There were a few guys upset about being charged the extra \$5 for late payment but there is no excuse for late payment since everyone receives at least a minimum of two reminder emails and a text message prior to the due date. Players who fail to meet the deadline are charged a late payment levy of **\$5-00** on top of the original golf fee's. Anyone who finds it too difficult to make the EFT transfer on time is welcome to make a larger transfer and keep some money in credit for when they fail to make the payments on time.

Morack Golf Course Results

July

Given it is the middle of winter and the weather forecast was pretty grim, we were blessed with the conditions that Morack delivered. It may have been cold and a windy but at least for the majority of the day we were able to stay relatively dry. The Morack course is usually a track that sets up for some good scores, Peter Hutson won the round last year with Nett 67 however the scores this month were not quite as appealing.

The only player who can hold his head up with pride and say that he played well was Rick Turcinovic who has been inspired after a month of matrimonial celebrations as a result of him winning at Beacon Hills. So good has been the aphrodisiacal influence of the winners jacket that Rick played outside himself at Morack and the result was that he has gone back to back with an uncontested victory in July. Rick hit 103 Nett 71 to claim his second title in as many months. While Rick and Dale were sunning themselves on the beaches in Bali drinking cocktails and toasting to the good fortunes of sun shine and volcanic ash on the 26th July, the rest of us were chasing the little white thing all over a mud sodden paddock. It wasn’t uncommon to get a plugged ball or to be standing up to your knees in casual water, although surprisingly the greens were still running very fast.

The yellow vest did the rounds and was shared regularly amongst the players in almost every group, the fine jar was boosted by regular 4 putts and a couple of putts from on the green to off the green and even a 5x putt from highway who struggled despite the advantage of the round being played on his home course.

While most players struggled to come to terms with the speed of the greens, Stu Coops had his putter radar on. Despite some poor shots around the golf course Stu kept in the game by some great putting, he finished the front 9 with only 14 putts which included a four putt green on the fourth hole and even with a couple of stints with the yellow three putt monkey vest he only had a total of only 30 putts for the day.

Slinky showed his playing group how to keep the putting count to a minimum when he chipped in for a birdie 2 on the 16th hole and he also had a couple of near misses as a peppered the flag with every opportunity that presented itself. Tony Mac, Chris Sfiligoj and Greg Breasley also all had excellent chip ins, Big Ball Breasleys probably being the most noteworthy as it was a chip in for a ten on a par 4.

Big Mick managed to win two NTP titles with some excellent shots into the par 3 holes but on the other hand also posted his second worst score ever. Micks round of 94 had him in close contention for beer wenching duties especially after he posted a score of 8 with one putt on the easiest hole on the golf course. Mick hit a good shot down the 10th hole, his pitching wedge from the tee just missed the green to the right and would have otherwise won him his 3rd NTP award. His ball was laying nicely for an easy up and down or 4 at worst. Unfortunately for the big fella his flop shot was more of a "flop" than a "shot" and he left his ball still in the sand trap. He caught his next shot thin and it raced across the green and ran into the bunker on the other side. He bladed his next shot into the lip of the hazard before charging another shot back into the bunker where he had started from. The funny thing was that in his haste to chase his errant shot Mick hadn't raked the bunker and as luck should have it when his ball rolled back into it the sand it finished embedded in his own blast mark divot. When Mick finally got onto the green he made a one putt but the damage was done as his five over par had depleted more than half of his handicap all on the one hole.

Chris Sfiligoj has been a long time stranger to the club, we haven't seen him since the 2014 golf trip and after his performance on Sunday we might not see him again until the 2015 golf trip. Chris posted his worst ever score with the Sunday leave pass group, he had 125 shots and it was only the fact that he improved on his first front nine score of 68 by 9 shots that saved him from being crowned the July beer wench. In amongst Chris' 2x nine's, 2x ten's, an 11 and a 13 Chris did also had a few very good holes.

All of the betting prior to the round was on Newell to take home the monthly title. In the days leading up to Sundays golf, Highway actually frequented Morack on 23x separate occasions, distributing his time allocation between the practice driving range, golf lessons with the Morack Pro Brian Fitzgerald and his regular jaunts out on the Morack course. So heavy was his investment into Morack this month that one of his other golf suppliers actually went bankrupt due to the sudden loss of their guaranteed regular income.

This action has been caused by suppliers going into receivership, and the loss of many thousands of dollars, which has resulted in extreme financial hardship, therefore we are unable to keep the doors open any longer without Newell's regular income.

To customers who still have lessons remaining - We will have one simulator set up at home (back where it all started) in 4 week's time for those remaining lessons to be redeemed. Customers that are on direct debit, "please note" your direct debit contract with us has been cancelled, *effective immediately* - and there will be no cancellation fee.

This e-mail address and the business mobile number [REDACTED] will be running for 4 weeks to take bookings for the remaining lessons, after that time it will cease. If you have any questions please do not hesitate to contact us directly via this e-mail address or the phone number above.

We want to thank you all for your time with us and apologize sincerely for any inconvenience, disruption or upset this has caused any of you. The last thing we wanted, was to close the doors and upset all of our customers and some very close friends that we have made along the way. However after a long and careful look at our business it became very obvious that we had to take this action.

Newell was able to prove that practice doesn't always make perfect. His scores were not reflective of a player who is playing golf seven days per week, in fact his playing partner Peter put it down to the supposition that he may even be fatigued and was playing too much golf.

It should be said that of the 18x Newell's (scores of 10 or more) posted at Morack, Highway can only lay claim to one of them and his score of 11 on the second hole, is nothing by comparison to the 15 marked on the card of Rob Underwood, the 14 racked up by Colin or the score of 13 written on the scorecard for Burnsie.

Greg Parsons basically cost himself a monthly title when he unraveled what was otherwise a good round with his blow out on the fourteenth hole which cast him 12 shots to complete a 342 meter walk.

It should be said that conditions were very tough on Sunday. The fairways and bunkers were sodden and heavy and the cold temperatures and strong winds made golfing very difficult, consequently the spread of score was very high it ranged from 91 to 135 at an average of over 109. When you compare that to Centenary Park where the average score was only 99 and that by reputation is a far more difficult course and has a par of 72 compared to 70 at Morack.

Newcomer Barry Hemsley struggled to keep his head above water as the conditions deteriorated and as the day went on. In fact on the 12th hole he was forced to play a shot from the lake with Barry actually standing in the water as he played his shot back out onto the fairway and his effort commendable. It was pretty much like a re-enactment of Karl Winters walking on water trick back in April at Devils Bend and it had the same successful outcome. Interestingly we haven't actually seen Karl since that fateful day at Devils Bend so we are starting to wonder if he didn't actually drown after playing his ball from the middle of the lake.

REMINDER HOW 3 PUTT MONKEY GAME WORKS



*As part of the putting competition this year, as a brainchild suggestion from Paul Blizzard we have introduced the Three Putt Monkey game. At the start of each round every group will be given a flouro yellow 3 Putt Monkey vest and whenever a person has a **3 putt or worse** that player must put on the 3 Putt Monkey Vest and wear it until another player in the group has a **3 putt or more**. The player wearing the 3 putt Monkey vest at the completion of the 18th hole will be required to chip in an additional \$2 into the fine jar. If multiple players have a **3 putt or worse** the player who was last into the hole wins the vest irrespective of whether the other player before them had a **3 putt, four putt or even a seven putt**. The furthest player from the hole should always putt first on the green and that player is deemed as in control and therefore has the option of marking their ball if they miss the putt or putting out. If they chose to putt out and then the following person three putts then the last person to putt out gets the vest.

Despite its reputation as one of the easier golf course on the Sunday Leave Pass fixture the handicapper has been left with no other choice but to give back a few some to the field this month. Only Rick Turcinovic had a downward adjustment to his handicap whereas more than 3 shots were added across the group. Big Ball Breasley's run of bad form had the most significant change with his handicap blowing out by 1.1 shots overnight. Congratulations to Nigel Stone who has been issued an official Sunday Leave Pass Handicap after completing his third round with the social club. Nigel will be playing off 21.3 next month at Werribee.




