

Dorset Golf Course Results September

The battle at the top of the leader board is hotting up. With only two rounds left for the season it is become a real tug of war between Mick Harper and Tony Grasso Senior. It's a matter of anything you can do I can do better. This month the guys were paired up head to head against each other and it appears Tony senior got the better of the Big Fella. Last month Mick won the monthly crown and had an eagle, but Tony finished in 2nd place. This month Tony finished 2 shots in front of Mick with Nett 68 which included two successive birdies on the third and fourth holes and to prove he is an equal match he had an eagle on the 10th hole. More importantly though was the fact the Tony Senior was able to peg back the points differential by 2 points. In fact there is now only two points between first and second place. With Tony now a definite attendee on the Golf trip, things are certain to go down to the wire.

Tony had a blistering front nine and was chipping the ball in from everywhere and anywhere. His best chip however he saved for the back nine when he holed a 30 meter shot on the short Par 4, tenth hole to make an eagle 2. Incredibly after a 2 year eagle drought we have had a pair of them in less than a month. Sadly for Tony the Eagles Nest had been emptied so the prize pool was only 10 balls but at least Tony Junior knows what he will be getting as a present for his next birthday. Golf Balls.

The Dorset golf course has now conceded a total of 3 eagles to the Sunday Leave Pass social club. Steve Powne scored an eagle on the 3rd hole in August 2008. Cam Wilson scored an eagle in October 2009 on the Par 5 thirteenth and now with Tony raiding the eagles nest once again this month, our accounts department have requested we rig the voting nominations for the next few seasons to make sure Dorset doesn't get a Guernsey to allow the budget a little time to recover.

Tony nearly had to share the Eagles Nest prize pool, because Mick Harper had an eagle chance on the Par 5, 13th hole. Mick was on the green for 2, but failed in his attempts to make Eagle, Birdie and Par and after 4 putts and a \$2 fine he had to settle for a bogie. Stu Coops hit a chip into the 18th green which also lipped out for eagle however he was able to convert the opportunity into an easy birdie.

The Dorset golf course must offer a better opportunity to score well since some of the guys improved on their scores from last month by anything from 15 to 40 shots. The Dorset layout gave up 27x more pars and 7x more birdies compared to Beacon Hills so there will be little surprise if it is a highly favoured golf course for seasons to come.

Stu Coops was one player who thrived in the shorter and more open fairways. Having shot 118 last month he was out to improve his game and he even left the driver in the golf bag in order to keep the ball in play. Supported by a brilliant day with the putter (29 putts) Stu hit 80 off the stick and won his second monthly title for the season with Nett 61. Stu's only error for the day was playing in the last group and not leaving the keys to the bar with anybody in

the groups playing in front of him. The wrath from the dehydrated masses was enough to put a sour note on what would have otherwise been a perfect day.

One player who things didn't quite go as well for was the Supercoach. His day was about as dirty as his new baby Abby's nappies. On the second hole he was chastised by the groundskeeper for nearly decapitating an Asian lady in the group in front. Fil's argument, that she wouldn't have understood if he called "Fore!" anyway and also when he said that her eyes were not wide enough open to see where the ball had coming from, was not well received and nearly got him kicked off the course.

Perhaps Fil would have been better being escorted off the course on the second hole, because things didn't get any better for him after that. He hit 5 balls in a row in the lake on the 3rd hole. (Unbelievably he found the first one on the other side of the pond and miraculously still scored a par.) He got stuck in the sand on the 11th hole and took 4 shots to get his ball out of the bunker before finishing the Par 3 with an 8. On the 12th hole the Supercoach was heard calling Mick Harper to ask if he could borrow some golf balls, after topping 4 balls in a row straight into the middle of the creek in front of the tee. (No miraculous reappearance of the ball on the other side and he posted a very sizable score of 11.) By the time Fil had splashed another drive into the dam on the 16th hole, his playing partners were no longer calling him Supercoach or Fil because they had sprinkled a handful of water over his head and baptised him with his new identity "Aquaman."

Even Big Mick on occasions had trouble getting off the tee. With the longest Drive competition being held on the first tee it was expected that Mick Harper would be a convincing winner. That wasn't the case as Big Ball Breasley crushed his first drive 267 meters straight down the middle of the fairway. Despite making his best and most valiant effort Mick was not able to get his drive past Big Ball Breasley. Micks drive fell 202 meters short of the mark in fact it wasn't even long enough to get onto the start of the fairway.

If there was any consolation for Mick, it was that, his was not the shortest shot for the day. The Big Fella's 65 meter drive was exactly 65 meters further than Steve Pownes' 2x air swings in the rough on the fourth hole.

Greg Parsons might as well of had an air swing when he missed a gimme 3 inch putt for par. To make matters worse apparently he threw his putter to the ground in agro but missed that target too, evidently he planted the PowerBuilt flat stick straight on to the top his foot and he finished the last 6 holes with a near broken foot and quite a significant limp.

It was nice to see a good representation this month with a total of 19 players taking to the fairways. With Dorset being probably the easiest course we have played in season 2012 there were some very good scores. Stu Coops won the September title with a very impressive Nett 61. Slinky came a close 2nd place with a Nett 64, 88 off the stick and his best round with the Sunday Leave Pass Social Club. Interestingly Slinky ran second to Stu Last month also but that was in the battle for Beer Wench position. Ron Parsons has continued with his run of good form. He finished in 3rd place for the second month in succession. Ron beat Tony Grasso JNR, Tony Grasso Senior and Steve O'Sullivan on a countback. All four guys scored Nett 68 however Slinky got the better of them with a very strong golf performance after the turn. Mick Harper keeps on getting better each month. Despite the handicapper docking a shot off him this month he still managed to shoot a Par round and naturally the lowest gross score for the day.
