The handicapper had his pencil sharpened and ready to use even before the first ball was struck, by the time the last group arrived back at the car park deductions had been made to the handicaps of more than ¼ of the players in the field, with Rick McEvoy was the hit hardest with a 3 shot deduction after a blistering round of 77 (Nett 59). Not a bad effort considering that he was heard whinging about his golf clubs before the start of the round. In his words, "they aren't that good but what do you expect when they are free." With 2x wins from 2x rounds the clubs can't be that bad. Hopefully the new handicap might slow him down a bit. Congratulations on an excellent round. 77 with a triple bogie on the first hole is sensational golf, we need Roger Powne to make a come back to give him some decent competition.

Rumor has it, that Rick was seen taking all of his prize balls for winning from Warburton & Glen Waverley plus his nearest to pin prizes back to the **Golf Clearance Outlet** claiming that he wanted to swap them for new ones, apparently the reason for changing the balls was that they were scratched after he dropped them in the car park. The boy is always out to save a penny.

Young Matt MacIssac has continued his sensational form, from a possible 30x points he has scored 27 in the first 3 rounds of this year. Considering he is meant to be studying for his VCE this year he seems to be getting plenty of practice on the golf course. Perhaps a drug test or a girlfriend might be needed to bring him back to reality. He shot 4 under par Nett 64 and was the recipient of a major handicap adjustment for the third time in 2008.

With a field of 17 players on a pretty short course it is much harder to have a top 10 finish. The scores were also very tightly grouped. Which meant that we had to have a count back to sort out the place rankings for 2nd & 3rd, 4th & 5th and 7th through 10th place.

When many players finish with the same Nett score the place rankings are determined by the count back system. The count back system formulates a ranking order by calculating the number of Stableford points each player had on the back 9x holes. In the event that still the players had the same score on the back nine then the Stableford points on individual holes are assessed working back for the 18^{th} hole until a leader is found.

Just a reminder that it is a good idea to get into the habit of putting a marking on your ball to help you to be able to identify which one is yours, especially now that a few more players are be starting to use the new Sunday Leave Pass Logo golf balls (although Matt & Rick seem to be the only ones who are collecting the balls lately.) Remember the prize balls all have exactly the same number and print on them so it might be worth getting in the habit of writing your initials on the ball just so that you can always tell which ball you are hitting especially when blokes like Stu Coops are always hitting the ball onto the wrong fairway.

Despite constant reminders, we still have a problem getting some people to reply and confirm their status for the next month and unfortunately we are also still having to chase a few guys up in order to ensure that they have paid by EFT before the deadline date. Please be aware that if we get 28 players confirmed and paid up then we will not bother chasing you up and you will miss out on a spot. Bookings will be made on a first paid first served basis. We don't want to have the situation where guys miss out, but if you can't book a spot for your self be replying to the emails sent to you then you deserve to miss out.
