

Dorset Golf Course ResultsMarch

It's incredible to think that in January a score of Nett 74 and you would have been crowned the monthly champion and then suddenly in March the same score sees you outside the top 15. Congratulations to all of our golfers who put on a fine display of golfing prowess on Sunday at Dorset. Although we didn't score anywhere near the same amount of birdies as last month's round at Warburton (Brendan Waters didn't turn up), consistency to was the key to the good scores and there was very few of the soul destroying major blow out holes that is often the case on the majority of our score cards.

Congratulations to all of the guys who had monumental rounds this month and broke the illusive 100 barrier. Greg Breasley, David Burns, Ron Parsons, John Murphy and even (believe it or not) Newell Richards shot sub 100 scores, while Tony MacIsaac, Geoff Cooper, Rick Turcinovic and even the beer wench Colin Ewart all came very close to breaking the century too.

Round of the day has to go to Adam Cooper who off a 26 handicap managed to shoot a career best round of 82 off the stick including a blistering score of 36 on the front nine. Adam has been in retirement for several years with his golfing opportunities succumbing to the challenges and responsibilities imposed by family life. His return to the game in 2015 has certainly been dramatic as his 2 rounds have been so far ahead of his career average scores. Adam averages 104.8 strokes per round according to his career stats so when he shot 95 at Warburton there were a few questions raised. Needless to say a full inquiry has been



*As part of the putting competition this year, as a brainchild suggestion from Paul Blizzard we have introduced the Three Putt Monkey game. At the start of each round every group will be given a flouro yellow 3 Putt Monkey vest and whenever a person has a **3 putt or worse** that player must put on the 3 Putt Monkey Vest and wear it until another player in the group has a **3 putt or more**. The player wearing the 3 putt Monkey vest at the completion of the 18th hole will be required to chip in an additional \$2 into the fine jar. If multiple players have a **3 putt or worse** the player who was last into the hole wins the vest irrespective of whether the other player before them had a 3 putt, four putt or even a seven putt. The furthest player from the hole should always putt first on the green and that player is deemed as in control and therefore has the option of marking their ball if they miss the putt or putting out. If they chose to putt out and then the following person three putts then the last person to putt out gets the vest.

It was a day of close calls, Greg Breasley came close to an eagle, Nigel Stone nearly chipped in for an eagle 2 and big Mick and SOS came close to beating Tony Grasso in the longest drive competition but their balls were just off the fairway and in the rough.

Brendan MacIsaac came close to killing his brother Tony with his second shot of the day. Brendan hit a shank which veered out towards Tony who had to lean back to evade it like it was a Brett Lee bouncer. Rick Turcinovic had a close call when he smashed a ball which just missed new comer Leigh MacIsaac who was forced to back up against a tree to avoid being struck by the wayward ball.

Never one to be out done, Burnsie was able to keep his title as the most deadly golfer when he also had a near miss. Unlike the other guys Burnsie nearly killed a total stranger who was innocently standing on the 11th tee having a few practice swings while Burnsie played up the 17th hole. 



What people didn't know was that Tony also came armed with a secret weapon of his own. Tony recently invested in some B- grade Srixon Distance golf balls which have proved at 0.77 cents per ball, they are a much better investment than the \$500 Grumpy spent on his driver.
