
Please try and use these buttons regularly as it will save us lots of phone calls and text messages chasing up players at the last minute. **(SEE END OF EMAIL)**

Malvern Valley was a very enjoyable short course with 8 par 3's, it had very large greens and a course par of only 67 so you would expect some pretty good scores and that was exactly what happened. A sensational round (79 off the stick) from Darren Higgs was easily good enough to give him 10 championship points. 6 pars and a birdie and nothing worse than a double bogie gave Darren first prize and three balls for this great effort. Although we will be playing on another low scoring golf course next month hopefully he will find it tougher with his handicap slashed from 21 to 17. It's good to see the handicapper getting ruthless at last.

Matt MacIssac handed in a low scorecard too, he had a score of 97 Nett 65, although his card is the center for much controversy and an independent inquiry has been ordered into it. Matt's scores were marked on a Yarrambat scorecard, not one from Malvern Valley, so we are not quite sure if his score was legitimate. So long as the card was correct we are awarding Matt 2nd place and 9 points. Matt is posting a real threat and is featuring very regularly at the top end of the monthly points tally. You'll have to keep your eyes on him boys or he'll keep on winning.

Rick McEvoy played his 3rd round for the club and finally got his official handicap, it is probably a bit high for a golfer of his standard but the handicapper will get into him soon enough. He came 3rd and won nearest the pin on the 3rd and 5th and 9th holes, he obviously knows how to hit the ball well, luckily for the rest of us he goes to the same putting coach as Daniel De Marinis and piles on the extra shots once he hits the green. Rick is running 2nd in the overall points for the year and if he plays each month he will be one of the favorites for the championship title, although he'll need to be consistent to beat Darren and Daniel and Gerard.

It was great to welcome back to a few of last years players, Bocca, Fitzy, Deano, Peter Bennett, Ron Parsons, Fil and Burnsie all made their 2006 debut appearance. Some of them made a sensational debut. PB played a very consistent round he posted a Nett 72 and started his account for the year in a good way. He might have made a grand entrance to the competition but his exit was not so elegant, Peter was last seen driving out of Malvern Valley car park, literally driving on the rims of his wheels with a flat tyre, he was absolutely oblivious to the yelling and laughter coming from the gallery at the 19th hole, so I hope he made it home safely. Peter could be another good chance for the club competition, he is certainly a good enough golfer it's just a pity he's not as committed as some of our other players who turn up every month no matter what the circumstances.

Special mention goes to Ron & Greg Parsons who both fronted to play golf even though Ron's wife Bev had been rushed to hospital only a couple of days before, Bev was still quite ill and was being cared for by the hospital staff while Ron was chasing his ball around the course. Greg's main concern when told of her ailment was the urgency to find a substitute baby sitter for his kids so that he didn't have to cancel his golf and he even forgot to ask how his mum was going.

There must have been something in the air cos, Fil called in sick from work on Sunday morning so that he could play with us, (mystery 24 hour virus) he started with a Par, then a birdie and was looking good until he wrapped his 9 iron around a tree snapping it in two, from then on Fil had problems as most of the Par 3's turned out to be 9 iron distance from the tee so he struggled to get the right distances and his golf went down hill.

On his way to the course, Robbie Howard made a contribution to our new sponsor "Victoria Police", they were delighted to receive a \$165 donation from Rob and as a memento of their gratification, they give him an official pink certificate to acknowledge his generosity. What's worse Rob was outplayed by his son Adam. On one of the holes, Ad's drove his ball 30 meter's further than his dad. Pretty good for a kid his age, but the

funniest part about it was that Adam only hit the ball 20 meter's, Robbie's ball actually finished 10 meter's behind the tee area.

Burnsie had an interesting first bash. He was playing to his usual form and golf balls were flying around the course in any direction except where they were meant to go. After 9 holes a pattern had emerged. Young Jess who had come along to watch his buddy Matt MacIssac had figured out that the best place to be when Burnsie was hitting was the middle of the fairway because most of his shots were dribbling along the ground and going off into the bushes. On the 10th hole Jess had ducked into the bushes to siphon the snake, but then realized that Burnsie was about to hit. By being in the tree's while Burnsie was hitting meant that Jess was in the firing line so he ran towards the safety of the fairway. Remember that the more times that you play during the year, the greater the chance of winning a prize. For every month you play you are given a ticket for the end of year raffle draw. Last years prizes were fantastic and hopefully we can do the same this year. Being a raffle it gives everyone a fair chance of winning a prize and the regular players are rewarded because they have more tickets. Bonus tickets can be picked up along the way through the skins competition. Skins are calculated using the handicap system so anyone who has a good hole (better than what they usually have, i.e. (Birdie for a low handicapper or Bogie for a high handicapper) could pick up a skin or two.

Skins were distributed to those players good enough to win a hole outright. If more than 1 player got the lowest score on a hole it is Jackpotted until an outright winner occurs.

Handicaps

The handicapping system is adjusted monthly, dependent on the players recent results. A poor round where a player scores worse than a Nett Par and their handicap goes out 0.1 shots on the other hand a good round and the handicap is reduced according to how much less than par they scored. This month for instance with a Nett 58 and Darren Higgs handicap is adjusted by 3.7 therefore he will be playing off a much tougher handicap (17)next month.

Congratulations to Ron Parsons, Adam Cooper, Rick McEvoy and Tony MacIssac who all played their 3rd rounds and now have an official club handicap.

It became apparent after last month that we needed to introduce yet another new rule to combat slow rounds. We started the 30 second rule this month but unfortunately the person who was responsible for the introduction still takes a lifetime to hit the ball. We have discussed this at length and have decided to put Ian Smith in the last group, so that while he is hatching the ball on the course we can all be enjoying a coldie at the 19th.

***Shot Clock on hitting the ball.** A maximum of 30 seconds is allowed to play your shot otherwise all of your playing partners are allowed to throw tees, balls, clubs or anything the see fit at you.

For those that didn't take any notice last month please read this to get an understanding about how penalty strokes are to be taken.

1. If a ball is hit out of bounds and there is no doubt that it has definitely finished OOB. (then the player should hit another ball from where the last one was struck and the player incurs a 1 stroke penalty) This means the player counts the stroke that went out of bounds, plus a 1x shot penalty plus the stroke to put the next ball into play from the same spot the first one was hit. e.g.) 3x off the tee or hitting your 4th shot from the fairway.
2. If a ball is hit close to the area marked as "Out Of Bounds" or hit into thick rough and there is doubt whether the ball is "Out Of Bounds" or you are unsure if you will be able to find the ball, then a player should have another shot from the same location where the last ball was hit, calling it a "provisional ball." This ball does not come into play, unless the first ball is later deemed to be lost or OOB. (the provisional ball can be played as many times as necessary up to the point where the ball original ball is thought to have finished up.) The player may then search for the first ball for up to 5 mins, before deciding whether it has been lost. If the original ball is found and is deemed to still be in play, the player must use that ball regardless of where it lies on the course. Once the original ball is found the provisional ball may no longer be used. If the ball is OOB or lost and the provisional ball is used, all strokes played with the original ball are counted, plus the player incurs a 1xshot penalty for the lost ball plus all subsequent strokes with second ball are then counted as per normal.
3. If the ball is hit into a hazard such as a lake, creek or any other hazard area (usually identified by red stakes). The ball may be dropped within 2x club lengths of the hazard along the line of entry and the player incurs a 1x stroke penalty. e.g.) 1x shot which was hit into the hazard, 1x shot penalty and the next shot is being played from behind or beside the hazard.
4. If the ball is hit into the rough or another part of the course that is not considered a hazard or OOB and the ball is unable to be found, and the player did not hit a "provisional ball". The player must either:
 - A) go back to where the ball was last played from and take a 1x shot penalty, or
 - B) they must drop a new ball where the ball was thought to be located and take a 2x shot penalty.

E.g.) If the player lost their ball after their drive then they have the choice of either running back to the tee too play their 3rd shot or they can choose to drop the ball approximately where the ball has been lost and will be hitting their 4th shot from there.

I hope this clears up any scoring issues and provides consistency amongst all of the players.

It is important that players count all of their shots, not just the good ones. This includes penalties and air swings etc. We are not saying that anybody is doing it, but rounding down your score to help the card look better can have an effect on the points allocations.

Next month we are playing at Albert Park at 8.37am the course is relatively close to home for most people, Albert Park is a short and easy course, so there should be no excuses for not turning up and having a good day. We have booked for 24 players and hopefully we will get the full field there. Please confirm your attendance ASAP.
