There was a noteable absentee on Sunday. Activity around the esky was much more quiet this month owing mostly due to the fact that the 2018 Champion of Champions was not in attendance. Evidently, Ron Parsons enjoyed his last free beer at Marysville. Ronnie has had a good season in 2019, he has done the blue jacket proud with some good scores out on the golf course and some solid shoulder tapping in the carpark afterwards. Unfortunately however, even with the assistance of his motorized racing cart, the wear and tear on his body has still got the better of him. Last week Ron checked himself into hospital to complete the next phase of his Tiger Woods anatomical morphism surgery plan. For those that aren't in the know, a couple of years ago Ron started a plan with his doctor to rebuild his body section by section in a plan to substitute his deteriorating joints with new modern stainless steel replacements which are strategically set to the exact angles as his idol and role model. Tiger Woods.


While Ron was under the knife on Friday, Steve O'Sullivan was under the pump. It is incredible what a difference a single bad hole can make. SOS was flying during his round. As he arrived at the 12th tee SOS was on track to post a title winning score. He actually suggested the $12^{\text {th }}$ hole would be a good candidate for the longest drive hole and then proceeded to smoke his drive 292 meters straight down the middle of the fairway. He then pulled out his trusty 3 wood and knocked it long and straight towards the green. Unfortunatley rather than land on the green and set up an eagle putt, the ball bounced to the left and rolled into the bunker. SOS is famous for his inability to perform in the sand and on this occasion it was no different. From what looked like a hole which was going to produce an eagle chance or a simple tap in birdie, it rapidly turned into a 9 on the score card and a sand wedge being hurled 20 meters into the bushes. Evidently that score of 9 ended up being the difference between SOS pegging back several points on the Season Championship leaderboard and giving a few back to Big Mick. SOS finished the day with Nett 75 whereas even a par on the hole considering where he was for two shots and he would have been Nett 71 and finishing in $4^{\text {th }}$ spot and moving two points closer to holding the championship trophy aloft.

Stu Coops is all but gone from the points competition after yet another disappointing performance. Not even a practice round on Friday was enough to help him post a challenging score for the leaders to beat. Assuming Stu was allowed to count his Friday round instead of his Sunday score he would have only been a little bit better than what he delivered on Sunday. Stu started the day with a triple bogie on the first then racked up a Newell (Score of 10 or more) on the second hole. Although Stu played OK on the back nine stringing together 6 pars he still had a 9 on the $12^{\text {th }}$ hole which was more than enough to undo all of the good work he'd done.

Stu has lodged an application for his best scores over the two rounds to be considered as a valid round.

However even with a score of 79 off the stick Nett 64 made up of his best effort on each hole, Stu would still only just beat Brent Douglas's effort.

Brent had a very good day on Sunday, he bettered his career lowest score for Sunday Leave Pass Social Club and he has taken out his second monthly title from just 7 starts. If he continues at this rate by the time he gets to Tony MacIsaacs numbers he will have an incredible 39 career titles to his name. Which would be 38 more than Tony Mac has claimed from 136 starts.

A few people have lodged a formal protest to the match rules review committee and we have also seen a late rush on Leather Wedge nominations being directed at Brent because evidently he tends to play a shorter golf course than the rest of us. We are currently investigating these allegations and the photographic appears to be quite damning.


Evidently Brent tends to tee off from in front of the markers to give himself a headstart and be closer to the green. It would be understandable if it was a once off and could be attributed to an accident however from what his playing partners allege it was on all 18 holes.


Rick Turcinovic was also seen playing his shot from just in front of the tee markers on the first hole, however the only difference being that it was his second, third, and fourth shots which were being played from in front of the white tees. Rick opened up the fine jar tally with the very first shot of the day, when his drive only just fell off the tee and landed on the path beside him ( $\$ 5$ fine). Ricks second stroke was an airswing ( $\$ 2$ fine) his third shot we could not tell whether it was an airswing or whether he just clipped the ball because it did move very slightly ( $\$ 2$ fine) but that may have just been a reaction to the sound waves as he let launch with an earsplitting profanity which could be heard from the adjoining suburbs. ( $\$ 2$ fine) Before he played his $4^{\text {th }}$ stroke Rick changed his glasses. That must have worked because he finally made contact with the ball and it made a journey of 14 meters before it came to rest in the bushes.

Rick was in a hurry to get home so after 5 strokes in 14 meters it must have been very tempting to pack up his clubs and bag and head straight back to the car park and call it a day. There were plenty of golfers who found the going tough on Sunday. Although he was unable to attend on Sunday due to family commitments, there was still plenty of appearances from Newell. By definition a Newell is a score of 10 or more. Stu Coops, Todd Neilson, Barry Hemsley, Colin and Cameron Ross all had a Newell on the par five, $2^{\text {nd }}$ hole. It was in Highways absence that Colin Ewart took centre stage and racked up the most 10's by having a total of two Newells written on his score card for the day. In summary there were 9 Newells (Score of 10 or more) achieved on Sunday and interestingly Brendan MacIsaac didn't contribute to any of them.

There is a direct correlation between scoring a Newell and receiving nominations for the bush whacker award. It seems hitting the ball into the bushes is a sure way to increase your scores and it is little wonder that all of the guys who had a Newell on Sunday have featured prominantly in the voting for the Bush Whacker award over the last couple of weeks.


Cam Ross found himself in some incredibly difficult positions, it seemed as though Cam played more shots out of the bushes than he did from the fairways, considering how difficult he made his game it was amazing to see that he still managed to finish inside the top 10 place rankings.


Cam was not the only golfer to find himself rattling around in the scrub. Every where you looked around the Morack golf course you could see a blue shirt or probably more often than not flouro yello vested golfer trying to extricate his golf ball from out of the native flora. Anyone could be forgiven for thinking that the Bush Whacker award was a prestigious title and everyone was filing a case to try to win the trophy this year.


The thing about hitting the ball in the bushes is being able to identify your ball when it disappears into the wilderness. Especially after Big Mick was bumped up on the Leather Wedge nominations this month after accidently playing the wrong ball at Marysville (should have gone to specsavers) it was great to see a few of the biggest wrong ball hitting culprits starting off the round by marking their golf balls.


It is one thing to mark your ball but it doesn't stop those sneaky golfers from having multiple balls in their pockets. On the $12^{\text {th }}$ hole Stu Coops hit his white Titleist golf ball into the lake but then the next time his playing partners saw him standing over a shot he was suddenly hitting an orange bridgestone golf ball from
beside the water hazard. Stu is famous for walking around the course with pockets full of golf balls although changing from a white ball to an orange ball looked very suspicious. Although with a 9 on the score card it would appear that he must have taken the relevant penalty.

Mick Harper had no troubles finding his golf ball on the Par 5 fifteenth hole. He smashed a longest drive attempt 300 plus meters straight down the middle of the fairway. Mick was in the first group, so there was little chance of any of the following golfers being able to improve on the longest drive mark. Leigh MacIsaac swung as hard as he possibly could and unfortunately he ended up pulling his drive with a snap hook out onto the $12^{\text {th }}$ hole. Although he didn't win the longest drive, Leigh was advantaged in that he took the dog leg out of play and so long as he could launch his ball back over the trees he had a good chance of getting the ball back into play and into a good position.

Leigh hit the best 4 iron he has ever hit in his life, incredibly not only did his ball fly over the trees and back onto the fairway but it actually landed on the green 20 feet from the flag stick, giving him a very makeable eagle putt which would have given him 2 x eagles in 2 rounds. Although he missed the eagle, Leigh made a very simple 2 putt birdie which was one of only 6 birdies made for the day. Anthony Emmerson had a good day and made 2 birdies, slinky and Tony Grasso also made birds as did Shane Cumming who made an excellent birdie 4 on the 2 nd hole where most other golfers failed to perform. The $2^{\text {nd }}$ hole was the hardest hole for the day and averaged 7.3 strokes per golfer so to make a birdie was a big gain on the rest of the field. Naturally, Shanes birdie was enough to win him a couple of skins, which turned out to be quite fortunate because he was ripped off on the $18^{\text {th }}$ hole when an eagle 2 was still not good enough to win any skins at all. It is a rare event for any golfer to score 5 stableford points on a hole and one would be justified in expecting to win the skins jackpot in the process however on this instance Anthony Emmerson was able to make a birdie for 5 points on the same hole as Shane made his eagle so the result was the skins jackpotted and remained unclaimed.

Morack is currently redesigning the $18^{\text {th }}$ green, which means the hole is playing as a 235 meter par 4 with a temporary green. It was the perfect choice for NTP second shot as it gave every golfer a good chance to hit the green (mown fairway) with their $2^{\text {nd }}$ shot. What we didn't expect was for the nearest to pin marker to be left in the hole. Cider smashed his drive straight and long. The ball came to rest just a couple of meters off the green. Shane then took out the texas wedge and hit his ball as hard and straight as his mind would allow him to do. As the green was literally just a shorter mown section of the fairway, it was still long and furry and very very slow. Shanes ball never deviated, well it bounced this way and that way, jumped over a couple of divots, then ground to a rapid halt as it approached the hole. Fortunately there was just enough momentum for the ball to reach the cup and it dropped down into the bottom of the hole for an Eagle 2, which was enough to secure the six golf balls in the eagles nest (it restarted at 6 after Leighs eagle at Marysville) and Cider also won another ball for NTP second shot.

Greg Breasley also hit a firm second shot into the Par 3 fourth hole, however as the $4^{\text {th }}$ hole was a proper green and not just a temporary fairway his ball carried much more momentum. Greg actually hit his ball so hard into the flagstick that it dinted the pole and you could even see the dimple pattern of his golf ball in the black paint. Unfortunatley for Greg his ball didn't drop into the hole, instead it deflected off the pole and the best result Greg was able to make was a double bogie 5 .

Once Gregs ball smashed into it, the dint on the flag looked as though someone had taken a big bite out of the pole. One thing was for certain was that it wouldn't have been Cam Ross taking a bite out of it because he could not have possibly been very hungry. Evidently, Cam is the only golfer in the world who turns up to
play golf carrying his own packed lunch. Well not so much a packed lunch but all of the ingredients to make himself lunch when he gets hungry. Whereas most golfers head into the proshop for a pie and a drink at the half way turn, Cam on the otherhand just opens up the side zip of his golf bag and starts to make himself a sandwhich or four. Cams golf bag was filled with more stock than a bachelors pantry cupboard. He had a loaf of bread, butter, salami, tomato relish, lettuce, salad, cheese and even a packet of BBQ shapes for dessert.


With a staple diet like Cams it was a bit surprising to hear that it wasn't him who was clogged up inside and needing to duck into the bushes for a quick toilet stop. We have all heard of the latest trend of athletes who the media have branded the Pooh joggers. Well it seems in our group we have a variation of this sub species called the Golf Bogger. Evidently Brent Douglas couldn't hold on to his breakfast any longer so he ducked into the bushes on the fifth hole to empty his lunch box. The irony of the situation was that Brent walked into the bushes on the left hand side of the path to go to the toilet whereas on the right hand side of the path directly opposite him was a perfectly good operational toilet.


Brent not only 5\#@7 on the local flora and fauna, but he also 5\#@7 on the entire Sunday Leave Pass playing group. Brent finished the day 4 strokes ahead of his nearest rival and 7 strokes better than his handicap. It was a great result to have a win at Morack because perhaps it was his last hoorah. Brent is getting married on Saturday the $30^{\text {th }}$ November, so his golfing days are most likely numbered. Brent had to cancel his round at Marysville to pave the way for Wedding preparations and he and the entire Douglas clan were forced at the last minute to pull out of the golf trip by his bridezilla to attend the wedding; so it is pretty obvious who wears the pants in his relationship, so there is a good chance that his golf clubs will go into storage once she puts the ring on his finger and the thumb on his forehead.

Coming in second was Anthony Emmerson who blew his round with one bad hole, Egg should still have a smile on his dial after he finished the day with a 69 however a Newell on the $12^{\text {th }}$ hole was the difference between a good round and a great round.

Wayne James and Barry Hemsley have continued to climb higher and higher up the leaderboard with yet another good finish. Wayne finished in $3^{\text {rd }}$ place with Nett 70 and Barry finished in $4^{\text {th }}$ position despite playing off a handicap of under 30 for the first time in his golfing career. Barry has been a real improver this year and credits his progress to his inspiration and mentor Newell Richards, who once again finished in the top 5 . Newell had a slow start to the season however he is ramped up his game play in the second half of the 2019 season and is already talking about 2020 as his year to rise to the top and dethrone Big Mick if he manages to hold on to win the championship.

As a new member of the Social Club the Callaway Handicapping system is used to give the player a daily played to handicap for the first couple of rounds. Once they have played 3 rounds, they are given a temporary club handicap using the original AGU handicapping system. After 5 rounds they are then switched across to the current slope handicapping system.

The handicapper has taken to many golfers this month, slashing the handicaps of those who deserved it. Still many players received a bit of a bonus as the 2019 season quickly draws to a close. Brent Douglas was savaged for his Nett 65 and last 2.8 strokes before he got in the car to drive home. Anthony Emmerson lost 0.4 strokes and even Rick came in 0.2 strikes despite his terrible start to the day.

For those people interested in the mechanics of the handicapping system it can be best explained as the following.

To calculate a player's GA Handicap:

- you must firstly identify the player's most recent 20 scores,
- you then determine the 'Played To' value for each of these scores,
- you average the best 8 ' $\mathbf{P l a y e d} \mathrm{To}$ ' values,
- and finally you multiply this average by $\mathbf{0 . 9 3}$. The resultant figure (to one decimal place) is the player's GA Handicap.
* If a player's handicap record contains a lesser number than 20 scores, the number of scores used to calculate the player's handicap is as listed in the table below.
* There is no requirement for a player's most recent 20 scores to have been returned within a specific timeframe. For example, the most recent 20 scores may span a period of three years or they may span a period of three months.
* Once a player's handicap record contains 20 scores, the next score they return will result in the oldest of the existing 20 scores being removed (to be replaced by the new score).

Full Technical Procedure for Calculating a GA Handicap

STEP 1 - Use the table below to determine the number of scores to be included in the GA Handicap calculation:

## Number of Scores in Player's Handicap Scores to be Used in the Record Calculation

| 5 to 6 | Best/Lowest 1 |
| :---: | :---: |
| 7 or 8 | Best/Lowest 2 |
| 9 or 10 | Best/Lowest 3 |
| 11 or 12 | Best/Lowest 4 |
| 13 or 14 | Best/Lowest 5 |
| 15 or 16 | Best/Lowest 6 |
| 17 or 18 | Best/Lowest 7 |
| 19 or 20 | Best/Lowest 8 |

Note: When the handicap record contains more than 20 scores, the GA Handicap calculation uses the best 8 of the player's most recent 20 scores.


Take Warren Perrett for Instance. He has now played 8 rounds with the club and his Best round was 13 over par and his next best round once again at Dorset is 27 over par or better described as a combined score differential of 40 . When this value is divided by 2 and is then multiplied by 0.93 his official handicap is 18.6 which was rounded to 19.0 . If he had actually played 20 rounds and the scores listed above were his best 6 scores, then his handicap would actually be 33.25 . or rounded back to 33.3 .
