Kingston Links Golf Course Results

September

Sorry the results blurb is gonna be short and sweet this month (hooray you all scream) I have to try and get myself sorted for the Orchard Grove Golf Day which is next Monday and I am also feeling slightly hung-over after yesterday afternoons 19th hole golf activities ran in to last night with an impromptu street party as the local neighbourhood helped me empty the esky and boosted the social club bar profits by more than 25% on the monthly average.

Congratulations to Tony Grasso JNR who has crowned with his first monthly title after numerous close finishes. Junior needed a brilliant round to claim the title and did so with a sub 100 score for his first time with the social club. Junior finished the day with Nett 66 beating Trevor the bushranger by just one stroke.

But it was early in the round when Junior nearly claimed his first scalp when he belted a ball up and past the group ahead of him. Tony's ball actually went through Ricks legs as he tried to play a bunker shot. Without so much as a call "fore" Rick wasn't impressed and accidentally buried Juniors ball in the sand leaving just the top of the Titleist 4 showing above the sandy surface. It take a thorough search of the bunker before Tony found his ball and it took the best shot he could conjure up with the sand wedge to splash the buried ball back into play.

Newcomer Newell Richards nearly claimed a scalp of his own when he caught a flyer out of the bunker on the Par 3, 5th hole. Newell nearly cleaned up Greg Breasley who had grown impatient and tried to finish putting out the hole because Newell had accumulated 15 shots and was still in the sand.

Although he missed the club record score of 19 which is currently held by Jamie Brunton, Newells score of 17 on a 142 meter par 3 warrants a mention. Newells hole included a lost ball in the lake, then a chip into the bunker, a chip across the green and into another bunker, a chip back across the green into the bunker he had started in, 2 duffs in the bunker, then a shot across the green back into the bunker again, 2 more shots in that bunker before his ball rolled back over the green into the first bunker. It then took five more shots in the same pot before his ball came out hard and fast narrowly missing Greg Breasley's head and there is little doubt the ball would have finished back in the bunker on the other side had it not wrapped itself around the golf flag Big Ball Breasley was holding dropped onto the green a foot from the hole. It was a lucky break for the newcomer and to his credit and as testimony to his character; he completed the hole without any animosity and marked his card with a score of 17 with one putt. I'm sure there are a few people who are on the radar for leather wedge nomination this year who, under similar circumstances would have forgotten a few of the shots and marked themselves with an 8 or 9.

Although Phil Plane didn't shoot a 14 over par on the one hole he did have a disastrous day and posted close to his worst round for his Sunday Leave Pass career and he finished in Beer Wench position with a Nett Score of 102.

Big Mick failed to trouble the scorers despite playing some of the longest drives ever seen at the Kingston Links course. Mick put on a show for his playing partners but failed to convert with the putter and a few wayward approaches to the green.

Paul Blizzard, Gerard and Trevor Adair all played some scintillating golf and each finished at par or better for the day. Trevor played the par 3 holes like he had his ball on a string. He won 3 of the 4 Nearest to Pin holes and his longest putt would not have been further than two and a half meters from the flag. Incredibly the only Birdie putt he actually managed to convert was the longest one and he failed to make his Birdie on the 3rd hole even though the ball sitting only 55cm from the hole.

If Trevor ever learns to Putt like Gerard then he will be the biggest contender for a Seasons championship title. As it happens Trevor is moving closer and closer to the top end of the Championship leaderboard even though he averages more than 36 putts per round. Compare that to Gerard who is the master of the flat stick and he averages only 30 putts a round.

Paul Blizzard relished in the company of elite golfers and he made use of his rare appearance with a very impressive Nett 68 and the second lowest gross score for the day.

Kingston Links was a course that offered plenty of opportunity to score well but with all 18 holes exposing you to the element of danger of water hazards coming into play either from the tee, the green or often both. The deep rough off the fairways made it hard to get a clean strike at the ball and that lead to some pretty bad scores. There was a large gap between the top 4 players and then the rest of the field. Tony Grasso came in 5th place with Nett 77 and then the scores got worse from there.

We tried to get some information out of Peter Hutson about his day but unfortunately he wasn't up to discussion. All Peter was willing to disclose was that he bought a Jeep and we have known that for months know so hopefully the novelty will wear off soon.
