Ivanhoe Results September

Definitely a much better course this month than Ringwood, with pure fairways and very good greens and a very enjoyable layout, the only thing that let the Ivanhoe course down was the fact that the tees were about as flat as a sumo wrestler lying on a waterbed.

As it has done in the past, Ivanhoe produced some incredibly low scores with more than half the field playing to their handicap or better. Lukey D was the man of the moment producing a personal best round of 90, cleaning up the field with a Nett 60. It was great to see Lukey win, he has been playing since March 2004 and he has never even won himself a NTP ball, in fact this month was the first

time he had ever even hit a tee shot onto a Par 3 green to be in contention for a NTP so he was shattered when Al had Knocked him off for the NTP on the 8th hole but I am sure a Monthly title will have him celebrating for weeks.

It was excellent to see some new names at the top end of the leader board, as well as Lukey being the victor, following closely behind in 2nd place was Phil Plane, shooting a brilliant round off 99 Nett 66 improving his personal best score by a whopping 8 strokes. Apparently his score could have been even better had it not been for the heavy sledging and mind games being played on him by Jamie and his cohorts who did their best to try and bring him back to their skill level. In third spot was Burnsie who shot a Nett 67. Considering, Burnsies first drive didn't make it past the ladies markers a round of 95 was a brilliant effort.

Alistair had been heard making the comment **“it’s amazing that after all the years of playing each month I can’t believe Burnsie is not getting any better;”** that was reinforced by his comments on the first hole which Al so accurately identified **“that is unbelievably bad, not only did he fail to get past the ladies but he didn’t even hit it past the men’s markers. What a shocker!!!!”**

It sounds as though Burnsie might be getting a nomination for the Least Improved Award from Al, which although could be justifiable, may be disappointing for Greg Parsons who was aggressively campaigning for votes in the car park after the game. Greg pleads a good case too. He has played all of the 9x rounds for the year and has only posted 9 championship points, making him the only player who has not had a top 10 finish for the season. Given that he played in Round 1 when there were only 11 players in the field that’s a pretty ordinary performance and is probably worthy of a “Least Improved Nomination.”

Hopefully by now people are starting to consider their nominations for the players choice awards, the voting forms are up on the website and votes can be posted at any time. Remember you can vote for as many players for each category as you see fitting and “Yes” Greg you can vote for your self if you think it is appropriate.

The voting categories are:

- * The most improved player
- * The leather wedge

The career statistics program can calculate all manner of trivial things including; the average score per round, total number of pars, total number of birdies, overall number of shots and best and worst ever rounds. This month we are running a profile on the guy who is now odds on favorite to become the season's champion for 2008. Alistair Bayer (some call him Ned Kelly) started with the club in late 2007 after 3x shaky rounds he managed to land himself a 19 handicap, which the handicapper having realized the mistake has since managed to slash down to 11. Al is a big hitter and despite only joining the club last year has managed to win 5 monthly titles, which is nearly more than almost everyone else in the club. From 10 rounds he has an average place finish of 3rd spot and scores nearly seven pars and a birdie with each round, which is very impressive record.

Another of our regular players is Lukey Dumbrell, he played his first round with the Sunday Leave Pass back in March 2004, since then he has clocked up over 3192 shots at an average of 110 strokes per round and also more than 200 cans from the bar at an average of 7x beers per round. Lukey averages nearly 5x strokes per hole on par 3's and averages around 7.5x shots on the par 5's. Lukey's best ever round was a 90 at Ivanhoe this month beating his previous best at the same course in 2006, which is far improved of his 125 at Werribee park on his first ever round with the boys. On average Lukey generally finishes around 10th on the times that he manages to get out of bed and make it to the course. He has the club record of 11 No-shows including the golf trip in 2006 when he got lost on the way and turned back for home instead.
