

Ringwood Golf Course Results October

Well it has finally happened, after being at the top of the leaders board for pretty much the entire season, Mick Harper has finally been dethroned. Over the past few months Tony Grasso senior has been slowly chipping away at the point's deficit and he has finally made his way to the top at the perfect time, with only the one round to go. Tony has been spending every spare waking moment at the driving range practicing over the past few weeks, much to the benefit of Tony Junior who is also looking a much more rounded & consistent player and he has never spent so much quality time with his dad. Tony senior has set his entire focus on winning the 2012 seasons championship trophy so on Saturday night he was in bed by 800pm just to make sure he wasn't tired for the big day at Ringwood. On the contrary Big Mick was out on the grog until the early hours of Sunday Morning, in fact he was still trying to find his way home from a friends' wedding reception at 8-00am. Mick had literally only just staggered in through the front door with only just enough time to get changed out of his Tuxedo before his ride arrived to take him to the golf course and consequently he was an incoherent mess with Bourbon literally leaking out of the pores of his skin when he set foot on the first tee. It was little wonder that the Big Fella failed to live up to his usually high standards, and owing to a mind shattering hangover, he hacked his way around the golf course looking more like a normal Sunday Leave Pass member rather than a single figure handicap player. He hit shanks, topped the ball, 3x putted regularly and at one point he nearly decapitated Steve O'sullivan when his approach to the 6th green was so far off target that it landed on the 7th tee.

It wasn't a very successful day for Mick, he finished in 17th position, and uncharacteristically he was even seen with a soft drink rather than a can of Jim Beam in his hand at the completion of his round. All I can say is it must have been one hell of a party on Saturday night. To make matters worse Neil Philips won the longest drive competition. Neil was happy to accept the prize that is usually side aside as for the big hitting Mick Harper and to rub salt in the wound he boasted that the drive was an OK one but he could probably have gone further with a 5 iron using a hockey slap.

Neil may have won the longest drive prize but the longest shot for the day would have to go to Fitzy who's ball end up somewhere near Frankston after he plucked the ball too cleanly out of the sand on the 12th hole and his ball sailed over the boundary fence before bouncing twice on the east link freeway and landing in the tray of a workman's ute bound for the Mornington peninsula. It was always going to be a difficult day for Fitzy who had to dust the cobwebs off the golf clubs after a nine month layoff. Right from the get-go he knew he was in trouble especially when his first practise swing accidently struck his ball and it took off like a rocket towards the pro-shop, fortunately for the proshop and unfortunately for everyone else, it smashed into a stone retaining wall and ricocheted back across the path narrowly missing no less than three different people during its journey. It was a sign

of things to come, the usually consistent Fitzzy hacked his ball around the course losing 6 or 7 golf balls including 3x in the water for a score of nine on the short Par 3, eighth hole.

Stu Cooper had ball control issues of his own. Having won at Dorset with a Nett 61 the pressure was on for him to continue his run of good form. You would have expected after having had a lesson at MGA on Saturday morning and then hitting 250 balls on the driving range his swing would have been perfectly primed to tear the short, open, Ringwood course layout apart. Not so! Stu was terrible, he failed to hit the ball past the ladies tee on the 4th hole, he topped 5 shots in a row, he duffed and skinned, shanked, three putted and we don't recall him ever hitting the fairway that he was aiming for. In fact the only ball he struck cleanly for the entire day was his shot out of the bunker on the 9th hole. Unfortunately the objective for a bunker shot is to strike the sand beneath, not the actual ball and consequently it came out too hot, flew across the green, landed on the walking path and then bounced over a hedge row before landing on the practice putting green sending a poor unsuspecting Chinese man running for cover.

The strong winds often played havoc on the golf balls flight path and the result was most players found it difficult to post a respectable score. Chris Sfiligoj came closest to mastering the conditions and was rewarded with a top 10 finish and two nearest to pin holes to his name. Chris's tactic was pretty simple; wherever possible he kept the ball low and therefore out of the wind. On the eighth hole Chris achieved his nearest to pin prize by hitting his 5 iron along the ground from the tee all the way to where it came to rest on the green. According to witnesses the ball be-headed at least 47 worms, knocked over an ants nest and shaved a line of grass all the way along the rough section of the fairway. Apparently it was the worst shot Chris had played for the day and it was just lucky there was enough momentum for the ball to roll off the bank of the bunker and somehow finish up on the putting surface. It goes to show that it is not "how you get there", but the fact that "you got there" that is the most important part, and the club history records will always credit Chris as the winner of the Nearest to Pin title irrespective of it actually being a crappy shot. Even his approach to the 16th wasn't much better. It was only the 5 degree fall in elevation from tee to green that enabled Chris' ball to make it into the air at all. It appears as though it must have been the nice Sfiligoj's lucky day, since his ball negotiated it's way past, through and over the huge sandy drainage trenches that had been cut into the fairway and once again his ball rolled down onto the green coming to rest within 10 feet from the pin setting up a birdie putt and rewarding him with an unbeatable Nearest to Pin location. It was an impressive result for Chris especially since, previous to his, less than ordinary stroke, there had been some good looking shots played by Steve Powne and Steve O'sullivan which appeared to be heading straight for the middle of the green but both got caught up in the groundskeepers mess and failed to go any further.

At least Chris hit the green which is more than can be said for Ben Nichol and Tony MacIsaac who both managed to hit their balls into the Basketball stadium on the 16th hole. Bens hook smashed into the side wall of the building complex and disappeared never to be seen again, and Tony's shot was even worse and it actually landed on the roof.

Whilst many guys were struggling to cope with the windy conditions, Ron Parsons was having a field day. Ron whizzed around the course with a faultless round. He broke the illustrious century barrier, shaved 1.3 shots off his handicap and earned himself 15 championship points with a very impressive Nett 64. Ron has been very close to the winner's podium a few times this year, so it was nice to see him win his second career title especially since his last win was at Centenary Park in May 2007.

Dale Robinson has finally returned to some good form, he shot the same score as Mick Harper, however his 88 off the stick was good enough to see him into outright second position with Nett 70. Rumours are circulating, that Dale put together a good round because he was getting a bit nervous. It may not be a coincidence that just as the players choice voting nominations have opened up, he has posted a good score to try to avoid getting nominations for the least improved player. It has been blatantly obvious up to this point that Dale's 2012 performance has not been a shade on the brilliance he produced to win the seasons championship in 2011.

Slinky & Steve Powne both featured strongly in the points this month. Slinky shot 93 off the stick and Steve P. made the long drive back from Eildon worthwhile since he finished in 4th place with Nett 73. Tony Grasso senior proved

Paul McRedmond debuted with the social club, by shooting the lowest Gross score (87). Although Paul was allocated a Callaway handicap of 13, much of his stroke play and the quality of his short game were reflective more of a player who should be off a handicap of 8 or 9 than off 13.
