There will be a plethora of alcohol to be consumed from the Corowa Golf Club as we drain out the fine jar takings. We have worded them up and they have promised to get an extra delivery of booze to make that sure there is enough to go around when the fine jar opens up.

Interestingly there will be a significant change to the formalities this year because Big Mick has been mathematically eliminated from winning the runners up trophy for the first time in 5 years. Stu sprayed balls everywhere, he was 5 off the tee on the 11th hole and again on the 14th hole. Stu shot a blistering 57 on the back nine to go from runner up contender to run away pretender. The player who has the most stableford points from the 9 randomly selected holes will be crowned champion of champions will be afforded the blue Jacket which when worn to a Sunday Leave Pass event in 2018 entitles them to claim a free drink from any Sunday Leave Pass member. The condition being that they cannot ask the same person more than once over the course of the year and they must be wearing the jacket to claim the entitlement. Cider hit an 83 off the bat to place himself in third position and elevated his ranking by 13 points in the points leaderboard tally.
