Dorset Results

Despite the horrific weather forecast, with gale force winds and hail and thunderstorms predicted, it was comforting to have such ideal conditions to play golf in. Dorset was the last of the easy golf courses on the fixture for a few months, so the pressure was on to put together a decent round. The course was in excellent condition and provided the perfect canvass for a few guys to build a brilliant score. The top 9x players scored par or better

and incredibly a round of 9x shots under his handicap wasn't good enough for Ron to take out the 10 championship points. Alister Bayer was the man of the moment he shot the lowest score for the day, (78 off the stick) which gave him a Nett 60 and first place over Ron in a count-back.

This month it was more about the good shots rather than the bad ones, pars and birdies were the order of the day, the nearest to pin winners hit shots all over the flags. Players were driving the ball onto the green on par 4's and the majority of the approach shots were setting up easy birdie opportunities on a regular basis. Of all of the first class golf being played it is still hard to go past Rick's drive on the Par 4, third hole where he drove his ball over the lake which was about a 210 meter carry, split the middle of the playing group in front and finished 6 feet from the hole. Rick is a person who will never miss a good opportunity to get something for nothing, so the thought of 14x free golf balls on offer was all that was needed for him to roll the putt into the heart of the cup for an eagle 2. Obviously it was well worth the early morning train trip to the golf course, even if he was 20 minutes late.

Nearly as good as Rick's Eagle but certainly receiving a much louder cheer and more rowdy reception was Greg's birdie on the 5th hole. After 4 years and more than 3100 strokes Greg finally won a golf ball. He knocked his 5- Iron onto the 5th Green to claim his first NTP prize ball ever. Hopefully this will ease the tension around the Parsons family dinner table because there has been an awkward silence ever since Ron joined the Social Club and has been a regular prize and ball winner whereas Greg up until now could never do better than finish with a point for turning up. As Ron said **“there is no need to sulk anymore boy you have done well for a change.”**

Alister Bayer played some brilliant golf shots, he had 9x pars and a birdie during his round and like Rick he also knocked a drive onto the green to set himself up with a short for Eagle Putt. The only problem with Al's attempt for an Eagle was that his drive was from the 2nd Tee and it landed only 4x feet from the hole on the 7th green so the Eagle wouldn't have counted had he made the putt anyway.

Speaking of hitting in the wrong direction, Burnsie as only Burnsie can, managed to show his playing partners the diversity in his repertoire of trick shots. On the first hole alone he shanked his drive, topped his ball into a garden bed, duffed a chip and had an air swing on his way to a 13. If that wasn't enough he proved his expertise by hitting a ball into a tree which then ricocheted over his left shoulder and finished 35x meters behind him. He summed up his day while talking to a mate on the mobile phone, when asked how he was going Burnsie said, **“Put it this way I've played 2x holes and I have already had more than 20 shots. How do you think I am going?”** The conversation petered with a bout of laughter and a severe case of hysterics.

The only trick shot Burnsie hasn't mastered yet is the one that was played by newcomer Runar who managed to hit the ball three times with the one follow through. You could write a novel about the exploits of Runar's adventurous day but it wouldn't be fair to give him a too big a roasting on his first hit with the club. It should be said however that he did manage to get himself impaled on a barbed wire fence when he climbed over the fence to receive a wayward shot. It took 5x minutes and 3 blokes to untangle him from the fence. Unfortunately during the rescue process he ripped his designer label trousers and spent the rest of the day with his testicles hanging out of the bottom of his pants. For future reference the golf course dress regulations include a collared shirt, shoes and underpants. It is also advisable that once the ball goes over the fence and into someone's back yard the ball is deemed out of bounds and you can't play it from where it lies.

It was great to see Dale and Phil come out to play despite their footy commitments, the guys hit off at 7am to make sure they still got their round of golf in and were able to make it to the kids football game on time. Dale played a great round he shot a personal best round of 89 and he finished in 6th place. It was interesting that both of them managed to win a NTP hole. There were a few allegations in the car park that they may have doctored the results and placed the NTP shots on the green themselves rather than hit them, so beware boys there may be a few leather wedge nominations forthcoming if the pattern continues.

Chris Sfiligoj scored a couple of nominations of his own. He polled about 7x votes for the angry man award, after he spat the dummy when things weren't going his way. Apparently he threw his golf club, which bounced off a tree and nearly struck one of his playing partners before coming to rest in the murky depths of the large lake in the middle of the golf course. Rumour has it that he has real anger management issues, so be warned when you are playing in his group because you just never know when he'll flip out and go crazy on you. It's worth reminding people that the actual trophy for the ANGRY MAN AWARD was constructed from a golf club that Chris wrapped around his golf buggy last year at Beacon Hills after a wayward shot.

Stu Coops had a round of highs and lows, the highlight of his day was when Warren and Alister took him aside and said, **“you would be as good as us if you ever learnt to control your driving.”** On the very next hole Stu took the advice a little too literally, he proceeded to hook 4xballs into the Dorset driver-training academy nearly knocking the helmet off a learner driver on his motorbike in the process. I'm not sure that that was what the boys were eluding too, but it was funny all the same.

The short and wide-open fairways of Dorset were just what were needed to produce some exceptional golf. In a very tight competition Alister Bayer came in 1st place on a count-back over Ron Parsons, both had Nett 60 however Alister shot 37 on the back nine holes which gave him 24 stableford points whereas Ron hit 22 Stableford points.

When many players finish with the same Nett score the place rankings are determined by the count-back system. The count back system formulates a ranking order by calculating the number of Stableford points each player had on the back 9x holes. In the event that still the players had the same score on the back nine then the Stableford points on individual holes are assessed working back for the 18th hole until a leader is found.

Only one stroke behind Al & Ron was Fitzy who hit a very respectable 81. Warren, Jamie and Dale rounded out the top 6 with Nett scores of 63, 64 and 65 respectively. Warren played his 3rd round with the club so he has qualified for a club handicap, although going on this month's performance he will be getting a severe trim in the not so distant future. If he had worked out the greens and putted with any sort of conviction and his 78 would have been a 71 or 72 without any problems at all.

Although Warren's handicap was not adjusted this month, as this was his 3rd qualifying round, the handicapper did get the opportunity to slash shots off nearly half of the field. A total of 16 strokes were deducted from the top 9 players handicaps. Ron lost 4.5 shots off his handicap and Fitzy, Jamie and Alister received some pretty serious trims also.

Reminder

The ball must be clearly on the CUT surface of the green or fairway to win NTP or longest drive. If it is not on the fairway it doesn't count.

Each player won 1 ball each.

The nearest to pin shots are getting closer and closer, there were some incredible approaches to par 3's. When we first started we could have 20 players and no body would hit the green and the prize balls would be jackpotted into the Eagles nest. Nowadays the ball needs to be inside 3 meters to have a chance of winning the NTP prize. We must be getting better after all.

Although it did take 14x attempts before anybody qualified to put their name on the longest drive marker. At one stage it looked as the last group were only going to need to use the putter to hit the ball straight enough to post a winning longest drive.
