2016 Point After the Shamozzle last year at the Ringwood course, where the course in abysmal condition and the golf was comparable, 2009 was a ripper. What a day it was. The sun was shining, the greens and fairways for the middle of Winter by anyone's standards were in great condition, and what's more we had a fantastic turnout with 25 participants playing some very good golf. It was nice to see some good scores on the table, in fact Adam Coopers Nett 84 which would have placed him in the top 10 last month at Results Beacon Hills, was only enough to land him in 25th place and 20 shots behind the leader.

Stuart Kluge shot out of the starter's blocks. His round, shooting 74 off the stick was a sight to be seen and one not to be forgotten for a long time. He hit 15 greens in regulation and never missed a fairway from the tee for the entire day. He played a round of golf that a touring pro would have been proud of and smashed his personal best score by 9 shots. In one sense Stu was unlucky because he was penalized for his consistency. Despite having an official VGA handicap of 13 Stu was forced under the Callaway system to accept a Callaway Handicap of 2, consequently his incredible round was only just able to sneak into the top 10 so he didn't receive the just rewards that he deserved.

Mike Harper, Paul Blizzard, Roger Powne, and Alistair Bayer, all posted scores in the low to mid 80's, obviously the course leant it self to the opportunity to score well and some good golf must have been played around the Ringwood layout.

It turns out that the Supercoach does have a positive influence on people's golf but not in the way he would like.
