

In case you haven't worked it out yet, the winner of the Centenary Park was Stu Coops. Stu was the best of a bad bunch. His score of Nett 73 was nothing worth writing home about, however it was the best score for the day. A stretch of 6 pars in 7 holes between the 9th hole and the 15th hole was the sealer for Stu's round. Interestingly the only hole in this stretch that wasn't a par was the 11th hole where Stu made a double bogey after hitting a ball out of bounds and onto the Peninsula Link Freeway. So technically he did make a par on this hole because he knocked his tee shot with the second ball around the corner, chipped the ball to within 10' feet of the hole and two putted for a par plus 2 penalty strokes.

Centenary Park was a round of what could have been, Newell Richards shot 45 on the front nine and was in the box seat to go back to back titles on his favorite course, however a nasty stretch in the middle of the back nine brought him unstuck. Newell dropped 14 strokes in 3 holes, including a Newell on the Par 3 13th hole. Newell was running a campaign to get the term "Newell" (score of 10 or more) removed from the social club's lexicon, however given that he has already had 2x "Newell's" in 2019 and both on par 3 holes the word definition "Newell" (A score of 10 or more) is set to stay.

Steve O'Sullivan also played admirably on the front nine holes, however he got tired at the end of his round. SOS finished just 4 strokes behind the winning score so he will probably look back on his score card and think that he wasted an opportunity especially since he finished the last three holes uncharacteristically with 2x double bogeys and a triple bogey (six) on the easy par 3 eighteenth hole.

Tony MacIsaac came very close to doubling his career title statistics. After his brother Brendan claimed the Warburton crown Tony came very close to replicating the feat in March. He posted a very credible score at Centenary Park. Nett 75 was good enough for a second-place finish however when you take into consideration that Tony had three 3xputts and a 4xputt green it could have been very easy to eliminate those blemishes from the game and it would have been win number two for Tony.

Any chance of Brendan MacIsaac winning consecutive monthly crowns was blown out of the window when he hooked his first tee shot into the bushes on the first hole. Brendan had a Newell plus two (12) on the first hole, and a couple more Newell's on his way to a score of 134. Brendan definitely showed glimpses of the brilliant ball striking which elevated him to the top of the leaderboard last month. On quite a few occasions when Brendan smashed a long straight drive out of the tee box his playing partners were heard saying "Great Shot Leigh, I mean Brendan." Be warned everyone, this man will be winning many more SLP titles over the next 18 months as he works his handicap rapidly downwards, especially if he continues to have regular lessons with Darren Rowland. Brendan has very good timing, clean ball striking and when he is on, you can see where Leigh inherited his game skills from. Brendan can hit the ball as far as the rest of us and once and he gets rid of his bad shots he will be a force to be reckoned with. You can almost guarantee he won't be having the 124 round droughts like his brother Tony has had, although there may still be the occasional bad round like this month at Centenary Park when he fell from the top of the leaderboard right down to the bottom and into the Flouro Pink Beer Wench vest for the Dorset round.

Steve Powne also had an earth-shattering fall from grace. After sitting atop the points championship ladder at the end of February, it was starting to look like the Blue Smurf was going to stamp his authority in season 2019. Unfortunately, for Steve the lack of oxygen at the dizzying heights of the top of the ladder was all too much for him to handle and he choked. Steve had his worst score since his career worst round of 128 at Growling Frog in November 2004 when he threatened to give up golf entirely. 118 off the stick, Nett 95 was not the sort of numbers we expected to see from Steve given he had brought some great form into the 2019 season. In reality, Steve came very close to his 5th beer wench title, because if Brendan MacIsaac had not have had 45 putts for the 18 holes then Steve would have been a certainty to be dressed in pink at Dorset.

Mick Harper was one of the very few players who got better as the round went on. The big fella was devastated to be reminded by Todd Neilson that he had beaten Mick off the stick on the front nine. Todd shot 47 on the front nine whereas the clubs lowest single figure handicapper had scored 48 strokes at the turn. Mick changed up a couple of gears and suddenly was making regular birdies and pars instead of sixes. Mick played to his handicap on the back nine with 40 off the stick including a brilliant tap in birdie on the Par 5 twelfth hole after smashing a three wood over the trees from the 16th fairway to the front edge of the green, Stuey Cooper style.

Todd Neilson was the most inconsistent performer for the day, he started his account with a birdie on the first hole, then followed it up with a couple of triple bogeys then a double bogey before making yet another birdie on the fifth hole. Todd hit his drive long

and straight for the entire day, unfortunately for him it was just his iron play and chipping that was unreliable and the cause for his blow out scores. Interestingly, Todd made 2x birdies in the first 5 holes, yet he failed to make a par for the entire eighteen holes. Todd finished the day just 3 strokes adrift of the winning score, so were it not for a couple of bad numbers in the closing few holes he could have also easily coasted his way to a victory.

Todd's driving was so reliable and powerful that he decided to give himself a nickname. After running at 100% for fairways hit for the first eleven holes the boastful Canadian turned to his playing partners and said, "I know we already have a guy called Highway, however you guys should really start to call me fairway because I am always on it!"

When it came to the longest drive competition Todd was no match for Big Mick, although he did briefly get his name on the long drive marker when he hit his ball on the fairway passed Cam Ross' noteworthy effort, unfortunately however the very next stroke sailed passed his ball on the fly and Mick convincingly won the title by a good forty to fifty meters.

Perhaps the fifty meters that Mick won the longest drive by, may have been the credit he had left in his distance bank after he hit the ball backwards over his head this with his second shot on the ninth hole. Mick had hit a Stu Coops style block out onto the next fairway and his attempt to smash the ball back into play failed miserably. His 3wood crashed into a tree then flew twenty-five meters high up into the air and backwards over his head. He was left with an embarrassing 50 meter walk back in the opposite direction to play his next shot.

The Saturday Leave Pass boys enjoyed a leisurely afternoon at Centenary Park, historically the winning scores have often come from the breakaway pack however in this instance it wasn't to be the case.



Looking at the photos it appears as though Cliffy Rowe was only half there. Although with a Nett score of 76 and a 4th place finish he was pretty much at the forefront of the picture.





Another player who looked like he was only half there on Saturday was Rick Turcinovic. Rick has obviously been eating out at the same restaurants as Newell Richards goes to. The weight is obviously dropping off Rick very rapidly as he has slimmed down incredibly over the last few months.

A New car, new shoes, new hairdo and dramatic weight loss, it certainly looks like a midlife crisis is in full swing.

Who knows, if Rick pays a visit to Darren Rowland at Ringwood golf course for a few lessons, we might also see some new golf scores as well.

Having said that, Rick did shoot 50 on the front nine at Centenary Park and executed a Newell free 18-hole round, so the golf transformation seems to be well on its way too.

It was great to see Big Ball Breasley back in the mix again. It's not so much Big Ball Breasley these days either, because Greg has obviously also been in starvation mode during the last eight or nine months since we last saw him. Greg has dropped over 10kgs and was looking a picture of good health. It was fantastic to see you back Greg.

Although the scores were anything but good, there still needs to be some winners. This month the monthly title was credited to Stu Cooper who racked up his 14th Sunday Leave Pass crown. In second position it was none other than Tony MacIsaac who won a three way count back against his good mate Rob Underwood and Cliff Rowe.

It was great to see Undies at the top end of the leaderboard especially since he had driven all of the way from Mildura to compete in this month's event. Cam Douglas ran in for 5th place on a count back over Todd and Chris Sfiligoj.

Chris' round was built around his prowess with the flat stick. Chris easily won the putting competition recording only 28 putts for 18 holes and walked around the Centenary Park Golf Course for four hours without ever having to adorn the three-putt monkey vest during his round. Six one putts and a chip in for birdie on the tenth hole made for a very good day for Chris.

For those players not familiar with the scoring process, listed below is the format we use in Sunday Leave Pass competitions.

Once all of the players are ranked then the Seasons Championship points are allocated according to the position in the field.

The player in 1st place gets 15 points, 2nd place 14 points, 3rd place 13 points, etc etc. Any player who completes the round however finishes ranked outside the top 14 and is placed between 15th spot to BeerWench then they are all allocated 1 championship point for attending.

For the benefit of the newcomers or the uneducated we thought it would be a good opportunity to go through the player rankings and point scoring system again.

Sunday Leave Pass competitions are run using Stroke, so you need to count every shot that you play, and you need to finish every hole. Each players Nett total score is then calculated by deducting the players handicap from the Gross score. If a player doesn't have an official Sunday Leave Pass handicap, then a temporary played to handicap is allocated on the day using the Callaway handicapping system.

Once the players Nett score is calculated they are ranked from lowest score to highest score. (BeerWench) Where more than one player has the same Nett Score (such as in the example below from Gardiners Run last year then the place allocations are decided based on a countback system.

The count back system is formulated as the following.

^{*}Total number of stableford points scored on the back nine holes.

*In the event that both players have the same stableford score on the back nine it then reverts to the number of stableford points scored on the eighteenth hole. If this is the same then it goes to the 17th hole, sixteenth hole, fifteenth hole until a player has a better hole and therefore has a higher stableford score than the other.

In this instance both Newell and Cliff had Nett 63 after their handicaps was deducted from the Gross Scores. So we go back to a countback.

In this example Newell wins because he had 24 points on the back nine compared to Cliffy who could only conjure up a disappointing 23 stableford points on the back nine and was therefore relegated down a place.

If in the event that the countback then identifies that both players have had the same stableford points score on the back nine then we go back to the individual holes starting from the 18th hole and compare results until a player had a standout result. In the example shown on the right from last year when both Tony Mac and Tom had 21 Stableford points. Tom had a par for 4 points whereas poor Tony only had a bogie for 3 points on the 18th hole therefore Tom wins the countback and Tony is relegated back to a lower place ranking. If both scores are equal then we go back to the 17th hole, then the 16th, etc etc.

PLEASE NOTE THAT THE COUNT BACK IS ON HOLES 10-18 irrespective of whether it is a two tee start, a normal hit off from the first hole or as in the case of Warburton we hit off the 10th hole and the 1st hole. It is always the 10th to 18th holes and if one person starts on the 10th hole and the other hits off the first hole then it still remains exactly the same formula.

The player with the most points at the end of the year is crowned the Points champion irrespective of how many rounds a person has played. If one person plays 13 rounds for the year and the person in 2nd place has only played 10 rounds but is close to the same score, then that is bad luck to the person in 2nd place. All players are invited to play the entire fixture. We reward participation rather than perfection and performance so if you play more often you will end up with more points.



As a new member of the Social Club the Callaway Handicapping system is used to give the player a daily played to handicap for the first couple of rounds. Once they have played 3 rounds, they are given a temporary club handicap using the original AGU handicapping system. After 5 rounds they are then switched across to the current slope handicapping system.



This system is used for determining fair allowances for social golf events that attract novices or occasional golfers. A player's Callaway handicap is determined after each round by deducting from his/her 18 hole gross score the scores of the worst individual holes during the first 16 holes of the round.

In the computation of handicaps under this system:

- -No hole may be scored at more than twice its par,
- half strokes count as a whole,
- the 17th and 18th holes are never deducted,

For example if a player scores 99 on the day their handicap would be calculated as the sum total of their (3 worst holes) +1

If a player scores 82 on the day their handicap would be calculated as the sum total of their (worst + ½ the 2nd worst hole) -1

If a player scores 120 on the day their handicap would be calculated as the sum total of their (five worst holes) +2

After 3 rounds they will be allocated a temporary handicap using the old AGU handicapping formula and then after 5 rounds they are elevated onto the official Slope handicapping system which was use thereafter for all club competitions.

For those people interested in the mechanics of the handicapping system it can be best explained as the following.

How to calculate a GA Handicap

To calculate a player's GA Handicap:

- you must firstly identify the player's most recent 20 scores,
- you then determine the 'Played To' value for each of these scores,
- you average the best 8 'Played To' values,
- and finally you multiply this average by 0.93. The resultant figure (to one decimal place) is the player's GA Handicap.
- * If a player's handicap record contains a lesser number than 20 scores, the number of scores used to calculate the player's handicap is as listed in the table below.
- * There is no requirement for a player's most recent 20 scores to have been returned within a specific timeframe. For example, the most recent 20 scores may span a period of three years or they may span a period of three months.
- * Once a player's handicap record contains 20 scores, the next score they return will result in the oldest of the existing 20 scores being removed (to be replaced by the new score).

Full Technical Procedure for Calculating a GA Handicap

STEP 1 – Use the table below to determine the number of scores to be included in the GA Handicap calculation:

Number of Scores in Player's Handicap Scores to be Used in the Record Calculation

5 to 6	Best/Lowest 1
7 or 8	Best/Lowest 2
9 or 10	Best/Lowest 3
11 or 12	Best/Lowest 4
13 or 14	Best/Lowest 5
15 or 16	Best/Lowest 6
17 or 18	Best/Lowest 7
19 or 20	Best/Lowest 8

Note: When the handicap record contains more than 20 scores, the GA Handicap calculation uses the best 8 of the player's most recent 20 scores.

Take will Fernie for Instance. He played 6 rounds with the club and his Best round was 13 over par or better described as a score differential of 13. When this value is multiplied by 0.93 his official handicap is 12.09 which was rounded to 12.0. If he had actually played 11 rounds and the scores listed above were his best 6 scores then his handicap would have been 16.75.

The more rounds a member plays the more reflective the handicap becomes of their skill level. Once a player has played 20 or more rounds each month the 20th round is dropped off and replaced with a new score. This is the point where a score inside the top 8 might drop off and be replaced by a higher score meaning the handicap goes up even though the player carded a decent performance.
