

A bit of administration before we get to the results.

1. If you are still receiving regular communication because you are still on the distribution list, but have no intention of playing golf with us and you want to be taken off the mailing list, please do so by opting out using the following link. [Please take me off distribution list](#)

2. There are some great golf courses on offer this year and we have booked for a maximum of 32 players per month. It hasn't happened yet however if bookings exceed this number and we are unable to get any extra tee times then all available positions will be distributed on a first in first served basis. With our numbers continuing to grow it is important to let us know your availability as early as possible so that we can monitor numbers before it is too late. To view the 2011 fixture it is listed on the Sunday Leave Pass Website, [2011 Golf Fixture](#) or [2011 Calender](#).

As has been the case in the past if for some reason a player is unable to attend on the day they are welcome to arrange a round of golf outside the club program fixture, so long as they arrange the game themselves and they are accompanied by another Sunday Leave Pass player or players for the game. If arranging alternate times, then we need to be advised in advance who is playing, when they are to be playing and then all of the scores must be forwarded to the club on that day. The alternate round must be played before the Sunday Leave pass scheduled date or on the day at a different time. If played outside the normal competition players are still eligible for the monthly title, annual points distribution and skins but will not be able to enter into the Nearest to pin prizes and longest drive competitions. (We have tried this in the past and it has proved too difficult to coordinate.)

3. This year we are trialing a putting competition. So when marking your cards it is also necessary for you to mark down the total number of shots you have, as well as the total number of putts. A Putt is only counted when the stroke is hit while on the green, therefore using the putter from on the fringe or surrounding areas is not counted as a putt. Using a different club while on the putting surface is still counted as a putt, and as has always been the case there is no such thing as a gimmie. The ball must be hit until it goes in the hole and a 1 inch putt counts just the same as a 200 meter drive.

4. Thanks to the guys who provided feedback on the Stroke Vs Stableford competitions. It was a very mixed response and there were benefits to both formats. At this stage we will be continuing with the stroke format this year and we will revise the format again in 2012. As has been the case for the past few years a Stableford & Par competition is conducted as part of the scoring program however the main results will still be determined by the stroke scoring system for 2011. It appears that with the new slope handicap system the scores will be more balanced anyway so we will watch with interest to see what transpires throughout the course of the season.

Glen Waverley Golf Course Results January

Welcome to Sunday Leave Pass season 2011.

What a sensational start it was too. Nett 60 won the Monthly title, a 3 over par 71 was the lowest gross score for the day and there was more Birdies than there were 10's. Obviously the summer season has not been wasted, and a few guys have been working on their swings during the off season.

Some things never change however, Stu Coops managed to get lost on the way to the course, he managed to take Steve Powne to Jells Park via Springvale. With only 3x turns from Forest Hill to the Glen Waverley course you would think it impossible to get lost, but the projected 10 minute trip took 25 minutes and required 3x stops to ask people for directions. It seemed getting lost was Stu's theme for the day, he lost balls on each of the first 2x holes and by the end of the day no less than 6x balls with Sunday Leave Pass logos and Stu's signature target printed on them had been permanently redistributed around the Glen Waverley layout.

Obviously Stu wasn't the only one to be losing golf balls, because at one stage it looked as though Greg Breasley was going to have a complete Alphabet of Sunday Leave Pass Balls after he found a logo ball with an "S" on the 2nd hole, a ball with an "M" on the 5th hole and a Sunday Leave Pass ball with a "P" written on it while playing the back 9. Because of the identifying letters it wasn't too hard for Greg to work out who was having a bad day. PLEASE NOTE: It is definitely a good idea to put a distinguishable mark on your ball. Because, all of our prize balls have exactly the same markings & number on them, and with 20 to 30 guys randomly crossing paths all over the place there may easily arise a situation, where two different people want to lay claim to the same ball.

Dean Fitzpatrick had no trouble identifying his ball on the 4th hole when he swung and missed leaving the ball stationary despite his back breaking swing from the shoulders. If you're looking for an early contender for a 2011 Leather Wedge nomination, Deano could be your candidate since he blatantly denied his air-swing claiming it was only a practice swing, but according to witnesses, his **practice swing was played while standing very closely to the ball and was preceded with a sigh of disappointment and a groan.**

There was talk about having the voting for "Leather Wedge" and "Angry Man" etc at the completion of each month, if that was the case then Deano would be odds on favorite so far, but given the lack of responses to some of the other ballot and surveys held over the last months we have decided to stick with the old format and have a single vote at the end of the year where you can nominate as many players as you see appropriate.

It was interesting to see 3x Leather Wedge title holders paired up in the one grouping. Poor Paul Blizzard was given the daunting task of trying to keep track of the guys identified over the past 5x years as the most notorious score and rule manipulators of all time. At the conclusion of the golf Paul was not looking his usual spritely, perfectly groomed and composed self. It was impossible to determine whether the dark heavy rings around his eyes, the gaunt face, pale skin color, frazzled hair style and stressed look upon his face was caused by trying to keep the Supercoach and the MacIsaac family honest during the round of golf or whether he was just exhausted from looking after the newest edition to his family "**Matisse Isobel**" who was born on the 9th of January. (Child number 8x I think.) Credit should go to Paul who was able to keep the Sunday Leave Pass active, even with a 3x week old baby when other blokes are still tied to the crib 1 & 2 years after their child was born.

Unlike that fateful August day during round 21 in 1973, there were no helicopters at Waverley for Peter Hudson's long awaited return, nor was there the fairytale finish. Unlike his namesake, the Hawthorn Champion full forward, Peter Hudson, Peter Hutson was unable to live up to the expectations based on his previous successes. Peter battled around the Glen Waverley course disappointing his fans with an ordinary display of skill; he dropped more than 8 finish place positions on his last performance which ironically is the number of goals that the Hawthorn football great kicked against Collingwood at Waverley after 2 years out of the game.

While people will not be talking about Peters round of golf at Glen Waverley in the years to come, they will definitely be talking about Dale's sizzling performance on the 23rd January 2011. Dale shot a career best score 87 Nett 60 to obliterate the competition and take out the January Title. Dale played faultless golf accumulating 4x Pars and a birdie on the way. Although this was a great effort it should be noted that Dale has played golf almost every day during the summer holidays and most of those practice rounds have been with Tony MacIsac and Phil at Glen Waverley so it's little wonder he had little trouble negotiating the course layout. Obviously the famous saying "Practice makes perfect" is the truth since both Tony and Phil also finished with top 10 finishes and both guys finished well inside their normal average finish position rankings. The challenge will be whether they can find the time to get the practice rounds in for Warburton because it is a lot longer trip to get there regularly.

Only one player came close to rivaling Dale's sensational performance, and that was the score of Western Australian recruit Mark Lawson. Mark made a round of golf look like it is as easy as shooting fish in a barrel with a shot gun. He scored 14 pars and a birdie, and his bad holes were 2x bogies (he missed short par putts) and a double bogey to shoot the days low score of 71. Considering he was using a women's set of golf clubs and he spent most of his time talking to everyone around him it was amazing he had the time to concentrate on getting a decent score. Under the Callaway handicap system Mark played to scratch (0 handicap) which is a brilliant effort and should be acknowledged as one of the best ever.

As a group we scored 76 Pars and 10 Birdies which must be a record for the social group. There were plenty of brilliant shots played and a few opportunities left out on the golf course. Greg Parsons missed a 4 foot birdie Putt on the second hole, Greg Breasley 4 putted from inside 2 meters and Stu Coops squandered eagle opportunities on the 13th and 16th holes. Stu drove on to the fringe of the Par 4 13th nearly taking out Chris Sfiligoj in the process and then drove the ball to about 3 meters past the hole on the 16th hole. When asked what he was thinking while standing over the Putts his reply was simple and honest "just don't 4 putt it for bogey."

Congratulations to Dale who's sneaky practice rounds paid off, he won by 7x shots over Tony Grasso. Rick Turcinovic had his highest finish position shooting a spectacular 103 for a Nett 68. Dales practice partner Tony Mac finished in 4th spot with Nett 69 and Mick Harper rounded out the top 5 with his 79 off the stick. Alister, Mark Lawson, Phil Plane and Ron Parsons also had very good scores, each finishing within the top 10.

Don't forget that it is very important to count all of your shots, rounding down your score is not an acceptable practice. One or two strokes doesn't sound like much, over 18 holes, but it can often be the difference between 2nd and 8th position on the points tally. Penalty strokes, air-swings or missed gimme putts all need to be counted or else you might find your name being engraved on the leather-wedge trophy at the end of the year.

Handicaps

With 23x players blessed with perfect playing conditions on what can in hindsight be described as a very short and pretty easy golf course you would expect a few guys to play to Par or better, but it wasn't the case. Incredibly only Dale, Tony Grasso & Tony Mac, as well Rick Turcinovic bettered their handicaps and only Big Mick, Alister and Phil played to around Par.

This month was the first time we have officially used the new handicap system and it was great to see a few of the guys who got a big boost on their handicaps have automatically streaked up to the top end of the leader board, obviously the combination of the short user friendly golf course combined with the extra 2 or 3 extra shots was enough to boost them into contention. We will continue to track both handicap systems and compare the outcomes and trends that are emerging.

Rick Turcinovic would have finished around 14th position under the old system with a Nett 74 however the extra 6 strokes reflected in the changes in his handicap allowed him to finish in 3rd spot with a Nett 68 and his handicap has come down slightly for next month.

Dale had a great round, his Nett 60 cost him 1.1 strokes under the new slope system, however under the old format the handicapper would have been far more ruthless and taken a massive 2.2 shots off his old handicap.

Interestingly several other players' handicaps were adjusted downwards despite not breaking par as one of their big score was dropped out of their top 10 and replaced by a lower score from Glen Waverley.

In the example below the 10th best score which is the 20th (24) would be dropped off for the next round and would be replaced by either a round which was better than the one that dropped off or else one of the "25 over Par" scores would become active and the players handicap would be adjusted slightly upwards. If the player's next round was a 21 over par then an adjustment on the player's handicap would be made in a downward direction. Where a player's latest score is outside their best 10 and the score that drops off as the 20th round is also not included in the formulation of their existing handicap, then the players handicap will remain unchanged.

In summary the slope handicap is calculated by taking the most recent 20x rounds of golf and averaging the best 10 scores x0.96 to create the handicap. For example.
