# **Amstel Results**

It was nice to see some good weather again this month at Amstel, it is a difficult but good quality golf course. The perfect weather was not accompanied with perfect golf, the majority of the field submitted some fairly big scores with half of the players managing to post at least one double figure score.

For those that haven't played at Amstel, the course has tonnes of bunkers surrounding the greens and even bunkers on the fairways. Hitting to the greens was very difficult, and it is near on impossible to avoid not landing in the sand. I am proud to say that I wasn't the only person who was seen walking backwards and forwards across the green continuously hitting from one bunker to the other.

The only person who went unscathed was none other than our old mate Daniel De Marinis who won at Amstel for the second year in succession. Daniel was the only player to shoot less than his handicap, assisted by some fantastic putting he hit the lowest score for the day (88) giving him a Nett 72 and 10 points elevating him to equal leader in the points championship.

With Rick, Darren & Gerard all hitting a Nett 75, it was a bottleneck for 2<sup>nd</sup> place. A three-way count back was required to decide who got 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> position. Of the three players Darren had the best score on the back nine (20 points) so he was allocated 2<sup>nd</sup> Place, Gerard had 18 stableford points whereas Rick scored 16 points so the positions and rankings were issued in that order. Stuey Cooper rounded out the top 5 he had a Nett 80.

Shot of the day was a tough decision. Dale hit a brilliant shot within only a few feet of the flag to win the Nearest to pin on the Par 3, 5<sup>th</sup> hole. To his credit he also made the Putt for a birdie 2. On that same hole Greg could easily win shot of the day he hit 9 excellent shots in a row, each of them good enough in it's own right to be voted the best of the day. Jamie holed out from a shot deep in the bunker and hit several others very close to the

flag. For Fitzy, Greg, Damijan and Steve it was just good to get back to the car where the beer in the esky was cold.

When players finish with the same Nett score the points distribution and place rankings are calculated using a formula that takes into consideration the total Stableford points scored on the back nine.

E.g. Darren, Gerard and Rick all had a score of 75 but Darren scored 20 stableford points on the back nine, compared to Gerard who had 18 points, and Rick 16 points therefore That is the order that they finished.

With Daniel, Gerard, Rick and Stuart all scoring well on the points breakdown, the battle for season's trophy is coming to an interesting finale. Only 3 points separate these top 4 players so their place finishing on the Golf trip will determine who wins the 2006 championship. It has been suggested that all 4 of them play together at Tocumwal on Saturday to add the extra pressure to perform well. We are currently investigating the options on what to do if the year ends with a tie, it is becoming a real possibility. We will probably have an 18 hole play off in December otherwise the other option is to make the decision based on who has the lowest average place ranking for 2006.
