So I am **10cm** from the hole for 4. At that point, I decided to one handed tap the ball in. It missed. Bugger!!!

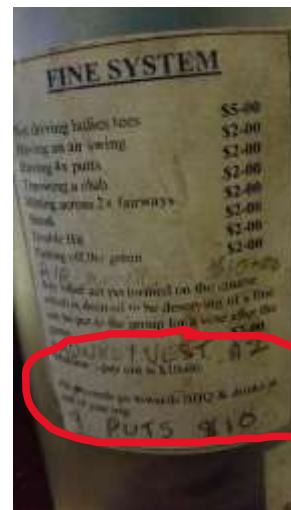
I tried again and missed. Double bugger!!!
