

MOST IMPROVED PLAYER



This prize takes into account the player who is believed to have made the most significant improvement in their game over the duration of the year.

WORST IMPROVED PLAYER



This prize takes into account the player who is believed to have made the most significant downturn in their game over the duration of the year.

LEATHER WEDGE



The player who is best able to manipulate the rules of golf to help to improve their scorecard.

Actions such as kicking the ball out of the bushes with your foot when nobody looking. Not counting a short missed putt because you were only mucking around. Dropping another ball where yours was lost without taking the relevant penalties and creative accounting (just not counting all of your shots.)

ANGRY MAN AWARD

Morack Golf Course Results

November

The last game of the home and away season has produced an eclectic range of results. It was a case of the good, the bad and the ugly.

The good came in the form of Trevor and SOS who ripped the golf course apart on the front nine. SOS was actually only a couple over par on the turn but then he made the fatal mistake of getting himself a celebratory beer from the pro-shop which broke his momentum and he dumped 12 shots on the back nine.

Gerard did the exact opposite to SOS. He went out in 48 strokes and then came home with an impressive 37 on the more difficult back nine.

Peter Hutson had six pars and in a brilliant display with the putter and driver and finished the round in 2nd place with a respectable 92 off the stick. Peter played so well that he even forgot to mention for the first time in 6 months that **“he bought a jeep.”**

Trevor shot the lowest score for the day with 84 off the stick. Nett 69. Trevor’s round included 2 birdies and 5 pars and had it not been for an 8 and three, x3 putt greens he could have had a career best performance. Trevor thrived in the company of good fellow golfers and was even blasting the ball past Big Mick who had a day he would like to forget although he probably won’t even remember it ever happened anyway.

Although it didn’t count as an ace on the scorecard, in an extraordinary shot on the par 3, 6th hole, Newell Richards managed to get his ball through a hole in the fence when he hit a shank straight into the safety wire next to the tee. By some stroke of luck or celestial intervention the ball went through the fence with only the slightest resistance, it bounced off a tree and ricocheted forward past the ladies tee sparing Newell the humiliation of a \$5 fine for failing to hit the ball past the squatters tees.

Newell had openly stated that his goal was to improve by a shot a hole, (18 shots) on his last score at Ringwood. All of the signs were there for this to be a real possibility, so it was a little devastating when his first three holes were scores of 10,15 & 12. To his credit Newell counted every shot and continued on his merry way, he even scored two pars for a collect of 6 skins which will help his odds of winning a prize in the 2103 raffle draw.

Except for the first three holes which we won't mention again for fear of embarrassing him and not taking into consideration his score of 11 and a 13 and another 10 and another 12 it was a pretty good round for Newell. He showed some exciting potential as good partner for the Ambrose competition on the Sunday of the golf trip. Newell smashed a drive 300 meters down the 11th hole leaving his playing partners scratching their heads how someone can one minute be so good and the next minute be so bad.
