SUNDAY LEAVE PASS 2019


Gardiners Run has done it again. The new/old Chirnside Park golf course put on what can only be described as "perfect conditions for a golfer to thrive". The weather was spectacular on Sunday, the course was in pristine condition, fairways were great, greens were excellent and the ground-staff had even put the tee markers way forward and the flags in easy positions just to ensure we all enjoyed our experience on the day.

123 pars at an average of 4.25 pars, per players must be some sort of all-time record and to cap it all off, the course also gave up 16 birdies which amounts to one for every second golfer running around the paddocks.

Although it didn't go off on Sunday there was a stack of eagle opportunities created. Incredibly, there was a record number of eagle putt opportunities for the day. There was a total of 8 eagle chances. Big Mick alone had 3 opportunities to take home the Eagles nest prize jackpot. Mick showed some power hitting and he actually landed on 3 of the four par 5'greens for two shots. Stu Coops came pretty close to holing his 20meter putt to make a three on the par 5, 17th hole. Tom Kellythorn, Cliff Rowe, Andrew Clarke and Wayne James all were good enough to drive the green on the short downhill par 4, 5th hole, however not even Cliffy's little 6' footer managed to drop in for an eagle.

Many others came close to chipping in or holing a long iron for eagle. The beauty of making an eagle is sometimes it is not making all perfect shots but it could be just one awesomely unbelievably great one. Take this video of Jerry Kelly from the recent Mitsubishi Electric Championship in Hualalai for example.

Wayne finished the day as the January club house leader with his first 69 for season 2019. Wayne could soon become the first player to be in contention to go back to back as the season trophy holder especially with the form he is carrying in to the New Year. It is incredible to think that over 15 years no player has ever been able to win two seasons in a row. Wayne is certainly hoping to be the first to do it.

The stage has been set for Wayne to win back to back titles and what's more exciting is that Big Mick is already maneuvering himself into a position to jump into the brides-maids dress again this year. Mick shot the lowest score for the round at Gardiners Run. He was very impressive, opening up his seasons account with 79 off the stick including 7 pars and 3 birdies. All three birdies were achieved by having two putts on a par 5 green, so there is still plenty of room for improvement.

Congratulations also to Steve Powne who took on the Gardiners Run course for the first time ever, it is fair to say Steve was suitably impressed especially since he finished the day having only hit the ball 94 times and found himself in 3<sup>rd</sup> place on the points distribution list.

Steve O'Sullivan has a natural affinity for the Gardiners Run golf course, he played exceptionally well there last week in his practice round and he was even better on Sunday when the ground-staff had made the pin positions and tee marker set up even

easier. Steve shot 81 off the stick, finishing with a disastrous double bogey on the last hole, which ultimately cost him the top position and a sub 80 round of golf.

SOS was not the only player to have a blow out at the end of the round. Adam Cooper was tracking nicely until the 2<sup>nd</sup> last hole where he blew out big time. Adam had not missed a drive for 17 holes, but the prospect of winning the longest drive crown and the possibility of also finishing high on the points leaderboard was all too much of an allure to him. You could say Adam Lost his soul (or was it his sole). A snap hook across on to the 9<sup>th</sup> fairway, an air-swing in front of possibly the worst two people you can imagine having an air-swing in front of. (The supercoach and the new fine master) To cap it off Adam had a three putt and recorded what turned out to be one of the 9 Newell's scored for the day.



Although it wasn't a happy hunting ground for everyone, certainly the longest drive hole delivered some glory and good will for some players.



Hi Stu, thought if you needed a photo this was one of the better holes I played, out driving Gerard on the longest drive hole and scoring less than Leigh on the same hole. Cheers Brendan MacIsaac

Brendan MacIsaac reckons it is the best hole he has ever played, and why wouldn't it be. Brendan out drove his brother Gerard which is an achievement in itself. Gerard is reputed as one of the power hitters in Sunday Leave Pass circles, especially since he is third ranked in the club honor-board. He has previously won the longest drive title 18 times.

If beating Gerard wasn't enough, the 8<sup>th</sup> hole got even better for Brendan when he also recorded a lower score on the hole than his son Leigh who scored a seven on the hole compared to Brendan's six. What makes this all of the more impressive was that Leigh had played the perfect drive to win the longest drive competition and was only 180 meters from the green after driving his tee shot 265meters.

We are not sure where Leigh went wrong however if I was a gambling man, I would say that perhaps he hit his next shot into the bunker and then it all went bad from there. From all the tales of demise that were communicated around the esky after the round it seemed the common theme was a player who got into the bunker and then could not get out again. In golfing terms this is called a "Saddam Hussain". (Everything was going OK until you got in the bunker)

There was no shortage of bunkers around the Gardiners Run golf course and on occasion they bared their teeth and showed why many golfers call them sand traps. Ricks greatest challenge for the Angryman award remains with the defending champion, Mark Sfiligoj. Although Rick desperately wants his trophy back, he still may need to step up his game. The Supercoach threw a massive temper tantrum after making a three putt and delayed proceedings for 10 minutes while the entire group searched the bushes for his putter after it spontaneously ejected out of his hands.

It seems the new Driver the supercoach invested into was not the solution to his golfing woes, let us just hope for the Drivers sake that it doesn't come to the same fate as his putter or his cricket bat for that matter. Congratulations to Wayne James, 84 off the stick was an impressive start to the new season and validated your status of club championship. 15 points is a good way to start the season to defend the title. Steve O'Sullivan choked on the last hole, he was in prime position to break 80 however a skinnied bunker shot and a couple of wayward chips put an end to this on the last hole of the day. Steve Powne attributed his good form to being matched with high quality golfers, Steve claims that being paired up with, SOS, Shanno and Douggo brought him up to playing at their level. The proof was in the score card and Steve did record his lowest round in a very long time.

Mick Harper was the best of the best and he continues to push his handicap further into single figures. Gerard and Shane Cumming also finished inside the top 10 indicating that the Gardiners Run golf course is best suited to the low handicap markers.

For those players not familiar with the scoring process, listed below is the format we use in Sunday Leave Pass competitions.

Once all of the players are ranked then the Seasons Championship points are allocated according to the position in the field.

The player in 1<sup>st</sup> place gets 15 points, 2<sup>nd</sup> place 14 points, 3<sup>rd</sup> place 13 points, etc etc. Any player who completes the round however finishes ranked outside the top 14 and is placed between 15<sup>th</sup> spot to BeerWench then they are all allocated 1 championship point for attending.

For the benefit of the newcomers or the uneducated we thought it would be a good opportunity to go through the player rankings and point scoring system again.

Sunday Leave Pass competitions are run using Stroke so you need to count every shot that you play and you need to finish every hole. Each players Nett total score is then calculated by deducting the players handicap from the Gross score. If a player doesn't have an official Sunday Leave Pass handicap then a temporary played to handicap is allocated on the day using the Callaway handicapping system.

Once the players Nett score is calculated they are ranked from lowest score to highest score. (BeerWench) Where more than one player has the same Nett Score (such as in the example below from Gardiners Run last year then the place allocations are decided based on a countback system.

The count back system is formulated as the following.

\*Total number of stableford points scored on the back nine holes.

\*In the event that both players have the same stableford score on the back nine it then reverts to the number of stableford points scored on the eighteenth hole. If this is the same then it goes to the 17<sup>th</sup> hole, sixteenth hole, fifteenth hole until a player has a better hole and therefore has a higher stableford score than the other.

In this instance both Newell and Cliff had Nett 63 after their handicaps was deducted from the Gross Scores. So we go back to a countback.

In this example Newell wins because he had 24 points on the back nine compared to Cliffy who could only conjure up a disappointing 23 stableford points on the back nine and was therefore relegated down a place.

If in the event that the countback then identifies that both players have had the same stableford points score on the back nine then we go back to the individual holes starting from the  $18^{th}$  hole and compare results until a player had a standout result. In the example shown on the right from last year when both Tony Mac and Tom had 21 Stableford points. Tom had a par for 4 points whereas poor Tony only had a bogie for 3 points on the  $18^{th}$  hole therefore Tom wins the countback and Tony is relegated back to a lower place ranking. If both scores are equal then we go back to the  $17^{th}$  hole, then the  $16^{th}$ , etc etc.

PLEASE NOTE THAT THE COUNT BACK IS ON HOLES 10-18 irrespective of whether it is a two tee start, a normal hit off from the first hole or as in the case of Gardiners Run we hit off the  $10^{th}$  hole first. It is always the  $10^{th}$  to  $18^{th}$  holes and if one person starts on the  $10^{th}$  hole and the other hits off the first hole then it still remains exactly the same formula.

The player with the most points at the end of the year is crowned the Points champion irrespective of how many rounds a person has played. If one person plays 13 rounds for the year and the person in 2<sup>nd</sup> place has only played 10 rounds but is close to the same score then that is bad luck to the person in 2<sup>nd</sup> place. All players are invited to play the entire fixture. We reward participation rather than perfection and performance so if you play more often you will end up with more points.

Ben Nichol is a perfect example of this situation, last year Ben had the highest average place ranking and nearly finished with the same amount of points as the winners despite playing only half as many games. Ben had 84 points from 7 rounds and averaged a place ranking of 4.0. Compared to the season champion Wayne James who accrued 97 points from 13 rounds at an average place ranking of 9.62. Statistically Ben had a better season however he just needs to work on the Leave Pass to ensure he gets out more often if he wants to have a chance to be crowned king pin.

The golf course conceded some pretty good rounds and as a consequence the handicapper took the liberty to shave the handicaps of a large proportion of the field. The biggest movers in were Steve Powne and Wayne James who both lost close to a full stroke overnight. Big Mick has started his 2019 season with a move closer towards being a genuine low marker. Shane Cumming will now officially be playing off a single figure handicap and Steve O'Sullivan is not far behind him. Cliffy, Colin, Douggo, Jamie, Newell, Phil, Todd and Tony MacIsaac all had a visit from Dr. Snip and they will advance on the fairways at Warburton conceding a more challenging handicap to play off on what is arguably a less forgiving course.

The laws of the universe state that for every action there is an equal opposite reaction. So for all of the shots that were taken off the good performers they were reallocated back on to the handicap of those who end up at the wrong end of the leader-board. The largest proportion was distributed to Warren Perrett who jumps up from a handicap of 12 to a handicap of 17.2. That's a very generous token from the handicapper and one of the largest handicap downgrades in Sunday Leave Pass history. It will be interesting to see how Warren goes with all of those extra strokes. Barry Hemsley also was gifted 0.8 strokes and Adam Cooper gained ½ stroke even though he performed very well at Gardiners Run except for the two Newell's that tarnished his scorecard. The loose change from the handicap redistribution was handed to Gerard MacIsaac despite his very impressive round and he still got 0.1 strokes and Stu Cooper was given 0.2 strokes just because he is a nice person.

### **HANDICAPS**

The changes to player's handicaps are as follows:

**BOLD RED NUMBERS**- refer to players whose handicap has gone out


**BOLD GREEN NUMBERS-** refer to players whose handicap has come in

As a new member of the Social Club the Callaway Handicapping system is used to give the player a daily played to handicap for the first couple of rounds. Once they have played 3 rounds they are given a temporary club handicap using the original AGU handicapping system. After 5 rounds they are then switched across to the current slope handicapping system.



This system is used for determining fair allowances for social golf events that attract novices or occasional golfers. A player's Callaway handicap is determined after each round by deducting from his/her 18 hole gross score the scores of the worst individual holes during the first 16 holes of the round.

In the computation of handicaps under this system:

- -No hole may be scored at more than twice its par,
- half strokes count as a whole,
- the 17th and 18th holes are never deducted,

For example if a player scores 99 on the day their handicap would be calculated as the sum total of their (3 worst holes) +1

If a player scores 82 on the day their handicap would be calculated as the sum total of their (worst + ½ the 2<sup>nd</sup> worst hole) -1

If a player scores 120 on the day their handicap would be calculated as the sum total of their (five worst holes) +2

After 3 rounds they will be allocated a temporary handicap using the old AGU handicapping formula and then after 5 rounds they are elevated onto the official Slope handicapping system which was use thereafter for all club competitions.

For those people interested in the mechanics of the handicapping system it can be best explained as the following.

How to calculate a GA Handicap

#### To calculate a player's GA Handicap:

- you must firstly identify the player's most recent 20 scores,
- you then determine the 'Played To' value for each of these scores,
- you average the best 8 'Played To' values,
- and finally you multiply this average by 0.93. The resultant figure (to one decimal place) is the player's GA Handicap.
- \* If a player's handicap record contains a lesser number than 20 scores, the number of scores used to calculate the player's handicap is as listed in the table below.
- \* There is no requirement for a player's most recent 20 scores to have been returned within a specific timeframe. For example, the most recent 20 scores may span a period of three years or they may span a period of three months.
- \* Once a player's handicap record contains 20 scores, the next score they return will result in the oldest of the existing 20 scores being removed (to be replaced by the new score).

Full Technical Procedure for Calculating a GA Handicap

Take will Fernie for Instance. He played 6 rounds with the club and his Best round was 13 over par or better described as a score differential of 13. When this value is multiplied by 0.93 his official handicap is 12.09 which was rounded to 12.0. If he had actually played 11 rounds and the scores listed above were his best 6 scores then his handicap would have been 16.75.

The more rounds a member plays the more reflective the handicap becomes of their skill level. Once a player has played 20 or more rounds each month the 20th round is dropped off and replaced with a new score. This is the point where a score inside the top 8 might drop off and be replaced by a higher score meaning the handicap goes up even though the player carded a decent performance.
