sunday Leave Pass handicap then a temporary played to handicap is allocated on the day using the Callaway handicapping system.

Once the players Nett score is calculated they are ranked from lowest score to highest score. (BeerWench)
For those accountants and number crunchers you may have noticed that the handicaps this year are varying slightly, this is because we have integrated the course difficulty (slope rating) into the handicap calculation process.

What we have done is simply aligned the Sunday Leave Pass handicapping process with the one used by golf link and by all golf clubs around the globe. Although your SLP handicap is unofficial and therefore it cannot be used to formally to enter organized golf competitions and tournaments, it still should be an accurate reflection of your golfing prowess and a measure of what your GA (golf Australia) handicap would be if you subscribed the $\$ 150$ per year to get an official handicap.

This year, your playing handicap will fluctuate around your documented handicap index. When you play an easy course such as Ringwood or Dorset then you will actually play off a lower handicap than you normally would. On the other days when we invite you to play a harder course such as Eynesbury we will add a few extra shots to your arsenal just to give you more hope of avoiding total anxiety and depression.

## HANDICAPS

The changes to player's handicaps are as follows:
BOLD RED NUMBERS- refer to players whose handicap has gone out
BOLD GREEN NUMBERS- refer to players whose handicap has come in
BOLD BLACK NUMBERS- refer to players whose handicap has remained unchanged
NON BOLD NUMBERS- refer to players who didn't play this month, so handicap has not changed

As a new member of the Social Club the Callaway Handicapping system is used to give the player a daily played to handicap for the first couple of rounds. Once they have played 3 rounds, they are given a temporary club handicap using the original AGU handicapping system. After 5 rounds they are then switched across to the current slope handicapping system.


This system is used for determining fair allowances for social golf events that attract novices or occasional golfers. A player's Callaway handicap is determined after each round by deducting from his/her 18 -hole gross score the scores of the worst individual holes during the first 16 holes of the round.

In the computation of handicaps under this system

No hole may be scored at more than twice its par,

- half strokes count as a whole
- the 17th and 18th holes are never deducted,

For example, if a player scores 99 on the day their handicap would be calculated as the sum total of their ( 3 worst holes) +1
If a player scores 82 on the day their handicap would be calculated as the sum total of their (worst $+1 / 2$ the $2^{\text {nd }}$ worst hole) -1

If a player scores 120 on the day their handicap would be calculated as the sum total of their (five worst holes) +2
After 3 rounds they will be allocated a temporary handicap using the old AGU handicapping formula and then after 5 rounds they are elevated onto the official Slope handicapping system which was use thereafter for all club competitions.

For those people interested in the mechanics of the handicapping system it can be best explained as the following.

How to calculate a GA Handicap

To calculate a player's GA Handicap:

- you must firstly identify the player's most recent 20 scores,
- you then determine the 'Played To' value for each of these scores,
- you average the best 8 'Played To' values,
- and finally you multiply this average by $\mathbf{0 . 9 3}$. The resultant figure (to one decimal place) is the player's GA Handicap.
* If a player's handicap record contains a lesser number than 20 scores, the number of scores used to calculate the player's handicap is as listed in the table below.
* There is no requirement for a player's most recent 20 scores to have been returned within a specific timeframe. For example, the most recent 20 scores may span a period of three years or they may span a period of three months.
* Once a player's handicap record contains 20 scores, the next score they return will result in the oldest of the existing 20 scores being removed (to be replaced by the new score).

Full Technical Procedure for Calculating a GA Handicap
STEP 1 - Use the table below to determine the number of scores to be included in the GA Handicap calculation:

## Number of Scores in Player's Handicap Scores to be Used in the <br> Record

| 5 to 6 | Best/Lowest 1 |
| :--- | :--- |
| 7 or 8 | Best/Lowest 2 |
| 9 or 10 | Best/Lowest 3 |

| 15 or 16 | Best/Lowest 6 |
| 17 or 18 | Best/Lowest 7 |
| 19 or 20 | Best/Lowest 8 |

Note: When the handicap record contains more than 20 scores, the GA Handicap calculation uses the best 8 of the player's most recent 20 scores.

The most prevalent birdies at Beacon Hills were the Kookaburras, although there were opportunities the birdies were scarce this week. Wayne James was the man of the moment making two Birds in succession. Wayne chipped in for Birdie on the $8^{\text {th }}$ hole and then followed it up immediately with a genuine 1 putt birdie on the $9^{\text {th }}$ hole. Wayne made 2 out of the 5 sub-par scores achieved for the day.

If one person plays 13 rounds for the year and the person in $2^{\text {nd }}$ place has only played 10 rounds but is close to the same score then that is bad luck to the person in $2^{\text {nd }}$ place. All players are invited to play the entire fixture. We reward participation rather than perfection and performance so if you play more often you will end up with more points.
