Sunday was a good turn out, the bar sales were good, it didn't rain, the company was pleasant, the pies in the pro-shop were delicious, petrol was cheap, I found 20c in the car park, I came home to a nice cooked dinner, the kids went to bed early and slept all night. But the golf was crap!!





One would expect that as we continue to play regular rounds of golf, theoretically all of our scores should be improving, but on the contrary it is the complete opposite. Once again the scores this month have been absolutely disgraceful and for some unknown reason they continue to get depressingly worse (except for Mick Harper) rather than better. The only one consolation, to the bad golf is that it usually leads to higher bar sales as we drown our sorrows and try to find solace at the bottom of a can.

There was certainly more than a Growling Frog on the golf course this month. Brendan put his hand up for an Angryman award nomination as he cursed, cussed and swore his way around the testy links layout. Amazingly with an all mighty splash, which sent mud and tadpoles flying in all directions, the ball somehow managed to reappear

from beneath the water and rolled down the middle of the fairway setting up a chip and a putt giving him a brilliant 6 which may have otherwise been

easily a 9 or 10.



Stu Coops was forced to dig deep when his ball disappeared 2 inches below the sandy surface in the face of a bunker, where a kangaroo had pounced. Despite having no access to the ball without the assistance of an excavator, miraculously Stu somehow managed to blast his ball out of the crevice and onto the green. It was the only shot Stu could smile about because it was yet another tough day at the office for him. Stu even managed to lose the same ball twice. He lost his ball on the 11th hole, and it when it was returned to him several holes later when Steve Powne found it and recognized the identification markings, he then managed to lose it again by the end of the next hole.

Dean Fitzpatrick proved himself a master at the long bunker shot. Interestingly, the low 7 iron rose some 96 meters into the air and nearly blew back over Deans head as it battled to break through the wind. I would suggest that Mick, Gerard and Alister had better watch out, because you are going to have some competition next season, since this fella can really play the game. What's more the talk around town is that he may have gone to the Mark Sfiligoj Super-coach school of golf strategies and that he may in fact, be just holding pack a few gears so he starts on a very healthy handicap for 2011.

Don't forget that it is very important to count all of your shots, rounding down your score is not an acceptable practice. One or two strokes doesn't sound like much, over 18 holes, but it can often be the difference between 2nd and 8th position on the points tally. Penalty strokes, air-swings or missed gimmee putts all need to be counted or else you might find your name being engraved on the leather-wedge trophy at the end of the year.

Handicaps

Only Mick Harper managed to play 3x stroke s better than his handicap, he was stripped of 0.6 shots for his 8 over par 80 round. The Callaway system was used to calculate the handicaps for the new guys who will be allocated official handicaps pending their third rounds with the club at Amstel next month. Tony Grasso Junior played with in the buffer zone of his handicap and therefore keeps the same handicap whereas for the rest it is onwards and upwards as another 0.1 strokes is added to our handicaps.

As has been mentioned in previous correspondence we will continue to use the old handicap scoring system until the start of 2011 season although we will keep the website updated with what your projected handicap is likely to be under the new Slope handicap scoring system, It is interesting to compare each players handicap under both systems when you make comparisons between the old and the new they handicaps are amazingly similar.
