

## **Rich River Golf Trip Results**



#### **GOLF TRIP 2013**

There is a famous, age old saying, which was a rule created to protect the innocent or guilty "what happens on the footy trip stays on the footy trip". So it is fortunate for me that this was by definition a golf trip so we can spill the dirt on all who got themselves into trouble over the weekend.

That was the theory anyway however the reality is that after being forced by Peter Hutson to crack open the first can at 830am on Friday morning I have very little recollection of the events thereafter so this year's golf trip blurb will be more analytical of the golf scores than a regurgitation of the trials and tribulations of individual people at Echuca.

If that wasn't enough he also managed to win the heavily sought after slab of bourbon in the end of year prize raffle draw and the Champion of Champions Blue Jacket as well. In essence he finished the golf trip with a green from ear to ear.







The Champion of Champions competition was played off between all of the players who won a monthly competition during the year; the champion of champions is the player who has the best score from all of the monthly winners who attended the golf trip. This competition was played off over 9 mystery holes on the Saturday competition with the player who scored the most stableford points taking out the title and adorned the coveted winner's jacket.

The Highway man (Newell) actually came very close to taking home two of the major trophies from the end of year trip. In the four rounds he has played this year Newell racked up a total of 14 Skins holes which was a brilliant effort considering that the winner of the Skins Championship Steve Powne actually played a total of 10x rounds for the season and only accumulated a total of 16 skins.

Grumpy also mad a last minute charge for the skins prize. He claimed a 5x hole jackpot haul with his birdie on the 16<sup>th</sup> hole at on the East Course at Rich River which moved him into second place with a seasons total of 15 skins, and he came ever so close to a Steve Bradbury like, come from behind finish.

Phil Plane has had a stellar season in 2013. He had a convincing victory at Ringwood this year and was highly recognized by his peers as the most improved player for the season. Phil received a total of 31 votes in the player's choice awards ballot for the most improved player which was a tally of 18 votes more than Rick Turcinovic and Greg Breasley who were his nearest rivals. Phil was unlucky to lose the Champion of Champions trophy on a count back from Gerard but he looks like he will be a very strong competitor in the new year and who knows he might even give Trevor the bushranger Adair a run for his money for the 2014 seasons championship points or at least make it difficult for Trevor along the way.

At the other end of the spectrum it was Tony MacIsaac who polled strongly in the player's choice awards for the Least Improved Player. T. Mac has had a tough 12 months and is looking forward to turning around his poor form with some solid rounds in 2014 after he has been fixed up by the golf Professionals at MGA with the lesson he won for being the worst player in the year. Tony needs all of the help he can get because the Handicapper has been very tough on him this year and refuses to give him any extra on his handicap despite turning in some very ordinary scores.

At one stage during the Beer & Barocca Shield Ambrose Tony's partner had contributed 8 of the first nine drives, meaning tony need to add at least 5x drives to the scorecard on the back nine. Despite failing to hit the ball past the ladies tee on the par three 13<sup>th</sup> hole it was decided to take Tony's drive. On the 14<sup>th</sup> hole when Tony's partner hit his ball into the lake he was able to contribute another drive to the team. When both Tony and his partner managed to hit their drives into the lake on the 15<sup>th</sup> hole and the drive was allocated to T Mac it was decided that Tony might get in his required 6x drives after all. Needless to say Tony and Stu finished well down the ladder on the Ambrose competition but at least Tony managed to get his 6 drives on the card by the end of the day even if none of them could be considered a benefit to the teams score.

As for the rest of the field and their golf, the final finishing place rankings on Saturday, Sunday and the champion of Champions were as follows:

The Social club runs as a neutral organization and all of the money we raise each year is spent on prizes and we start each year with basically a zero \$\$\$\$ bank balance. As was to be expected the fine jar kitty was drunk dry in the early hours of Sunday morning and the proceeds of the club activities which includes green fees, and beverage & merchandise sales were invested in the form of prizes for the end of year raffle draw. In total we had more than \$2000 worth of prizes to give away. The spoils were spread over more than 20 of our members.

The raffle is conducted by issuing every player a ticket for each round of golf that they play over the course of the year. If a player wears the Sunday Leave Pass Club shirt to the round they are given a second raffle ticket. We also run an 18x hole skins competition where every hole is worth one raffle ticket and a player wins raffle tickets for scoring a better stableford score than the rest of the field. In the skins competition whenever 2 or more players have the best score on a hole the raffle tickets carry over and jackpot until a unique hole-winner is achieved. Some players had some significant Jackpots where they won 6 or more skins at the one time. This dramatically increases the number of raffle tickets a player has but at the end of the day the raffle all comes down to chance.

As a matter of fairness a player is only entitled to take home one prize no matter how many times their name is drawn in the raffle. A player is entitled to upgrade to a better prize if their name comes out again and the lesser prize is redrawn. In order to qualifier for the Major Prizes a player must have played at least 6 rounds with the club or be in attendance at the Golf Trip to claim the prize.

Congratulations to all of the winners. It was a real love fest in the raffle this year with many players accepting a lesser prize because they were happy with what they had. Steve Powne accepted a golf hit in exchange for a golf bag. Greg Breasley knocked back drivers, hybrid clubs, golf bags and even a slab of bourbon so that he could keep his umbrella and Dale Robinson was so content with his new Odyssey putter that he passed up a set of Cleveland irons the major prize. A special thanks to all of those guys for their generosity and social responsibility. It made me proud to have these guys as members of the club. Well done to you all for your selfless attitudes.
