Morack Golf Course Results September

Rumour has it, that a few of our members are getting a bit upset about being cyber bullied because they are regularly being mentioned in derogatory ways in the newsletters each and every month. So for the September issue I will endeavor to not mention their names in the publication for fear of an official complaint being sent to consumer affairs. I will ensure that the results are broadcast accurately this month without specifically mentioning those concerned persons and I trust the pending bullying lawsuit against the Sunday Leave Pass Social Club and our associated committee will therefore be dropped.

The Morack golf course is a different monster when played in the wind. On what is normally an easy scoring course the strong gusty winds raised havoc amongst the field and the result was a collection of scores more reflective of a round of golf at Rosebud, Cape Shank or Growling Frog than they were of playing on an easy track like Morack

One player stood out from the rest of the crowd, he shot a brilliant 3 under Par Nett 67 smashing the rest of the field. His nearest rival was Tony Grasso who was 7 shots back on Nett 74. It was an easy victory for the September winner who played a blemish free round. He had the lowest gross score for the day, even out scoring, the single figure handicappers Gerard, Mick and Shane Cumming who are all supposedly 11 strokes better than the 2014 September Morack title holder.

While one player excelled, the rest of the group struggled to contend with the, furry & bumpy greens and the cyclonic cross and head winds. The fine jar was topped up to the point of bursting as we reached the \$500 mark in fines for the year. The second green alone managed to rack up \$10 worth of fines with a total of 5 players having a 4 putt by failing to judge the speed on the large, recently scarified putting surface.

The score cards were littered with Newells (holes with a score of 10 or more) although highway himself only accounted for one of them. Karl Winters contributed his fair share of double digit scores; he racked up 34 of his 117 strokes in just 3 holes, including a 13 on the par 4, third hole. Karl is blaming his demise on the new Sunday Leave

Pass/ Woodtech golf balls he bought before the game, however it should be said that the player who won the round this month was using exactly the same brand of golf balls and he never looked like playing a bad shot for the entire

Golf is a game of fortunes and often one lucky break can set you off for the dream round or on the contrary a touch of bad luck, an unlucky bounce or a bad lie and it can set the tone for the rest of the day. This was exactly what happened to poor Karl when on just the 3rd hole his drive caught an overhanging branch and landed in the rough. His ball finished in a clearing with an open line of sight to the green

the only problem was that it actually landed in a nest of leaves and branches and the ball was actually perched on some twigs 10cm above the ground. Two air swings a barrage of profanities and then finally a belated unplayable lie decision later he was able to knock his ball back on to the fairway and complete the hole with a devastating unlucky 13 scribbled onto his score card.

Karl was not the only one to post a worst-ever round of golf. One of our regular golfers broke the 100 mark for the first time ever, but in reverse. For most golfers breaking a hundred is a real land mark event and it usually paves the way for a prosperous golfing future. This time however the player in concern has gone the other way. Reputed as our next single figure golfer in the waiting, with a fluid natural golf swing and brilliant ball control it was a real shock to see him finish in the beer wench position with 105 off the stick. With such a poor performance in September he was forced to hand back a large share of his footy tipping prize money winnings to pay his dues to the fine jar which was a shame as he was contemplating using the \$63 he had won in the 2014 footy tipping competition to put down as a deposit for the Rich River golf trip. Let's just hope it was a one off blemish for him and not a sign of his golfing prospects going forward.

Congratulations to Ron Parson who finished in third place despite having three 9's on his scorecard and one of those was on a par 3. Ron played 14 very consistent holes and had it not been for some momentary lapses of concentration he might well have robbed this month's winner of his maiden Sunday Leave Pass monthly title victory.

Slinky continues to show a good run of form this year, he has missed quite a few rounds due to family and work commitments however he is still at the pointy end of the point's championship leader board. Slinky actually has the best average place finish according to the wood & spoon rankings. To put it in perspective Slinky averages a 6th place finish every time he turns up to play (the best in the club) whereas the current leader Stu Coops averages a place finish of 8.9 and the Morack champion who is currently running in third place in the points championship tally, despite playing 2 less rounds, averages a place finish at 7.75th position. Highway (Newell) on the other hand is striving to etch his name into the Sunday Leave Pass record books as the 2014 Wood & Spoon title holder and is currently on track to do so averaging a place finish of 20.00 even after finishing in 6th place this month.

Not surprisingly he played a brilliant shot onto the green, but when he replaced it and played his real ball the shot was nowhere near as successful.

It was a tough day for Gerard, he hit an uncharacteristic 93 off the stick so imagine his distress when his ball mysteriously disappeared from the middle of the fairway because John had claimed it as his own. When Gerard called him up on it, Slinky was adamant he hadn't hit Gerard's ball and when he was asked what ball he was playing the answer was too simple for words. **"Mine is a round, white one."**

Stu Coops copped a penalty when he elected to putt while he was still waiting for his partners to chip the ball onto the green. Stupidly Stu had left the pin in the hole and so when his putt crashed into the flag stick the resulting penalty was an unfriendly reminder that you should always wait for your playing partners and not to be so rushed to get back to the car park for a cold beer and a sausage.

With the gale force winds at his back Ben Nichol managed to hit his four iron through the back of the green on the 5^{th} hole. His ball ran across 2x fairways and a tee box, and he was left with a 160 meter shot back to get his ball near the green.

On the same hole Stu Coops hit his 3 wood from the tee, and the ball just missed the flag stick and came to rest on the green setting him up with an eagle putt. So determined is Stu to win the putting competition for 2014 that he actually putted his ball from on the green for one, to off the green for two, just so that he could make a 2 putt par by playing his third shot from the fringe and there for he did not have to count it as a putt.

Ron Parsons decided that the flag stick was a too small a target to use to stop the ball. He elected instead to use Shane Cumming's knee. Ron had hit a ball similarly to Ben Nichols' and it would have finished 30 to 40 meters through the back of the green had it not been for the generosity of Shanno who put his leg in the way and stopped the ball in its tracks. Ron was able to go onto make an up and down and was therefore only too happy to buy Shane a beer after the round as a gesture of thanks. Unfortunately for Ron and the rest of us the beer was actually warm because Shane had used all the ice from the esky to try to stop the bruising and swelling from his aching leg.

Tony Mac nearly got revenge for Shane on the very next hole when he hit the ball through Ron's legs. The funny thing was that Ron was actually standing beside the tee and Tony's shot was a blatant shank which shot out at right angles 90 degrees from the direction he was intending to hit the ball. There was much debate on whether Tony was up for a fine. Not for failing to hit past the ladies tee's because that was a given, the controversy was whether he needed to pay a second fine for failing to hit has ball past the men's markers.

Congratulations to the newly crowned September title holder, so confident in his performance was he that he made the call early and had requested that he receive his prize in the form of Raffle tickets for the end of year prize draw. Tony Grasso finished in 2nd place followed by Ron Parsons and Slinky. Somehow Stu Coops managed to fall into 5th place despite shooting a horror 52 on the front nine.






