

## Dorset Golf Course Results March

What a difference a month makes. This time in last month, Stuart Cooper and Tony MacIssac were feeling a million dollars after posting some good scores at Warburton in February. 28 days later they would be feeling like slitting their wrists after failing to perform on the not so difficult Dorset layout.

The Dorset course averaged a Nett score of 72 per player. Even Newell Richards was able to post a career best round of 129 Nett 92. Obviously the 5 trips to the Morack Driving range, golf lessons and practice round on Saturday paid off for Highway man who showed some glimpses of brilliance (well atleast a sign of hope anyway.) It was a breakout month for Newell on many levels. Apart from a P.B. on the scorecard, he also managed to keep his fine jar contribution to only \$2-00 compared to the standard \$10 donation and more importantly he got the opportunity to hit off first in his group after winning the honour on both the 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> holes.

Once Highway gets his putts down under 40 per round and he eliminates the token 10 from his scorecard he may be dangerous. As Steve O'Sullivan said to him. "if you have gone from scores of 146 to 129 you are guaranteed to win a trophy for the most improved if nothing else.

Andrew Clarke is proving to be a sleeper who we all need to keep our eyes on. Andrew posted his 3<sup>rd</sup> score with the social club and has been allocated a very generous handicap of 18. Andrew never missed the

fairway for the entire day and had it not been a disastrous day with the pitching wedge and putter his 87 gross could easily have been an 80 or even 79 off the stick. Andrew will reveal all of his cards over the next couple of months and he may prove himself to be a potential candidate for an end of year trophy. If not the seasons championship trophy, Andrew may be a walk up start for the Angry Man award prize. Andrew can make Rick Turcinovic commentary of the golf sound like a papal sermon.

One player who was looking up to the heavens for celestial intervention was Mark Fitzpatrick who carded a very disappointing Nett 81. Fitzzy has become the occasional golfer who is lucky to get 2 rounds in a year. It showed too, his scorecard included a 6 putt green and an air-swing on the first hole and also had a Newell on the 15<sup>th</sup> hole. For those who are wondering what by order of definition a Newell is. "It is any hole where you score 10 or more shots."

The highlight for the day for Fitzzy was his 2 putt birdie on the Par 4 third hole. Having watched Trevor Adair smash his drive straight over the long water carry and finish just 20 meters short of the green, Fitzzy took on the same challenge and used the grip it and rip it approach to smash his drive out and over the lake. Marks ball didn't fly as high as Trevor's ball and didn't clear the trees at the far end of the water but his ball managed to steer between them. Fitzzy's ball then bounced hard on the front edge of the green and rolled up onto the putting service narrowly missing the hole in one albatross before rolling between the legs of an unsuspecting Slinky who was preparing to make his putt. Although he didn't ever give the eagle putt any chance of going in the result was an easy Birdie and a small glimmer of sunshine on what was otherwise a very difficult day.

Congratulations to the smurf, Stevie Powne who managed to add his name onto the longest drive hall of fame. It would seem in hindsight that choosing the first hole for the longest drive competition hole was a challenging prospect for most of us. At one stage it was looking as though an air swing would win the title since after 4x groups (16 players) no one had actually managed to keep their ball on the fairway. John Mea was the first player to post a decent drive and was unlucky that the smurf managed to get a drive past him with the very last shot of the day. Steve was so proud of his accomplishment. After a can and a half of beer he was only too happy to tell anyone within earshot about his long drive status and was walking around with his chest out, shoulders back and prancing around like he was 5 & a half foot tall (that's twice his normal height) and comparing himself to Big Mick as a power hitter.

We are still awaiting the arrival of the new Sunday Leave Pass golf balls, when they arrive we will offer them up for sale to anyone interested in buying a dozen or 2. We have ordered 96 dozen balls so there will be no shortage of Woodtech Sunday Leave Pass balls whizzing around the fairways in the next 18 months or so.

Don't forget it is always a good idea to make an identifying marker on your ball so you can distinguish it from all of the other golfers out on the course. Despite the hefty price tag of \$6 per ball we sold out of the "Do Not Steal Trevor" golf balls in record time. Incredibly the promotion was a great success and for the first time in 15 months every golfer was able to return back to the car park without a complaint that someone had stolen their golf ball. We will be offering another run of the "Do Not Steal Trevor" golf balls next month since they were such a high demand product even at \$6 per ball.



We will be looking to put in an order for new Sunday Leave Pass club shirts shortly. We have had an influx of new recruits joining the club over the last 6 months and we need to increase our stock levels to accommodate the newcomers. If anyone wants to buy a new shirt to replace a worn out uniform or if your

expanding girth means that you no longer fit into your old one then if you could please let me know including your size so that I can get an order in for you.

For those who aren't aware, the club shirt has a reward system built into it. For every round you play you are given a raffle ticket which goes towards the end of year raffle, plus if you wear the club uniform shirt you are then given another raffle ticket.



Therefore the \$30 investment to be part of the smurf family may just be the difference between winning a new set of golf clubs or a golf bag or even if you are lucky enough a slab of Bourbon cans.

Congratulations to Phil Plane who played a very impressive round at Dorset. Phil's score of 92 gross was his career best round and is a staggering 20 shots better than his career average.

Given his result was 60 strokes better than his worst score its little wonder that there has been a stewards inquiry and multiple protest to check whether he actual played all 18 holes. With Nett 63 Phil was the winner of the March title and earned 15 points towards the championship leader board tally.

With 26 players in the field a very good score was required to place in the top 15 and pick up the big points. Incredibly it required a score of 71 to be in the running and a Nett 69 or better to place inside the top 10.

Slinky made his long awaited return after several months out to pasture. Absence from the game has done little to impinge on his golf swing and he finished in second place with Nett 64. Tony Grasso senior posted one of the lowest scores for the day and was rewarded with 13 championship points for his 82 off the stick from a handicap of 17.

Newbie Luke Chacksfield qualified with a handicap this month having played 3 rounds with the social club. Luke was inspired by his playing partners Andrew and Big Mick and he managed to break his handicap of 26 to finish with a score of Nett 67.

Peter Hutson, Greg Parsons, Trevor Adair, Tony Junior and Andrew Clarke all posted some impressive scorecards and featured inside the top 10 rankings at Dorset. It was a commendable effort for Tony Junior to recover to finish so high on the leader board especially since his tee shot in the first hole was dribbled straight into the garden beds and finished in an unplayable position. Father Tony was quick to say "oh hell here we go again, he is gonna be angry this afternoon and I will hear about it as he sulks and whines all the way home in the car."

With all of the good scores taking precedence it was a bad result for the callaway handicappers who for the last few months have always finished well into the top 10. Unfortunately a score of 74 to 76 didn't cut it at Dorset and therefore the usual cruise into a good place finish was non-existent.

When a player first joins the club they are allocated a handicap using the Callaway scoring system. This is a formula which calculates the player's handicap based on the sum total of their worst (?) holes from the gross score dependent on the gross score achieved. ie)  $113 = \text{sum scores of worst } 4.5 \text{ holes. } 9+9+8+8+4 = 38$




So start aiming at the hole we want to give it away this year there was a few close calls over the years but we are still yet to achieve the perfect shot despite more than 12000 attempts since 2004.

(In 1999, *Golf Digest* reported, "One insurance company puts a PGA Tour pro's chances at 1 in 3,756 and an amateur's at 1 in 12,750.")  
The *Golf Digest* study even breaking the odds down by quality of play:

- Professional Tour player making an ace: 3,000 to 1
- Low-handicapper making an ace: 5,000 to 1
- Average player making an ace: 12,000 to 1

Based on this information we are due any time so make sure you turn up to play as it may just be you that claims the ultimate prize.
