After poor performances at Marysville unfortunately for Tony Mac, Stu Coops and Leigh MacIsaac the curtains have closed on their hopes and dreams of winning the points championship. Mathematically there is now only 2 players left in contention for the big prize and what is most exciting is that there is only 1 point between them on the points tally so when Big Mick and Andrew walk on to the first tee at Commercial Golf Course with a monstrous hangover they will be aware that every single shot counts and a single lost ball or a 3 putt green could cost them the title and major prize.

As tradition has it, Mick and Andrew will be paired up together at Commercial on Saturday for the last round just so they can keep an eye on each other. It will definitely be an interesting and entertaining round. We might even auction off the other two spots in the group to the highest bidder. As the two going head to head will be a spectacle worth watching.

This will be Andrews first run at the top whereas Big Mick has been a regular feature in the top of the field. If that was not enough, the locals started to get a bit upset once it was announced that Gerard MacIsaac won the NTP on the 9<sup>th</sup> hole and during the raffle almost the entire prize pool was bundled into cars and shipped back to Sunday Leave Pass Headquarters.

\*Glen Douglas also won first prize in the minor raffle and he then drew the next name out of the barrel which in fact turned out to be his own again.

\*Tom Kellythorn went home to the wife with a bottle of wine when his name was drawn out of the hat.

\*Barry Hemsley wrapped up his Christmas shopping when he won a box of chocolates to give to the wife and kids.

\*Stu Coops had his name drawn out as well, but such as the nice guy that he is, he threw his prize back in the ring in the hope that someone from Marysville actually got a prize.

\*It wasn't meant to be, and the Marysville folk missed out because SOS was the next name to be drawn out of the hat and the karma gods made good for Stu, since he was then able to enjoy the spoils of the raffle prize because it was actually beers that SOS had won so they were polished off in the car on the long trip back home from Marysville.



The actual golf day was a great success for all involved and the Marysville club president and treasurer were so impressed with the quality of the guys who attended on Sunday that they have invited us to create an official interclub inaugural challenge where Sunday Leave Pass take on the Marysville club members for a perpetual trophy. The difficult back nine at Marysville sorted out quite a few guys; in fact to narrow it down even further it was actually just the one hole that caused carnage across the field. The 12<sup>th</sup> hole at Marysville is a beautiful par 5 that runs along the ridge line of the forest, with two magnificent tree ferns standing tall in the middle of the fairway and the green is cut on the top of a steep hill where the banks run away from the green at a 45 degree angle. It is actually a relatively easy hole if you are capable of hitting 3 perfect shots in a row, however it can also come out to bite you if you are even just a little bit off your game.

Obviously the Sunday Leave Pass boys were a little bit off their game because the Nett result on this hole was amazing, 221 shots from 27 players which was 30 strokes more than any other hole on the golf course. The hole played at an average of 8.2 shots per player.

The only player to actually par the 12<sup>th</sup> hole was Geoff Cooper who miraculously holed a chip from nearly 70 meters out from the green, yet he went around telling the entire world or at least anyone who would listen to him, how easy a hole it was.

Jamie and Andrew Clarke have lodged a class action to protest to try to have the scores from the 12<sup>th</sup> hole removed from the score calculations. Both of these boys had excellent rounds except for this one blemish. Poor Jamie was still standing on the tee when he was playing his 11<sup>th</sup> shot, because his golf ball kept disappearing into the out of bounds markers on the right hand side of the

fairway. After hitting his shot OOB Jamie hit a second ball that he thought had stayed just in bounds, unfortunately it was not the case and as the Marysville event was a formal stroke tournament Jamie was required to take the long walk back to the tee to play a new ball. Two more balls sailed over the perimeter fence and poor Brunton was left with the dilemma of no ball in play and none in his pocket and a 200 meter walk to his golf bag and then back again to the tee to play another shot. In the end rather than take the long demoralizing walk he borrowed a couple of balls from the group behind and after two more shots he finally managed to snag a half decent shot and got a ball into play on the fairway.

To his credit Jamie finished the hole and although he pulled out of the Marysville comp with a DNF he still completed the entire round. It should be noted that his score of 16 was still a two shot improvement on his worst ever hole which was an 18 when he had a blow out and couldn't get out of the bunker on the Par 3, 15<sup>th</sup> at Albert Park in 2004.

Andrew Clarke will rue his disastrous 13 for all eternity especially if he ends up losing the season title. Andrew only fell 4 shots behind the winning score for the day at Marysville so even if he had hacked out a score of nine on the 12<sup>th</sup> hole he still would have won the day and advanced his lead over Mick Harper. It's little wonder that the odds on favorite for Angry Man 2016 drowned his sorrows leaving swag of trash and destruction in the back of the Newell mobile on the way home.

Congratulations to all of the guys who rated a mention in this list, the credit is that you were honest enough to count each and every shot. There are probably a few others who have achieved these scores or higher over the years but creative accounting and short term memory loss meant they missed the opportunity to document it on the scorecard.

The Marysville golf course is really 2 unique courses, the front nine offers up plenty of scoring opportunities and a bit of a confidence boost. The front nine gave up the majority of the 9 birdies scored for the day whereas the back nine was where almost all 13x Newell's (Score of 10 or worse) were scored. Although it should be said that Stu Coops, Cider and Chris Sfiligoj all started their days with a Newell on the first hole.

In what was otherwise a very tough day, the highlight of the day for Cider was his approach to the par 3 11<sup>th</sup> hole which bounced off a tree root at the mouth of the creek bed and then bounced back into play and nearly landed on the green.

Will Fernie had a day of up's and downs. Will had 2x Birdies, including one on the 260 meter Par 4 sixth hole after hitting his drive with a 3 wood through the back of the green. Poor Popeye was not 100% as he stepped up to the tee, and no one could tell if he was green from all of the spinach that he has been eating to build up his muscles or if he was green from having a few too many beers & Guinness the night before. Either way, the end result was that his day did not go as well as planned. Popeye wore the 3 Putt monkey vest for almost the entire 4 hour round, and he blames the heat stress caused by the extra bright yellow garment on a 34 degree day as the reason why he was seen throwing up a stomach full of spinach, carrots and corn after the golf rather than admit the hangover caused by the 100 cans he had claimed to have knocked off on Saturday night and Sunday morning had gotten the better of him.

Stu Coops can probably lay claim to being the first person in the clubs history to wear the three putt monkey vest for the entire 18 holes. Stu closed out his score of 10 on the first green with a three putt and then he managed to keep the yellow vest on for the rest of the day without ever giving it up to another player. In fairness Stu was paired up against Gerard who was holing Putts from anywhere and everywhere (29 Putts for the day, seven one putts and No 3 putts) so there was never a chance of Stu offloading the yellow vest once he had put it on.

At the other end of the fairway El Presidente (SOS) and Douggo almost went the entire day without either of them, having to put on the yellow vest. In fact it was not until the 16<sup>th</sup> hole when a member of the group actually had a 3 putt on the score card, which is a very impressive effort.

Mick Harper also putted his way to a good score with a blemish free round; he only had 28 putts for the day.

Given that the greens were about the size of a postage stamp, there was no surprise that the putting statistics were much improved on previous months. Our putting average was also improved by Dale and Geoff who both scored gobblers with a chip in and the greens were so easy that even Newell got away with 36 putts and only 3x 3putt greens. Even still, Will Fernie, Barry, Big Ball Breasley and Brad Hughes were able to contribute to the fine jar with a four putt, Barry as actually able to achieve this feat twice.

Well done to newcomer Brad Hughes who has set himself a precedent that may be difficult to maintain, Brad hit the second lowest gross score (85 off the stick) including 2 birdies and 5 pars. The good news is Brad was straight into the swing of the club protocols and he paid his fines through gritted teeth after he three putted the 18<sup>th</sup> green to win the 3 putt monkey vest and four putted the par 3 fourth hole for double bogey.

The crowned 2015 least improved player, Big Mick Harper had yet another consistent performance. Mick won the longest drive and also registered his name on 3x out of the four nearest to pin prizes as well as that he also hit the day's low score of 82. Micks round included 3 birdies, 2 of which were on par 3 holes which is usually a good indicator that he had his radar on and was hitting the ball close. Just about the only thing Mick Harper didn't win for the day was any skins. Despite 3 birdies he was still unable to win a hole outright as other players were able to match him on stableford points on the hole.

Congratulations to Dale Robinson who hit the best Nett score round for the day. Dale's score of Nett 70 was 2 shots clear of Douggo and therefore Dale was a deserved winner of the 15 championship points and his 7<sup>th</sup> Sunday Leave Pass monthly career title.

After complaining incessantly about the time it took to drive out from Southbank to Marysville Douggo ended up having a real day out, he cleaned up in both the Marysville Comp and raffle and he also finished in second place in the SLP order of merit. Newcomer Brad Hughes was gifted with a very generous handicap under the Callaway Handicapping system. Brad hit the ball like a 9 marker but was given a handicap of 13 so the end result was an impressive Nett score of 72 and 13 Sunday Leave Pass championship points to start his account. Brad also picked up a few skins so who knows he might even win himself a prize in the end of year raffle draw.

Mick Harper elevated his position to the top of the 2016 points leaderboard. After trailing Andrew Clarke by only one point coming into the Marysville round, he gained ground because he finished in 4<sup>th</sup> spot whereas Andrew finished in sixth place with Geoff Cooper falling in the middle of them.



At the other end of the results was poor Greg Breasley who battled his way around the golf course, at one stage it looked as if we were going to need to call for his medi-cart as the combination of the 34 degree heat and his 133swats at the golf ball had him staggering on his feet and was so exhausted that he need to sit down in the middle of the fairway take a little rest to suck in some oxygen.

The golf course conceded some pretty good rounds and as a consequence the handicapper took the liberty to shave the handicaps of a large proportion of the field. The biggest movers in were Geoff Cooper and Tom Kellythorn who were ripped of over 0.5 stroke for next month.

Wayne, Todd and Cliff Rowe were all gifted a significant change to their handicaps meaning they will find the scoring much easier at Albury.

For those people interested in the mechanics of the handicapping system it can be best explained as the following.

#### How to calculate a GA Handicap

##### To calculate a player's GA Handicap:

- you must firstly identify the player's most recent 20 scores,
- you then determine the 'Played To' value for each of these scores,
- you average the best 8 'Played To' values,
- and finally you multiply this average by 0.93. The resultant figure (to one decimal place) is the player's GA Handicap.

o If a player's handicap record contains a lesser number than 20 scores, the number of scores used to calculate the player's handicap is as listed in the table below.

o There is no requirement for a player's most recent 20 scores to have been returned within a specific timeframe. For example, the most recent 20 scores may span a period of three years or they may span a period of three months.

o Once a player's handicap record contains 20 scores, the next score they return will result in the oldest of the existing 20 scores being removed (to be replaced by the new score).

#### Full Technical Procedure for Calculating a GA Handicap

STEP 1 – Use the table below to determine the number of scores to be included in the GA Handicap calculation:

Note: When the handicap record contains more than 20 scores, the GA Handicap calculation uses the best 8 of the player's most recent 20 scores.

After 5 rounds they are then switched across to the current slope handicapping system.

This system is used for determining fair allowances for social golf events that attract novices or occasional golfers. A player's Callaway handicap is determined after each round by deducting from his/her 18 hole gross score the scores of the worst individual holes during the first 16 holes of the round.

In the computation of handicaps under this system:

- No hole may be scored at more than twice its par,
- half strokes count as a whole,
- the 17th and 18th holes are never deducted,

For example if a player scores 99 on the day their handicap would be calculated as the sum total of their (3 worst holes) +1

If a player scores 82 on the day their handicap would be calculated as the sum total of their ( worst + ½ the 2<sup>nd</sup> worst hole) -1

If a player scores 120 on the day their handicap would be calculated as the sum total of their (five worst holes) +2

After 3 rounds they will be allocated a temporary handicap using the old AGU handicapping formula and then after 5 rounds they are elevated onto the official Slope handicapping system which was use thereafter for all club competitions.
