What better way to start season 2021 than with a couple of eagles. As we all know the Corona virus turned the world on its head last year and the proof is in the unusual events of January 2021. Fitzy was quick to identify the weirdness of Gardiners Run. Fitzy figured something was amiss when he noticed that both Stu Cooper and SOS had actually driven to golf. He also found it very unusual to see Newell with more than one beer in his hand and even more extraordinary there was the fact that as a collective group we had more scores posted in the 80 's at Gardiners Run than we had for the entire seasons in the years from 2004 to 2010.

If you also take into account Chris Sfiligoj holing out for an eagle three (3) on the par 5 tenth hole you could be forgiven for thinking that the world had gone absolutely mad. Then the icing on the cake was that after 16 years, 4569 rounds incorporating over 20881 attempts, finally a member of the Sunday Leave Pass social club has managed to hit the perfect shot. That is correct you read it right. Tom Kellythorn had a hole in one on the 136 -meter par $3,11^{\text {th }}$ hole and the ultimate proof that Corona Virus has stuffed up the world.

Rumour quickly spread across the fairways as the screams of joy reverberated across the hills. Interestingly the screams were not even from Tom but his playing partner Greg who was more excited about seeing the ace than Tom was. Evidently Greg might be a very good person to play with, because apparently this is the second time that someone in his pairing has hit the perfect shot. Although this time, it was better because he actually got to see it. Evidently on the previous occasion Greg was doing a wee in the bushes at the Bright golf course at the time of the hole in one, so he was facing the opposite direction at the time the ball dropped in to the cup.


When Stu Coops went over to see him, and ask about his hole in one, Tom said "Are you here to shake my hand?" Stu was quick to respond, "No I am just here to see what has been written on your scorecard cos I heard a rumour and would be surprised if it was true."

Congrats to Tom, he continues his domination on the Sunday Leave Pass honour boards. Tom has won the seasons championship, had a stint at the Champions of Champions jacket and has pulled out of the club coffers more NTP titles and skins prizes than the rest of us combined have won over the four years he has been playing with the social club.


According to Tom the best thing about getting a hole in one was standing around waiting while the rest of the group putted out.

Especially since the 11 th green accounted for plenty of 3 putts so it was certainly a good hole to be in a position to leave the flat stick in the golf bag.


If it wasn't enough to get a hole in one, Tom said it was made all the better when he realized he had knocked off Steve O'Sullivan for the NTP prize in the process and to make a good day better, Tom also won the NTP prize on the $4^{\text {th }}$ hole. With an eagle, 2 xbirdies and 7 x pars Tom posted a score low enough to win the monthly title as well. 84 off the stick was his career best real score and only one shot more than his 83 recorded using the X golf simulators in 2017.


You could be forgiven for thinking it was a perfect day for Tom, although in truth he could probably count himself as unlucky. How could he be unlucky if he shot Nett 62, won two NTP including a hole in one, I hear you ask?

Well Tom missed out on the eagle's nest Jackpot of 13 golf balls because Chris Sfiligoj had actually raided it and won a half share of the balls after he made an eagle 3 on the $10^{\text {th }}$ hole just 20 minutes before Tom made his hole in one. Chris also won the skins jackpot meaning there was only one skin on offer for Tom to claim with his one for 5 stableford points on the $11^{\text {th }}$ hole.

If that was not enough to make him cry, Tom was suddenly confronted with the reality that the Sunday Leave Pass Social Club doesn't currently have a Hole in one Sponsor. Our 10-year Sponsorship with Evergreen Winery tours terminated on the $7^{\text {th }}$ December 2020 and since then, as was communicated in the email sent out last week, we have not been able to lock in a new backer for the hole in one sponsorship prize,

The odds of a social golfer scoring a hole in one is actually 12000 to 1 and since we have now in the last 16 years had over 20000 attempts on par 3 holes the chances of someone making a hole in one seems to be near on impossible.

Someone sent me a picture of Tom teeing off.


The club has arranged for a hole in one trophy to be engraved so Tom can have his ball mounted and it will be presented to him at the Warburton round. We have also started a hole in one page honour board on the SLP website, although it may be a long time before we get the chance to add another name to the list. Let us hope it doesn't take another 16 years to get the next ace.

Wayne James was never a chance of making a hole in one, in fact he would have been happy to hit a fairway or a green in regulation. Wayne is usually a reliable consistent performer, however while others were playing the round of a lifetime, Wayne was thinking about calling Lifeline. Poor Wayne only managed to scrounge together one par for the day, and he spent most of his time scouring the bushes looking for his flouro yellow golf ball and being forced with no other alternative than to take an unplayable lie.


It was very lucky that Waynes ball was bright so it stood out and was easy to find, much the same as Cliffy Rowe and his new glow in the dark White golf shoes. It was great to see Cliffy back on the golf course. We missed Cliff last year when he went missing in action, we missed the intelligent conversation, his quick witted humour and most importantly the bar sales missed him most of all.

# Gardiners Run Golf Course Results January GARDINERS RUN GOLF COURSE 



Gardiners Run has done it again. The Chirnside Park golf course put on what can only be described as "perfect conditions for a golfer to thrive. It was a little damp early to soften all of the greens up and then the sun came out and the golfers began to shine". Admittedly the wind did pick up a bit on the back nine but, overall, there was no excuse for poor golf. The course was in pristine condition, the fairways were great, the greens were excellent and the ground-staff had even put the tee markers way forward and the flags in easy positions just to ensure we all enjoyed our experience on the day.

Even with good conditions and a generously set up golf course there is always going to be a few situations where things don't go according to plan. At some stage or another someone is going to have a blow-out hole and inevitably we get the opportunity to celebrate the misfortunes of those players who's round became unraveled when they scored a Newell (score of 10 or more.)

Greg Parsons was halfway through writing his victory speech when he made a par on the $16^{\text {th }}$ hole because at that stage, he was sitting on 35 strokes through 7 holes. He then made the silly mistake of telling his old man how well he was playing, and that was where it all went wrong. Greg's best ever start to a round of golf ended abruptly with a Newell plus one (11) on the par 5 seventeenth hole. It was enough to break his spirit especially when just 3 holes later, on the next par 5 he was faced with he went on to make an even bigger Newell.

The longer holes (par 5's) accounted for 6 of the 8 Newell's registered for the day, both Tim and Brendan MacIsaac amassed theirs on the very first hole of the day. It is pretty hard to recover from double digits as an opening hole score. Chris Sfiligoj would have been wishing he was allowed to play the $10^{\text {th }}$ hole twice rather than close out his last par 5 . Chris's eagle 3 was counteracted with a Newell plus one (11) on the $8^{\text {th }}$ hole which ultimately ended his bid for a top three finish.

Were it not for his 7 on the second hole Brendan MacIsaac would have had a Newell average on the par 5 holes. As it happened 9.75 par 5 stroke average is not an exciting start to the season for Brendan. Not surprisingly with 3 Newell's for the day Brendan found himself at the bottom of the points distribution and he will be asked to relieve Rick of Beer Wenching duties in February at Warburton.

In order to win the Season Championship trophy, you need to play regularly and consistently to about your handicap or better, and it is the handicapper's responsibility to make sure that this doesn't happen. After every round the scores are assessed and then the handicaps are adjusted according to your performance. As was the case last year we have adjusted the handicap formula to take into consideration the difficulty of each golf course, using the course slope index, so it will be very interesting to see how the scores finish up.

What we have done is simply aligned the Sunday Leave Pass handicapping process with the one used by golf link and by all golf clubs around the globe using the world handicapping system. Although your SLP handicap is unofficial and therefore it cannot be used to formally enter organized golf competitions and tournaments, it still should be an accurate reflection of your golfing
prowess and a measure of what your GA (golf Australia) handicap would be if you subscribed the $\$ 150$ per year to get an official handicap.

This year, your playing handicap will fluctuate around your documented handicap index. When you play an easy course such as Ringwood or Dorset then you will actually play off a lower handicap than you normally would. On the other days when we invite you to play a harder course such as Rosebud Country Club, Devils Bend, Werribee Park or Barham we will add a few extra shots to your arsenal just to give you more hope of avoiding total anxiety and depression. As you will see from the chart listed below, the handicapper got busy to work this month and after all of the impressive scores at Gardiners Run a large proportion of the field copped a notable handicap reduction.

A total of 13.8 strokes vanished from our handicap distribution. Understandably the most severe haircuts were given to Cam Douglas ( -1.3 ), Ben Nicholl (-1.5) and Tom Kellythorn (-1.8). Peter Alphabet also lost 1.6 strokes and Adam Coopers handicap is now 1.3 strokes lighter than it was at Gardiners Run.

Anthony Emmerson was gifted 0.7 strokes extra for his poor showing on a course when the rest of the field thrived, Brendan MacIsaac was awarded an extra 1.2 strokes onto his handicap to see if that is enough to lift him out of the beer wench position however what the handicapper may have forgotten is that Warburton golf course is the MacIsaac family playground. Brendan won there in season 2020 and even Tony Mac has had a strong presence at the top of the points leaderboard while chasing the white ball around the Warburton hills.

As a new member of the Social Club the Callaway Handicapping system is used to give the player a daily played to handicap for the first couple of rounds. Once they have played 3 rounds, they are given a temporary club handicap using the original AGU handicapping system. After 5 rounds they are then switched across to the current slope handicapping system.


After 3 rounds they will be allocated a temporary handicap using the old AGU handicapping formula and then after 5 rounds they are elevated onto the official Slope handicapping system which was use thereafter for all club competitions.

Sometimes the Callaway handicapping system has proved itself to be very favorable to new members. Whenever we take on a golf course like Devils Bend or Eynesbury and the field struggle to play to their handicaps the Callaway golfers end up featuring at the top of the points distribution. Unfortunately, it was not the case for Thomas Cooper who found himself a long way down the leaderboard. I don't think we have ever had a Callaway handicapper finish in last position and in this instance, Thomas was only 5 ranking points from being the first.


For those people interested in the mechanics of the handicapping system it can be best explained as the following.

How to calculate a GA Handicap

To calculate a player's GA Handicap:

- you must firstly identify the player's most recent 20 scores,
- you then determine the 'Played To' value for each of these scores,
- you average the best 8 'Played To' values,
- and finally you multiply this average by 0.93 . The resultant figure (to one decimal place) is the player's GA Handicap.
* If a player's handicap record contains a lesser number than 20 scores, the number of scores used to calculate the player's handicap is as listed in the table below.
* There is no requirement for a player's most recent 20 scores to have been returned within a specific timeframe. For example, the most recent 20 scores may span a period of three years or they may span a period of three months.
* Once a player's handicap record contains 20 scores, the next score they return will result in the oldest of the existing 20 scores being removed (to be replaced by the new score).

Full Technical Procedure for Calculating a GA HandicapSTEP 1 - Use the table below to determine the number of scores to be included in the GA Handicap calculation:

## Number of Scores in Player's Handicap Record Scores to be Used in the Calculation

| 5 to 6 | Best/Lowest 1 |

We have made plenty of mentions about Tom's hole in one, so to a large extent it has overshadowed poor Chris Sfiligoj's moment of glory.

Even before he teed off on Sunday morning Chris nominated making an eagle on the first hole of the day, the Par $510^{\text {th }}$ hole. I am not sure who was more surprised, us or Chris when it actually came to fruition. Chris holed a 7 x iron from out of the rough from 140 meters out from the green to make his first ever Sunday Leave Pass eagle. What a brilliant effort.


As Chris and Tom both made eagles on the same day, they get half of the prize kitty each. The eagle's nest has been reset back to 6 golf balls and it goes up one golf ball per month until it finally goes off. The maximum jackpot for the eagle's nest is capped at 30 golf balls and if more than 1 player has an eagle on the same day then the jackpot pool is simply split between the winners.

Stu Coops had a chance to split the Eagles nest prize 3 ways however unfortunately while Chris was capable of hitting the ball straight at the target with a 7 iron from over 140 meters out on the 10th hole, Stu was unable to hit the ball in with his putter from the side of the green and only 7 meters out. What's more Stu not only missed the eagle putt but failed to make birdie and only just managed to hole the ball for a par.

With his eagle on the $10^{\text {th }}$ hole Chris has made has way on to the Sunday Leave Pass honors list. His name as well as Toms has been added to the website and he joins an elite crew who have recorded a 2 under par score on a hole. The eagle's nest has been collected by a wide range of golfers over the years. Newell Richards the 2020 Champion of champion was very straight hitting. Newell has both a digital and paper spreadsheet of the names of all members on his hit list. He did not muck around either, Newell hit up more members for a free drink in January than some previous Sunday Leave pass blue jacket winners have done over the entire season.

For those who have forgotten about the powers bestowed on the Blue Jacket here is a reminder of how it works.
As the Champion of Champions Newell will be able to ask any Sunday Leave Pass member to buy him a drink, it is limited to only receiving one drink per member (beer or soft) over the entire year and it can only be done so only if he is wearing the Champion of Champion jacket at the time. This of course does not include new members who did not play at least one or more rounds in season 2020 but not exclusive to those who attended the golf trip. So, if he manages himself correctly, he should be looking at up to 50 free beers or soft drinks over the next 12 months. Now that is a prize worth aspiring for.

The other condition is that Newell must be the one who consumes the drink, he cannot use his power to buy beverages for anyone else. There is also a catch where, if Newell asks someone who has previously shouted him a drink then he must immediately buy them a drink instead. Not that there is much chance of that happening as he has a spreadsheet set up and running.

## Newell can also kick in the balance of $\$ 2$ per shout to upgrade his beer to bourbons if he prefers to.

Remember that Newell must be wearing the jacket, He must continue to wear the jacket while he is drinking. If it is too hot to wear the Champion of Champions jacket that is OK, just choose not to wear it and then you are not eligible for a free drink. If Newell continues his current drinks conversion rate and if he switches from ordering soft drinks and light beers to the heavy stuff, there is a good chance that sooner or later Steve Powne might be called upon to get Newell home, as was the case on the golf trip in 2018 at Howlong.

Congratulations to Cam Douglas who has already booked himself a ticket into the 2021 Champion of Champions play off. Cam will be very keen to get hold of the power of the Blue Jacket next season especially after he watched Newell claim 9 free drinks on Sunday afternoon.

Remember: In order, to qualify as the Champion of Champions a member just needs to win a monthly title. All of the winners from the monthly championships who are attending the golf trip will then play off for the title based on total accumulated stableford points from 9x Randomly selected holes. The Winner is the person with the most points over those 9 nominated holes, and in the event of a tie then a Countback to determine the winner applies.

NOTE: The Winner of the December title is also eligible to win the competition however they only get to count their scores by using only 8 Randomly selected holes.

Falling in behind Cam Douglas was Tom Kellythorn who could be a real contender for the season points championship if he continues to play regularly like he did on Sunday. Were it not for a few missed putts then Ben may well have also shot a score in the high 70 's. Ben finished in $3^{\text {rd }}$ position ahead of Fitzy who always seems to finish in the top 10 on the rare occasions that he turns up and plays with us. Gerard MacIsaac shot the lowest gross round for the day ( 79 off the stick which was just ( 7 over par) Although this was a great round by Gerard it was still only good enough for $5^{\text {th }}$ position and 11 championship points.

For those players not familiar with the scoring process, listed below is the format we use in Sunday Leave Pass competitions.
Once all of the players are ranked then the Seasons Championship points are allocated according to the position in the field.
The player in $1^{\text {st }}$ place gets 15 points, $2^{\text {nd }}$ place 14 points, $3^{\text {rd }}$ place 13 points, etc. etc. Any player who completes the round however finishes ranked outside the top 14 and is placed between $15^{\text {th }}$ spot to BeerWench then they are all allocated 1 championship point for attending.

For the benefit of the newcomers or the uneducated we thought it would be a good opportunity to go through the player rankings and point scoring system again.

Sunday Leave Pass competitions are run using Stroke so you need to count every shot that you play and you need to finish every hole. Each players Nett total score is then calculated by deducting the players handicap from the Gross score. If a player doesn't have an official Sunday Leave Pass handicap then a temporary played to handicap is allocated on the day using the Callaway handicapping system.

Once the players Nett score is calculated they are ranked from lowest score to highest score. (BeerWench) Where more than one player has the same Nett Score (such as in the example below from Gardiners Run last year then the place allocations are decided based on a countback system.

The count back system is formulated as the following.
*Total number of stableford points scored on the back nine holes.
*In the event that both players have the same stableford score on the back nine it then reverts to the number of stableford points scored on the eighteenth hole. If this is the same then it goes to the $17^{\text {th }}$ hole, sixteenth hole, fifteenth hole until a player has a better hole and therefore has a higher stableford score than the other.

The player with the most points at the end of the year is crowned the Points champion irrespective of how many rounds a person has played. If one person plays 13 rounds for the year and the person in $2^{\text {nd }}$ place has only played 10 rounds but is close to the same score then that is bad luck to the person in $2^{\text {nd }}$ place. All players are invited to play the entire fixture. We reward participation rather than perfection and performance so if you play more often you will end up with more points.
