

Unfortunately for Brad there were only 8 balls in the prize pool because Todd Neilson raided the eaglesnest late last year however he can be proud to say he goes down in the record books none the less.



Brad was very discreet about his achievement and only mentioned it in a passing comment. Evidently it was a very impressive Eagle. He hit his driver straight down the middle of the fairway only 3 meters behind the big hitting 2 handicapper Brendan Waters. Brad then caressed his three wood to within 10 feet and rolled in his only decent putt for the day for a simple eagle three.

Brad had yet another solid round. He hit 85 off the stick, and with a Callaway handicap of 11he finished inside the top 10. Brad does mean business this year and has already locked up a bed for the golf trip and is already asking questions about what he needs to do to win the Champion of Champions jacket off Todd Neilson. He also asked how it could have been humanly possible for Andrew Clarke with a 22nd place Nett 79 finish to have actually won the Season Championship trophy last year.

Congratulations to Greg Breasley who will not be wearing his usual jacket next month. Greg has cast off the beer Wench hoodoo. After three months dressed in Pink, Big Ball Breasley has made a dramatic improvement in his golf over the summer break. He hit 105 Nett 73 and finished in ninth place an amazing 28 strokes better off than his last round at Albury.

The pink vest will be handed from one Greg to the other, as it was Greg Parsons who played the worst golf at Gardiners Run. Sir Choc top went soft, serving up 24 shots on the 17th and 18th holes. Greg's golfing ability melted in the sun like his beloved ice-creams and his back to back Newells (score of 10 or more) comprised of a 14 on the Par 5 seventeenth hole and a ten on the 18th hole to spoil what was otherwise an OK round. Greg finished the day at Nett 93, 121 off the stick which was his worst round since 2008 at Werribee Park where he hacked out a score of 126.

The bunkers proved difficult for many of our golfers. The morning dew and heavy sand made the splash shot difficult. Big Mick dumped at least six or seven strokes by either leaving his bunker shot in the sand or blading it across and through the back to the other side of the green.

Grumpy also added plenty of hits to his scorecard when he got stuck in the sand on both the 1st and 12th holes and what's worse he even needed a tow rope to help him out when he accidentally drove his remote control golf buggy into the sand not just once but twice in 6 holes.

Grumpy crashed his buggy into the hazard on the third hole when he was faced with the dilemma of either trying to stop the buggy from driving over the edge of the bunker or putting down his beer can. As to be expected he never spilled a drop but the cart and his golf bag needed to be tipped upside down to remove all of the sand and debris from being stuck bogged up to the axels in the trap.

After Grumpy crashed his cart again into the sand trap on the ninth hole Peter Hutson decided that Brendan might actually need to have an alcohol interlock device installed onto his motorized cart to ensure that he is not over 0.05 before he tries to drive it again. Grumpy also got himself in a bit of a pickle when he sprayed his tee shot into the par 3 third hole into the lake. His ball was not in the water but plugged in the bank semi-submerged. The challenge was whether he should take the penalty or take his shoes and socks off and try to muscle out of the hazard and play the ball from where it lay. In the end he opted for the safety of a penalty drop and still managed to get away with a double bogie. Stu Coops had driving issues of his own, uncharacteristically it was not on the golf course this time, he was pretty much on target and hit almost every fairway with the 1 wood for the entire day however this was counteracted by the fact that he missed the turn off for Gardiners Run and ended up driving nearly 6 km further up the road at Yerring Meadows.

Stu also required a bit of maintenance on his poor old golf buggy which after 147 Sunday Leave Pass rounds is looking just about as tired and haggard as his golf hat. It took more than 6 golfers who didn't have any tools in their cars to arrive before finally Rick Turcinovic proved his manhood and was able to produce a shifter from the boot to assist with the running repairs on Stu's buggy. Although the repairs held fast and the cart stayed intact, the wheels fell off on Stu's game and he dumped four shots to make quadruple bogey on the 14th hole after hitting a drive just 60 meters short of the green.

The SLP 2013, 2014, 2015 and 2016 bridesmaid came out onto the course with high expectations. Big Mick had managed to shoot one under par (71) during his practice round out Eastwood Golf Course on Friday afternoon so big things were expected of him and there were murmurings that he might actually manage to get to the top of the leaderboard for a change. Mick added his first two birdies into his Eclectic stroke tally however his score of 85 was a little disappointing after so much hype about his form leading into the competition.

It was Gerard MacIsaac who hit the low score for the day. Also coming off a 71 off the stick on Saturday at Glen Waverley there were very high expectations for him to tear apart the magnificent and forgiving Gardiners Run course. Although it wasn't quite a 71, Gerard's score of 81 was the best round for the day and he was able to win the longest drive and card 10 pars and a birdie during his walk around the golf course.

The Supercoach was never going to win the longest drive hole. As has become customary with his opening drive his first stroke fell half way between the tee box and the ladies markers, so once again he was fined \$5 for not hitting past the red tees. The Supercoach put a call out late last year for a review and priority pick for a change to his handicap. His request was knocked back and despite him hitting the third worst round for the day we have kept a freeze on his handicap as the longer he is in a miserable space the happier the world and everybody else will be.

The greens at Gardiners Run must have been perfectly suited for our golf clubs style of game. The putting average for the field was well below par. We averaged only 33 putts per player and that is nearly 3 shots above the club average. This included some exception rounds with the flat stick from both Jamie Brunton and Tom Kellythorn (28 putts) and Will Fernie also had a great day with just 29 putts. Tom, Jamie, Newell and Mutes all improved their putting scores by hitting a chip in (0 Putt) green. With so many good putting scores it was unfortunate for Mick the new Fine-master as the fine jar was kept a little bit lighter this month as Wayne James was the only person to walk off the golf course with a 4 putt green.

For the benefit of the newcomers or the uneducated we thought it would be a good opportunity to go through the player rankings and point scoring system again.

Sunday Leave Pass competitions are run using Stroke so you need to count every shot that you play and you need to finish every hole. Each players Nett total score is then calculated by deducting the players handicap from the Gross score. If a player doesn't have an official Sunday Leave Pass handicap then a temporary played to handicap is allocated on the day using the Callaway handicapping system.

Once the players Nett score is calculated they are ranked from lowest score to highest score. (BeerWench) Where more than one player has the same Nett Score (such as Tom Kellythorn and Tony MacIsaac) then the place allocations are decided based on a countback system.

The count back system is formulated as the following.

*Total number of stableford points scored on the back nine holes.

*In the event that both players have the same stableford score on the back nine it then reverts to the number of stableford points scored on the eighteenth hole. If this is the same then it goes to the 17th hole, sixteenth hole, fifteenth hole until a players has a better hole and therefore has a higher stableford score than the other.

Take the place rankings for 2 nd and 3 rd place this month for example.
In this instance both Tony and Tom had Nett 71 after their handicaps was deducted from the Gross Score.
The countback then identifies that both boys had 21 stableford points on the back nine.
As a result we then go back to the 18 th hole where Tom had a par for 4 points whereas poor Tony only had a bogie for 3 points.
Therefore Tom wins the countback and Tony is relegated back to third place.
In example 2 Dale Wins because he had19 points on the back nine compared to Peter who only had 17.

PLEASE NOTE THAT THE COUNT BACK IS ON HOLES 10-18 irrespective of whether it is a two tee start, a normal hit off from the first hole or as in the case of Gardiners Run we hit off the 10th hole first. It is always the 10th to 18th holes and if one person starts on the 10th hole and the other hits off the first hole then it still remains exactly the same formula.

Once all of the players are ranked then the Seasons Championship points are allocated according to the position in the field.

The player in 1st place gets 15 points, 2nd place 14 points, 3rd place 13 points, etc etc. Any player who completes the round however finishes ranked outside the top 14 and is placed between 15th spot to BeerWench then they are all allocated 1 championship point for attending.

The player with the most points at the end of the year is crowned the Points champion irrespective of how many rounds a person has played. If one person plays 13 rounds for the year and the person in 2nd place has only played 10 rounds but is close to the same score then that is bad luck to the person in 2nd place. All players are invited to play the entire fixture. We reward participation rather than perfection and performance so if you play more often you will end up with more points..

The golf course conceded some pretty good rounds and as a consequence the handicapper took the liberty to shave the handicaps of a large proportion of the field. The biggest movers in were Ian Mutimar who was stripped from 24.1 to 17.6 and justifiably so. He was given the nick name 24 out on the course because he was playing off a 24 handicap but hitting the ball like a 12 handicapper. Tom Kellythorn lost a further 1.7 strokes for next month as he continues to dominate the stableford competition. The only thing holding Tom back from overtaking his Canadian sparring partner is the fact that he is having the occasional blemish or two and the Newell's (score of 10 or more) hold him back from being on the top of the leaderboard.

The masses were disappointed to see Greg Breasley released from Beer Wenching duties, so in an attempt to get him back into the pink dress next month the handicapper has made a two pronged attack, Greg has had his handicap dropped by 0.7 strokes as a reward for his round of 105 and the rest of the guys at the bottom end of the field except for the supercoach were all awarded a bit of extra fat to help them for the Warburton round.

Cliff Rowe will be pleased to see that his handicap continues to go outwards. Given that he started just a few months playing as the low marker of the group with a handicap of 7 and he has now gone out 5 strokes to a handicap of 12 he is quickly shortening as the odds on favorite for least improved player in 2017.

For the benefit of all concerned and especially the new comers and the winging Scottish people we have included a detailed explanation as to how the handicapping system works. What is important to note is that during the early rounds your handicap is dictated by your best scores. If a player has a very low out of the ordinary round, this will become the anchor point and will hold your handicap down very low.

Ian Mutes for example has just carded his best round and the impact on his handicap was 7 strokes. Will Fernie has two rounds in the low eighties and the rest of his golf has been in the 90's his anchor score however is the lowest rounds and therefore his handicap is down at 12 rather than at 19 where he would like it to be. The more rounds you play the more the scores average out until you have completed 18 rounds or more where you handicap becomes a more accurate reflection of your playing ability. At this point your handicap becomes the average of the sum of your best 8 scores from the most recent 20 rounds multiplied by 0.93 which becomes your handicap.



As a new member of the Social Club the Callaway Handicapping system is used to give the player a daily played to handicap for the first couple of rounds. Once they have played 3 rounds they are given a temporary club handicap using the original AGU handicapping system. After 5 rounds they are then switched across to the current slope handicapping system.

This system is used for determining fair allowances for social golf events that attract novices or occasional golfers. A player's Callaway handicap is determined after each round by deducting from his/her 18 hole gross score the scores of the worst individual holes during the first 16 holes of the round

In the computation of handicaps under this system:

- -No hole may be scored at more than twice its par,
- half strokes count as a whole.

- the 17th and 18th holes are never deducted,

For example if a player scores 99 on the day their handicap would be calculated as the sum total of their (3 worst holes) +1

If a player scores 82 on the day their handicap would be calculated as the sum total of their (worst + ½ the 2nd worst hole) -1

If a player scores 120 on the day their handicap would be calculated as the sum total of their (five worst holes) +2

After 3 rounds they will be allocated a temporary handicap using the old AGU handicapping formula and then after 5 rounds they are elevated onto the official Slope handicapping system which was use thereafter for all club competitions.

For those people interested in the mechanics of the handicapping system it can be best explained as the following.

How to calculate a GA Handicap

To calculate a player's GA Handicap:

- you must firstly identify the player's most recent 20 scores,
- you then determine the 'Played To' value for each of these scores,
- you average the best 8 'Played To' values,
- and finally you multiply this average by 0.93. The resultant figure (to one decimal place) is the player's **GA Handicap.**
- * If a player's handicap record contains a lesser number than 20 scores, the number of scores used to calculate the player's handicap is as listed in the table below.

- * There is no requirement for a player's most recent 20 scores to have been returned within a specific timeframe. For example, the most recent 20 scores may span a period of three years or they may span a period of three months.
- * Once a player's handicap record contains 20 scores, the next score they return will result in the oldest of the existing 20 scores being removed (to be replaced by the new score).

Full Technical Procedure for Calculating a GA Handicap

STEP 1 – Use the table below to determine the number of scores to be included in the GA Handicap calculation:

Number of Scores in Player's Handicap Scores to be Used in the Calculation Record

5 to 6	Best/Lowest 1
7 or 8	Best/Lowest 2
9 or 10	Best/Lowest 3
11 or 12	Best/Lowest 4
13 or 14	Best/Lowest 5

17 or 18	Best/Lowest 7
19 or 20	Best/Lowest 8

Note: When the handicap record contains more than 20 scores, the GA Handicap calculation uses the best 8 of the player's most recent 20 scores.

If he had actually played 11 rounds and the scores listed above were his best 6 scores then his handicap would be 16.75
