Devils Bend Golf Course ResultsApril

At 500am on Sunday morning, almost the entire Sunday Leave Pass Group would have awoken to a loud crack of thunder and the sound of a month's worth of torrential rain hammering down in the space of just a couple of hours. It was a stark reminder that it was golf day and we were booked in to play at the Devils Bend Golf Course. To everyone's credit nobody rang to cancel and they all made the long journey out to Mount Martha. We were rewarded with great weather for Devils Bend standards. It only rained for about 3 or 4 holes and the bitter cold sea breeze didn't blow in, until we were playing the second nine holes.

It's a shame the weather is always so terrible at Devils Bend, because it is such a nice golf course, and it offers such an interesting array of challenging holes. While many players struggled to come to terms with the course layout, it was mastered by Brendan Seagrave who finally eliminated his poor form jitters and loss of golfing mojo as he put together a near perfect round. Brendan arrived back in the carpark with a smile on his face which ran from ear to ear, he shot 87 and off the stick giving him a very satisfying 69. For the last few months Brendan has been on the verge of retiring permanently from golf, in fact things have been so bad for him that he has even been refusing to join Big Mick on his weekly practice pilgrimage to Waterford Valley. It seem he is back up and ready for action, especially since he came in with such an explosive score, Brendan reckons he hasn't had a 69 since he was back in high school so there's no wonder he had such a euphoric smile splashed across his chin.

Early in the day it looked as though Ben Nichol was going to take home the chocolates, he started the first nine playing like he was a man possessed. Ben parred 3 of the first four holes and was looking unstoppable until the build-up of adrenaline caused him to over club a few shots that flew straight at the flagstick but finished through the back of the green leaving him with a couple of bad lies. On at least 5 or 6 different occasions Ben had to endure a one stroke penalty and drop from an unplayable lie after what seemed to be fantastic shots in the air turned out to be disastrous.

Phil Plane also managed to find some of the more difficult parts of the course. His drive on the 12th hole was hit low and hard but rather than gain the extra 50 or 60 meters of run as he had planned, his ball landed with a plop and a slurp as his ball was sucked into the muddy bank of a creek running across the fairway. It took a 4x man mining crew using shovels and picks 15 minutes to locate the imbedded ball before Phil could proceed with his round.

Rather than incurring a 1 stroke penalty for the unplayable lie, Phil may have been better off recruiting Mick Harper to play his ball from him from where it lay. Mick has proven that the difference between a good golfer and a great golfer is how you get out of trouble. If you have ever watched any professional golf on TV you would have seen Phil Michelson play miracle shots time and time again, or you might have witnessed the shot of a life time in the sudden death playoff in the US Masters only a couple of weeks ago, when Bubba Watson played from out of the bush to set himself up with an easy putt to win the coveted green jacket.

On the first hole on Sunday Mick found himself hard up against a tree with very little room to make a backswing. Any normal golfer would have taken his penance and chipped the ball out sideways towards the fairway but not Big Mick. He gripped down the shaft and picked the golf club up like an axe guiding it through a small gap between the overhanging branches. Somehow Mick avoided all of the obstacles around him and struck down hard on the ball with a closed club face. The ball flew crisply off his hybrid club and climbed up and out of the woods. The closed club face gave the ball a right to left trajectory, so his ball steered out over and beyond the large water hazard before redirecting back into the middle of the fairway. With the benefit of the massive amount of top spin imparted on the ball, it navigated itself between two large greenside bunkers and ran up onto the green coming to rest only 18 feet from the flag stick. Miraculously, from the impossible he had converted a potentially blow out score into a short uphill eagle putt. Although the Eaglesnest prize pool remained unclaimed because he missed what can only be described as an easy putt, it was a brilliant effort to set up the opportunity and noteworthy birdie nonetheless.

It's been quite a while since the Eaglesnest has gone off, but with 30 balls up for grabs in the prize pool it is obviously ripe and ready for picking. There were at least 3 good attempts at the Eaglesnest this month. As well as Mick's very easy opportunity, Big Ball Breasley had a fair crack at the prize when he smashed his second shot onto the green on the Par 5, fifth hole. Although it only took him 2 strokes to move his ball the 487 meters from the tee to the green, it took a further 4 strokes with the putter to get his ball the 4.87 meters from the green to the hole. Greg's disappointment was obvious by the look on his face when he was reminded that not only had he missed out on winning 30 golf balls and a handful of skins by not making the eagle putt, but also that he was liable for a \$2-00 fine for a four putt green because he finished the hole with a bogie six.

Tony Grasso came within inches of winning not only the Eaglesnest prize kitty, but also the Evergreen Winery Tours hole in one prize. Tony caressed his 9 iron on the short downhill third hole to within inches of the cup. Tony's ball pitched about a foot beyond the hole, and had it spin backwards rather than sideways it was a certainty to go in. There is little doubt Geoff Cooper would have felt a twitch in his wallet pocket and the tightening of his sphincter as the ball was sailing in the air, it was a super birdie and Tony convincingly won the Nearest to pin prize.

Not quite as convincing was big Micks longest drive. Admittedly it was 150 meters further past his closest rivals drive, so length was definitely not the issue. The point of concern was whether the ball remained on the fairway since it was a line ball decision. Mick told his playing partners it was on the fairway and when he asked for a decision from the rules committee, despite the fact the ball was lying in 6 inches of long grass and surrounded by garden waste the ball was deemed to be on the fairway. It's funny how when you are 6 foot nine inches tall and 120kg of raw power with hands the size of dinner plates, nobody tends to argue with you and the decisions always go in your favour. Perhaps if it was Steve Powne asking for the same answer the outcome may have been a little different.

There was little chance of Stevie P. winning he longest drive competition anyway. He arrived at the golf course sporting a serious injury. Steve's arm was wrapped up like an Egyptian mummy. Apparently Steve is claiming the RSI injury is a work related ailment but he is refusing to go to the doctor to confirm it's origin, for fear of it being diagnosed as an injury sustained outside work hours caused from "Prolonged Self Stimulating Sausage Syndrome" or (PSSSS). Given the injury is restricted to his right forearm and elbow and the fact that Steve is presenting the other symptoms related to (PSSSS) including low testosterone levels, lethargy and most importantly deteriorating eyesight it is very unlikely Work Care will cover his medical costs for the injury. Neil Philips might need to take up some "Prolonged Self Stimulating Sausage" over the next few weeks if he wants to have a good time, because he landed himself in the missus' bad books on Sunday and probably won't be getting any conjugal opportunities any time soon. Apparently it was Neil's Wedding anniversary on 22nd April, so when he started to stir and rustle around under the covers on Sunday morning his wife thought he was preparing for the matrimonial morning Glory. Unfortunately when she pulled him in close to her for a cuddle, Neil said "hey what are ya doing woman, Nah sorry not now love, I haven't got time, I've got to go and play golf with the boys!" Well that didn't go down too well with the wife, especially since she wasn't even aware that Neil had arranged to play golf on their wedding anniversary. A few harsh words were screamed at the door as he walked out of the house with the clubs over his shoulder. Luckily for Neil she did give him a temporary leave pass and her last words as he pulled out of the driveway were "OK since you have already booked and paid in advance you can play golf, but just make sure you turn up for lunch by 1-00pm because I have booked a romantic meal for us at our favourite restaurant. I'm not sure how the Special Anniversary Lunch panned out in the end, especially since I remember seeing Neil sucking on his fifth can of VB and still in the car park at 145pm.

Overall there were some very good scores this month, three players had subpar rounds and almost half the field were within the buffer zone of their handicaps. The skins were distributed evenly as well with a total of nine different player's claiming at least one skin hole. Once again Big Mick was penalized for his low handicap and despite 2 birdies and 11 pars he failed to pick up even one skin.

Congratulations to Grumpy who won his 4th career title on a course which 2 years ago caused him to throw a tantrum and storm off with only 11 holes completed. The new golf clubs served Matt MacIsaac well, with another impressive 2nd place finish he maintains his position at the top of the Annual Points Championship Leaderboard. Mick Harper once again posted the lowest gross score. Mick managed to break 80 despite dropping 6 shots on the Par 3 holes, so obviously his form on the longer holes is at a masterful level. Tony Junior and Mark Sfiligoj rounded out the top 5.
