

Centenary Park Golf Course Results **May**

We should count our lucky stars that we actually managed to get a round of golf in this month, according to the “apocalyptic predictions” in the Holy Scriptures, and if you listened to the nutty religious Americans who believe them, Sunday should never have happened. The Raptures & Armageddon was scheduled for the 21st May 2011 and the world was meant to come to an end. Supposedly an earth quake and multiple simultaneous weather events like none others seen before by human kind were forecast for the 21st to rid the earth of the human race and more importantly cancel our round of golf at Centenary Park.



2011 AD—On May 21st, Judgment Day will begin and the rapture (the taking up into heaven of God’s elect people) will occur at the end of the 23-year great tribulation.

Although Chris and Jarrett chose to withdraw from Sunday’s competition and await the impending disaster in the comfort of their own homes with their friends and families, the rest of us chose to suffer the inevitable doom and devastation on the sacred grounds of a golf course. Although there was plenty of “Carnage and Devastation” the only weather phenomenon we experienced were a couple of light showers and a blustery wind to contend with and the closet we came to an earth quake was the huge gash Tony MacIsaacs ball carved out of the earth when his drive crashed into the bank running across the 15th fairway.



Life it seems is destined to continue for a bit longer, and therefore, so long as there is life there will be crappy rounds of golf and shattered dreams. Thinking Sunday might be his last ever day on earth Stu Coops invested his entire Saturday afternoon hitting golf balls at the Bulleen driving range. Brendan had a top 5 finish followed by Malcolm, Kyle and Bevan finishing in 6th, 7th and 8th position respectively.
