Congratulations to Cliff and the Supercoach who both had amazing rounds with the flat stick, Supercoach had 26 putts and Cliffy had 27 taps. On a day where the pins were cut on the side of cliff faces of the green and when the monkey vest claimed 89 three putts, 6x four putts and two five putt greens, to have a putting score in the 20's is a commendable effort.

Barry Hemsley was not quite so economical with the putter, he had nine putts in just two consecutive holes, and finished the day with 42 putts, sadly Barry wore the yellow vest from the 4th hole right through to the 18th hole.

Slinky kept has putt count down to a minimum by hitting bombs into the flag stick. On the 4th hole he chipped his ball to within a meter to make an easy tap in. 

As a new member of the Social Club the Callaway Handicapping system is used to give the player a daily played to handicap for the first couple of rounds. Once they have played 3 rounds they are given a temporary club handicap using the original AGU handicapping system. After 5 rounds they are then switched across to the current slope handicapping system.



This system is used for determining fair allowances for social golf events that attract novices or occasional golfers. A player's Callaway handicap is determined after each round by deducting from his/her 18 hole gross score the scores of the worst individual holes during the first 16 holes of the round.

In the computation of handicaps under this system:

- -No hole may be scored at more than twice its par,
- half strokes count as a whole,
- the 17th and 18th holes are never deducted,

For example if a player scores 99 on the day their handicap would be calculated as the sum total of their (3 worst holes) +1

If a player scores 82 on the day their handicap would be calculated as the sum total of their (worst + 1/2 the 2nd worst hole) -1

If a player scores 120 on the day their handicap would be calculated as the sum total of their (five worst holes) +2

After 3 rounds they will be allocated a temporary handicap using the old AGU handicapping formula and then after 5 rounds they are elevated onto the official Slope handicapping system which was use thereafter for all club competitions.
