

Devils Bend Golf Course ResultsApril

I have always wanted to send out the blurb as a short sharp email with the comment "Suck Eggs to you all I won and you were all crap" and now would be the perfect time to do so, but I don't think that would be fair to do when there are so many golf adventures from this month that need to be shared with the rest of the world.

If I kept the blurb that short and succinct you would never get to hear about the following incidences.

*Paul Blizzard on the 9th hole hit the wrong ball. He played Brendan's Taylormade golf ball by mistake and what's more funny was that he actually hit it on the green and then when he realized he played the wrong ball, when he hit his own Taylormade he hit it in the bunker and finished the hole with an eight. Paul's tales of woe also included his buggy rolling down the side of a hill and crashing upside down when the wheel fell off and on the fourteenth hole, and he was also penalized a shot when he managed to putt his ball past the hole where his ball then struck another golfers ball which had not been marked on the green. It's little wonder he was last seen driving out of the Devils Bend car park with tears in his eyes singing the U2 song Sunday Bloody Sunday.

*Brendan Seagrave hit three perfect shots down the Par 5 first hole and was putting for an easy 12 foot birdie on the first hole but he actually walked off the green with a seven for 4 putts and opened up the fine jar for business. The fine jar was boosted with all four members of the same group being Stu Coops, Paul Blizzard, Brendan & Colin all chipping in the maximum payout of \$10 for various indiscretions around the golf course.

*Colin Ewart broke the club record for racking up the maximum fine penalty in the shortest time frame. By the time he crossed the bridge to move from the tee box to the fairway on the 2nd hole Colin had been fined for a 4 putt on the first, he had thrown his club, failed to hit his ball past the ladies markers and the had had an air swing. If that wasn't enough Colin actually hit three balls into the water on the 2nd hole and of those only the last shot was struck well enough to hit the ball past the squatters tee.

*Tony Grasso Senior broke a personal club record. He shot his worst ever score with the Sunday Leave Pass social club. His round of 112 was one he would like to forget especially the five putts that he had on the third hole which cost him a fist full of coins to contribute into the fine jar.

*Stu Coops also struggled to use his putter on the 3rd hole although the damage was not quite as significant. Stu hit his tee shot within 2 feet of the pin on the par 3 third hole. Although he won the NTP prize with a shot that looked like it was going be a hole in one he somehow managed to miss the birdie and just drop the next one for par. Brendan Seagrave best described it when he said "Stu you are the only person I know who is capable of slicing a putt.

*Andrew Clarke & Ron Parsons didn't fare any better on the putting stakes. Both guys had more shots with the flat stick than any other club in the bag. Andrew & Ron both had 8x three putt greens from the 18 holes that they played and the end result was the putter cost them any chance of finishing high up on the leaderboard. It's a pity Ron's putter let him down because after the first seven holes he was on track for a blistering score and he was odds on favorite to claim the monthly title before he succumbed to the pressure and choked.

*Since the green were so treacherous and hard to negotiate there were a few guys who took the easy option and left the putter in the bag as they chipped in from off the green. Ben Nichol, Andrew Clarke and Phil Plane all chipped in for none putts.

*Big Mick had an eagle 3 on the par five 10th hole. Mick played the hole perfectly. He smashed his drive straight and long down the middle of the fairway winning him self the longest drive prize and then he hit his

five iron to within 8 feet of the flag setting up an easy uphill putt for the eagle. Luckily Mick was able to drain the putt and claim the eagles nest prize pool because he had 5 three putts on the back nine which cost him the monthly title. Mick also lucked out with his eagle because he didn't even win the skins prize for the hole because his Nett Stableford score was matched by Col Ewart who's scorecard was riddled with the occasional Newell (10+ strokes) made a brilliant birdie for 4 points on the tenth hole.

*Tony MacIsaac also posted his fare collection of Newell's on the Devils Bend layout. Looking at the patterns of improvement on his scorecards, Tony isn't far away from his break out round. If he can eliminate the scores of 10's (Newell's) from his game, hopefully he will finally claim his long awaited maiden season title. It's just a matter of whether it all comes together on the same day for Tony and the big question is whether it will happen before or after the Western Bulldogs win their second premiership.

*Last month's champ turned into this month's chump. Luke Chacksfield struggled with his new handicap. He was docked 10 strokes after his scorching round at Spring Park but unfortunately the longer more difficult Devils Bend track came out to bite and the best score Luke could post was a round of 102, which was 19 shots worse than his winning score of 83.



*There was plenty of speculation and conjecture when the longest drive hole was suddenly changed from the 5th hole to the 10th hole. It is rumored that Stu Coops may have changed the hole because he was waiting until he actually hit the ball onto the fairway drive to put out the longest drive marker.

This could be true since the only fairway he hit with the one wood for the day was actually the 10th hole. Stu is arguing if he had of left the long drive on the 5th hole he would have won the prize without question.

With the winter rounds just around the corner the handicapper continues to wield his poison pen against Stu Cooper. He is the only golfer who month in and month out has his handicap deducted. Stu was the only player in green this month losing another 0.4 shots. Andrew Clarke has played his 5thth round with the social club and pays the price in the form of a changeover to the Slope Handicap system which is reflective of a change on nearly 3 shots off his very generous handicap. Andrew will be playing off 15.8 which is probably a more accurate representation of the standard of golf he plays to.

Colin Ewart has racked up his third game with the social club and has been given a handicap of 29.0 to get him started.

Most of the field was left with their handicaps unchanged although Ben Nichol, Brendan Seagrave, Paul Blizzard and interestingly Big Mick all managed to get varying degrees of a boost to their handicaps coming into the colder months on more difficult golf courses.

The reason for the dramatic change from a player's 4th round to the 5th round is that under the slope system the player's handicap is determined as the best round that they have played relative to par x0.93 of the 5 rounds he has played. Therefor the best round becomes the handicap and the averaging out of scores does not come into effect until about 10 to 12 rounds have been played before the handicap settles itself into a consistent pattern.

SLOPE HANDICAP FORMULA

The following table is used when selecting the best, or lowest, Handicap Differentials. If more than 20 scores have been entered, the 10 best differentials of the 20 most recent scores are used for the calculation.

The USGA does not calculate a handicap until five scores have been recorded.
