Centenary Park Golf Course Results

The club has pretty much reached capacity as we have only booked tee times for 32 players for each golf course for the year so it is vitally important to confirm your status for each month as early as

This month we had 31 starters and one no-show. Unfortunately the no-show was Michael Jackson (the ghost who walks) so there was a few disappointed faces when he failed to arrive. It should be said however that there was a few exciting seconds when an athletic African American gentleman with a strong U.S. accent walked down the path and said he was here to join the Sunday Leave Pass Social Club. As it happens the man of the moment was not Michael Jackson but Damien Vanterpool one of our latest recruits who was a breath of fresh air to have out on the fairways. Damien slotted straight in to the Social Club, with a friendly easy go lucky attitude, he demonstrated some flashes of brilliance with a technically near perfect golf swing that comes from being a professional athlete, but he was still able to contribute a four putt and he failed to hit his ball past the ladies tees a couple of times so he was very quick to make his first donation to the fine jar slush fund.

Unfortunately Grumpy's new recruit the "Ghost who walks" Michael Jackson pulled out at the last minute. Evidently Dr. Conrad Murray called Grumpy to say that he couldn't wake up Michael on Sunday morning so he was unable to get to the tee. He dragged himself off the green with a red face and a yellow vest after manufacturing a 7x putt green.

Stu Coops had 7x putts in just two holes on the front nine but he still managed to record only 15 putts for the nine and 30 putts for the day.

Greg Parsons came very close to leaving his putter in the bag when his approach to the sixth hole nearly holed out for eagle.

Brendan MacIsaac has taken a liking to wearing the pink vest, or so it seems anyway. Brendan had more Newell's (score of 10 or more) than Newell did and consequently he posted the worst score for the day and will be burdened with wearing the Beer Wench uniform again in May. Brendan was quite unlucky at times, on the ninth hole Brendan hit a cracking three wood into the tree in front of him, resulting with the ball bouncing back behind him. Unfortunately his very next shot also ricocheted off a tree meaning that after 2 strokes he had actually moved 40 meters further away from the green than where he had been in the first place.

Stu Coops didn't quite get the same level of ricochet off the tree's that Brendan did, in fact his ball while playing on the 7th hole his ball hit a tree and decided to stay up in it. The ball was so high up and lodged that not even Stu was willing to try to play the miracle escape shot.



The Centenary Park golf course was in fantastic condition, the greens were true, the fairways manicured to perfection, the only sore point and topic for discussion was the steep faced bunkers which caused grievances to those who made the mistake of hitting into the sand. Phil Plane dropped 9x places on the point's leader board after he found himself in the trap on the 5th hole. It took Phil 4 shots to extricate his ball and in the end he only managed to do that by hitting out backwards.

Tom Kellythorn also fell foul to the bunkers. Tom racked up 5 shots as he rolled around in the sand on his way to a 12 on yep you guessed it the same bunker as Phil on the fifth hole.



SOS lived up to his name when he was left calling for help after he got buried in the sand on the second hole. Evidently he took so many swats at the ball that he racked up a Newell (Score of 10 or more) on the short Par 3 hole.

So deep was the hole that he created and he actually moved so much sand that a Chinese man popped his head out of the hole that he had dug to say "Hello" (nǐ hǎo) and there was a tectonic plate shift that stimulated a 7.8 magnitude earthquake in Ecuador.

The round took 5 and half hours to play on Sunday and that was mainly because it took SOS 40 minutes to rake the bunker after he finished the second hole.

It was pleasing to see that the ground staff at Centenary Park take pride in their golf course, often many courses are left in disrepair and basic jobs are left unfinished. Not so at the Frankston Course where it was evident they get the jobs done. Last year SOS had a hissy fit after three putting on the 16th hole and the result was his golf buggy crashed into and destroyed a navigation direction sign. 12 months on the sign has been straightened, panel beaten, repainted and fixed back into place with extra strengthened supports so it cannot be damaged again.

There were a lot of new faces floating around on Sunday; however there was one who looked vaguely familiar. Although most people would not have picked him especially since we haven't seen him for 18 months and because he has lost about 50 kg since his last game of golf, it was good to hear Chris Sfiligoj (the good one) back out on the course. Centenary Park is the home course for Chris and it certainly showed. Chris finished in second place with 98 off the stick Nett 71 which is an amazing effort considering he had been paired up with his brother Mark- Super-coach (The bad One) which usually results in a devastatingly bad day out for most golfers.

Round of the day was Ron Parsons, who continues to drop shots off his handicap. Ron has taken nearly 9x shots off his handicap since he retired and took to playing golf regularly at Pakenham golf club. Ron Carded a Nett 69 to win the 15 Championship points. The Sfiligoj boys talked and argued there way into 2nd and 3rd place while Ian Mutimar played comfortably to his new Sunday Leave Pass Social Club Handicap and therefor finished inside the top 5 with Nett 73. Andrew Clarke could not repeat the amazing round at Dorset (75), but even still his score of 90 was good enough to place him higher than 26 other members in the

Centenary Park field. Overall the scores were pretty average and the result was a very large spread of numbers with Brendan MacIsaac bringing up the rear.

As a new member of the Social Club the Callaway Handicapping system is used to give the player a daily played to handicap for the first couple of rounds. Once they have played 3 rounds they are given a temporary club handicap using the original AGU handicapping system. After 5 rounds they are then switched across to the current slope handicapping system.

This system is used for determining fair allowances for social golf events that attract novices or occasional golfers. A player's Callaway handicap is determined after each round by deducting from his/her 18 hole gross score the scores of the worst individual holes during the first 16 holes of the round.

In the computation of handicaps under this system:

- No hole may be scored at more than twice its par,
- half strokes count as a whole,
- the 17th and 18th holes are never deducted,

For example if a player scores 99 on the day their handicap would be calculated as the sum total of their (3 worst holes) +1

If a player scores 82 on the day their handicap would be calculated as the sum total of their (worst + $\frac{1}{2}$ the 2nd worst hole) -1

If a player scores 120 on the day their handicap would be calculated as the sum total of their (five worst holes) +2

After 3 rounds they will be allocated a temporary handicap using the old AGU handicapping formula and then after 5 rounds they are elevated onto the official Slope handicapping system which was use thereafter for all club competitions.




