Trevor the Bushranger is obviously as good at Footy tipping as he is playing golf. Trevor already has a two shot buffer over his nearest rival Emma Brunton.



On Sunday Stu Coops became the first player to notch up 100 rounds of golf with the Sunday Leave Pass Social Club. Stu & Jamie Brunton founded the club in March 2004 and since that first match Stu has only missed 2 rounds and incredibly he hasn't actually missed any games since May 2005. Over his illustrious career Stu has racked up a total of 9495 strokes, at an average score of 94.95 shots per round. Stu's best round was at Ivanhoe in February 2007 when he shot 80 off the stick and his worst score was that infamous round at Cape Shank in June 2011 when he finished the day in Beer Wench Position with 120 Nett 102 which included losing 16 golf balls for the round including two balls on the par 3 thirteenth hole where he hit the same house twice in a row from hooked shots that went out of bounds.



From his 100 Rounds Stu's honour roll and achievements includes:

- 7x Monthly titles
- Winner of the Seasons Champion in 2004. (In those days you didn't even get a prize.)
- Champion of Champions golf trip 2011.
- 10x Longest Drive titles. (yes he has hit the fairway at least a dozen times from his 1800 attempts)
- 26x Nearest to pin titles.
- Eclectic Stroke Champion in 2009
- Beer Wench at the golf trip at Cobram in 2009.
- Least Improved Players Choice Award 2009 and 2011.
- Physical Wreck award on Golf trip 2004,2005,2006,2007,2008,2009,2010,2011,2012

Over the years Stu has made 423 pars and 48 Birdies, which isn't much to write home about when you consider Mick Harper has only played 37 rounds and he has already racked up 47 birdies, 1 eagle and 263 pars.

Stu should be congratulated however because for the first time in 100 rounds he actually managed to start and finish with the same golf ball.

Devils Bend Golf Course Results

April: proudly sponsored by



A Special thanks to Greg Parsons who was kind enough to supply all of our participants with a Choc Top after the golf. There is nothing better than ice-cream and beer after a round of golf it's a perfect flavour combination and from now on we are going to name the Devils Bend round the "Choc Top Championship Cup" so that Greg will supply us with a box of ice-cream every time we play down at Devils Bend.

Greg has agreed to the sponsorship and naming rights of the Devils Bend tournament but he has put an exemption clause which means he only has to supply the Choc Top Ice-creams when the weather at Devils Bend is good, this proves that he must be a smart business man because he knows the chances of getting another beautiful day at Devils Bend is virtually impossible.

Sunday was a great day for Choc Tops. Uncharacteristically, Devils Bend put on some splendid weather and although the course played a little tougher than Dorset did last month there were still a few good scores going around. Most players were about 5-8 shots down on last month's performance but that was to be expected given that the golf course is a longer and more challenging layout.

Ben Nichols didn't find the going overly tough. He ambled his way around the course in 92 Shots. Although his score was 10 shots higher than his freakish round last month at Dorset and despite having 3 shots removed from his handicap Ben still managed to finish on the winner's podium for the second month in a row. Ben's victory was a lot less convincing this month however; in fact he only won on a count-back from Ron Parsons who also finished with the same score of Nett 71.

When two players finish with the same Nett score, then the place rankings are determined by a count-back. The count-back takes into consideration the amount of stableford points scored on the back nine holes. The player who scored the most points on the back nine is deemed the winner, in the event that both players

have the same score then the computer calculates scores on each individual holes starting from the 18th hole working backwards until a higher unique stableford score is found. In this case Ben had 18 points whereas Ron had only 17 stableford points on the back nine so Ben was judged the winner, although Ron could argue he that was disadvantaged in this instance since he actually played the back nine first.

By scoring 30 championship points in the last 2 months Ben has rocketed up the season championship leaderboard and is currently perched comfortably in 3rd position and only 9 points behind the leader Greg Breasley who is well and truly in career best form.

Our records indicate that Greg's statistics are alarmingly good this year and foul play has been whispered across the esky on several occasions. Prior to the start of the 2013 season, Greg's best round was 100 at Ivanhoe in 2007 (a very easy scoring course) and his career average score per round was 114.05 shots per game. Greg started his first game at Waterford Valley in 2013 with a handicap of 34.2. Compare these figures to the current season and something starts to smell a bit fishy.

Greg's lowest score is now 99 which was actually achieved on one of the most difficult courses around. In fact his best score was achieved this season on a course that nearly killed him 2 years ago since it was at Warburton where he initiated his heart attack. Greg's worst score in 2013 has been 103 (previous to this season it was 128) and his average round score per round has plummeted from 114 to 101 shots per game in the current year. Greg's putting average has also come down from 39.76 putts per round since he is only using the flat stick 37.25 times each game now. Our handicapper is working hard to try to slow the REMAKULOUS (this is a word Steve Powne invented through his slurred tongue on the trip home after consuming a few too many frothies at Devils Bend, he was trying to say Miraculous or Remarkable we are not sure which one) improvement in Greg's form. Big Balls' handicap has been slashed to 30.4 but still he continues to feature at the top end of the leader board regularly. He is averaging a 4th place finish each round this year against his career average for his first 55 games at 12.79th position. So if you are looking to consider a most improved nominee for season 2013 season you needn't look much further than Big Ball Breasley.



All we can hope is that Greg's new found form is legitimate and through hard work, especially since our sources are currently investigating some suspicious text messages and Greg's links to a less than reputable sports scientist who goes by the name of Dr Steven Danks.

One player who we are certain could not be accused of taking any performance enhancing substances is Steven Powne. Steve racked up his second worse score ever. Steve scored an 11 to start the day when he hit about 5 trees in a row on the first hole and then from that moment on it became pretty obvious that it was going to be a very bad day for Steve. As the golf continued incident after incident tested Steve's character to the limits and then a disastrous 16 shots on the par 4, 15th hole opened up a whole new world of pain.

Steve was just short of the green for four, but then he hit his next shot into the bunker, it took him three shots to get out of the sand trap but the ball rolled across the putting surface in to the pot on the other side of the green. Sadly it required three more shots to get out of that hazard but once again Steve hit it too hard and down the ball went back into the bunker he had started in. Up and over the green again and surprise, surprise it was a case of DeJaVu and he was back in the bunker that he had accidentally forgotten to rake when he was in it only minutes before.

The definition of insanity is doing the same thing over and over again and expecting to get a different result. At least we know Steve isn't insane since after 8 shots hitting in the sand he actually changed tactic and played backwards out of the trap towards the safety of the fairway. A sixty five meter chip back on to the green, followed by a few putts and it was off to the next tee with a quadruple, triple bogie on his score card. For the record Steve's 16 is not the worst score recorded during a Sunday Leave Pass event. In the early days Jamie Brunton carded a 19 after hitting a ball or six in the water.

Earlier on in his round, Steve was also lucky not to be penalized a few shots on the 5th hole (which was one of the few holes he actually parred for the day). Steve's drive rolled off the side of the fairway and finished on the dried up bank of the drought affected water hazard. It was a lucky break for him as the ball technically should have finished in the water but somehow it didn't and REMAKULOUSLY he even had a perfect lie and a nice clear shot along the fairway. Steve belted his three wood back onto the fairway. Chipped his next stroke up onto the green, just missed his birdie attempt but made a very comfortable par.

Unfortunately under *Rule 13-4 of the Rules of Golf*:

Ball in Hazard; Prohibited Actions

Except as provided in the Rules, before making a stroke at a ball that is in a hazard (whether a bunker or a water hazard) or that, having been lifted from a hazard, may be dropped or placed in the hazard, the player must not:

- a. Test the condition of the hazard or any similar hazard;*
- b. Touch the ground in the hazard or water in the water hazard with his hand or a club; or*
- c. Touch or move a loose impediment lying in or touching the hazard.*

Steve was in breach of the rules as laid out by the Royal and Ancient St Andrews Golf Club and he should have technically been awarded at least a two stroke penalty or if not been disqualified from the competition. As is clearly stated in Rule 13-4 a player must not put any part of his/her club on the ground within the boundaries of a marked hazard. Not only did Steve ground his club when addressing his ball but he also dragged his entire bag and buggy the 15 meters down the steep bank and onto the dry water hazard before playing his shot. Although his playing partner SOS was very quick to lodge a formal protest to the Social Club Rules Committee it was later decided that it was better to see Steve suffer the humiliation of his score of 127 being registered as an official score rather than disqualifying him and removing his diabolical performance from the club records by offering him a legitimate escape clause.

Other than a deliberate 3putt when on the 18th hole when he deliberately hit a gimmee tap in putt backwards, away from the hole, despite his less than enjoyable morning at the mercy of the golf course Steve always maintained his composure and kept his temper in check. This was more than we can say for the 2011 and 2012 Angryman award title holder Rick Turcinovic. By the 4th hole Rick had already launched his pitching wedge further than had hit the ball on the short 80 meter downhill par 3 hole and his goat fondling profanities could be heard from 4 fairways across. With 8x three putts and a 4 putt for the day it's pretty obvious Rick still hasn't managed to get his hand on a putter that works so there is a high chance that he will be off to Drummond golf this month to replace the putter that has failed him yet again. History tells us that after a putting display as bad as Sundays there was little chance of the putter remaining intact at the conclusion of the day.

It must have been something to do with the recently cored greens that made the putting conditions tough because Tony Junior didn't fare much better with the flat stick either. Junior had 44 putts and was forced to ask his dad for an advance on his weekly pocket money allowance because he was required to pay a \$4-00 fine for his 5 putt on the third green. Steve Kruger also struggled with the greens. He went one worse than Rick and actually completed the day with 9x 3 putt greens and he also contributed a \$2.00 investment towards the food and beverage account on the golf trip because he had a 4 putt on the 16th green.

Gerard MacIsaac has volunteered to run a free putting clinic next month for anybody wishing to turn up to Centenary Park one hour before the scheduled hit off time. It would be time well spent for a few of the guys who find the process difficult. Gerard has been crowned the putting champion every year since the competition was introduced and he is currently leading the comp again this year averaging just a whisker over 30 putts per round. Gerard had no problems with the bumpy, inconsistent Devils Bend greens. He only took 30 putts to complete the 18 holes and he rolled in 3x very good birdie putts along the way. Unfortunately for Gerard his low handicap makes it very tough to win a raffle ticket in the skins competition. With three birdies he might have expected to claim a few skins this month, but it was not the case and he went home with nothing to show for his good scores.

Ron Parsons converted his birdie into raffle tickets in the skins competition and he was especially chuffed when he discovered that his approach to the Par 3 eighth hole had knocked off his son Greg's NTP marker and Ron was even more elated when he heard that while he has successfully sunk his putt, Greg on the other hand had not only failed to convert the birdie attempt but had actually three putted for Bogey.

Steve O'Sullivan dropped his 7 iron within 5 foot from the flag to win the Nearest to Pin prize on the 13th hole but missed his chance to win the skins when his putt looped around the cup and he only made a par whereas Chris Sfiligoj canned a 8 meter putt for birdie on the same hole.

Trevor Adair has continued to show his prowess with the golf clubs. Trevor played some brilliant shots and made full use of the absenteeism of Mick Harper and smashed his way onto the longest Drive Honours board with a big hit down the 4th fairway.

There were some difficult lies on offer for any ball that rolled off into the rough but Greg Parsons found himself with the most difficult of all lies when he managed to hit his golf ball into a rat hole at the base of a tree. Greg's ball disappeared out of sight and he had to roll his sleeves up and reach blindly into the hole to try to retrieve his ball, while all the time hoping that there wasn't an angry or hungry rodent at home at the time.

This month the spread of scores were very tightly packed. A count back determined first and second position with Ben Nichol only just claiming the 15 points over Ron Parsons who has been the bridesmaid not for the first time in his career. Greg Breasley has continued with his brilliant new found form in 2013 and finished the day in 3rd place. Stuart Cooper celebrated his centenary match in fine style; he finished in 4th place with a round of 90 although he did have a few chokes on the back nine to spoil what could have otherwise been a dream round of golf. Greg Parsons narrowly snatched the 11 points for 5th place by beating Chris Sfiligoj on a count-back. Then three players, Gerard, Trevor and Steve O'Sullivan rounded out the top ten with each player scoring a Nett 76.
