MOST IMPROVED PLAYER

Ringwood Golf Course Results

October

It's been a while since we have seen the names Mark Fitzpatrick and Adam Cooper on the scoreboard and hopefully the temporary re-allocation of their Sunday Leave Pass gave them a taste of the good old days and what life away from the ball and chain is like. Perhaps Sunday reminded them what fun you can have one Sunday per month in the company of 20 plus other blokes. The guys certainly must have made full use of the time away from the family and handbrake since for the first time since 2006 when Burnsie and Lukey Dumbrell had an "I can drink more than you can drink" bender the bar was actually drunk dry.

The bar profits were no thanks to the Supercoach who didn't even turn up to play golf again this month. It wasn't his best result but congratulations to Chris for giving it a try. One of our golfers did have a personal best on Sunday and deserves all of the accolades he is given. Phil Plane shot his lowest ever score with the Social Club to claim is third career title. Phil played an inspired round of golf finishing with 93 off the stick Nett 63 beating his previous personal best score of 99 by a landslide. Phil hit the ball beautifully and finished only 13 strokes behind the low marker Big Mick Harper who was even the recipient of some sledging and some coaching advice from Phil when a few of his drives didn't go according to plan.

For example on the first hole when Mick Harper skied his driver over the trees and his ball landed on the eighth green, Phil smashed his drive straight down the middle of the fairway. Even at that early stage in the day Phil actually had the courage to go over to the Big Fella and say to Mick "I think the problem is you are standing too close to the ball after you have hit it."

The advice must have helped Mick or at least got him very angry because by the time he got on to the back nine, he was always standing further away from the ball than everyone else after he hit it his driver out of site. Mick drove through the green on the 285 meter Par 4 tenth hole and on the longest drive 14th hole Mick claimed the longest drive prize and nearly the nearest to pin as well with a 300 meter plus launch down the

middle of the fairway. Mick was so proud of his long drive on the 14th hole that after wrote his name “TOOL” on the Long Drive marker and then he also even had the cheek to sign his autograph on the golf flag as a permanent memento of his visit to Ringwood.



There was a bit of controversy over Micks long drive and Trevor and Fitzy have both thrown Micks name in the ring as a possible candidate for the Leather Wedge award for 2013. Evidently the point of conjecture was the fact that although the ball was slap bang in the middle of the fairway and only 5 meters from the front of the green, the actual area where Micks ball landed was not a part of the fairway or on the cut surface and therefore technically ineligible for the longest drive prize. Trevor claims that his ball was actually hit further than Micks ball but because he is not a cheat he didn't bother putting his name on the longest drive marker as he believes in is not in the spirit of the game to claim a prize that you are not rightfully entitled too.

With the strong trailing wind there were some powerful & long strokes played. Despite being asleep in the scorer's hut suffering from a severe hangover just minutes before he hit off, Grumpy got off to a blinder with a drive onto the front edge of the green on the first hole. Gerard, Stu Coops and Shane Cumming also all had short chips to try and set up a birdie on the first after some good drives but it was Peter Hutson who had the perfect start to the day. Pete converted his good drive and made a birdie 3. He also was rewarded with a skin on the first hole of the day. We are a bit sketchy on the exact details. We did ask him for more information about how he played the hole to incorporate it into the blurb but as is often the case with Peter these days he would only say the same words over and over and over again. Yep you guessed it “I bought a Jeep.”



Tony MacIsaac claimed a skin on the 10th hole when he set up an easy birdie with a brilliant shot into the 10th green. It was a glorious moment in what was otherwise a pretty tough day for Tony who finished the day unfortunately in Beer Wench position.

Greg Parsons played a spectacular shot into the Par 3 12th hole. The ChocTop entrepreneur played a deliberate shot using the strong cross wind to feed his ball towards the hole. Greg's ball for a long time

looked as though it may even roll into the cup to win the Evergreen Winery Tours Hole in One prize but unfortunately it just missed the ace but nonetheless set Greg up with a very makeable 160cm birdie putt. Unfortunately for Greg, Stu Coops actually managed to sink his birdie attempt from 3200cm which suddenly made Greg's putt look all the more difficult. The good news was that Mr. ChocTops NTP effort held firm for the remainder of the day and he won the NTP prize ball, but the bad news was that he was not able to add a birdie onto his scorecard.

Steve Powne suffered a similar fate. As Steve knocked his third shot into the back of the cup on the Par 4 ninth hole, his playing partner SOS kindly reminded him that his score was a birdie except for the three drives that he had played from the tee that had failed to get passed the ladies tees.

As you can imagine Steve was devastated when he was forced to write his birdie three as an eight on the scorecard. Especially when he heard how on the same hole Stu Coops had managed to turn potentially an 11 of tee into a Par. Stu hit his first shot on the tight tree line on the left hand side of the fairway and chose to hit a provisional ball fearing it may have dropped into the garden beds and be lost. The provisional ball scuttled into the thick grass at the front of the tee and was recovered as an unplayable lie. The ball was dropped and the previous shot replicated perfectly. The ball was recovered, declared unplayable and dropped again. Given, potentially he was hitting five off the tee it was not the time to top the ball into the grass for a third time in a row but that's exactly what Stu did.

By the time Stu's playing partners were three quarters of the way up the fairway before Stu had hit his seventh shot which was in the form of a snap hook which flew out over the trees and landed with a crash on the roof of the greens keepers shed. It was about then when Stu was about to reload his next shot when Greg called back down the fairway to advise Stu that his first ball had actually managed to stay in play. Stu went onto to play the original ball and hit it onto the green and then two putted for a miraculous par. Had he not found the original ball his score was looking as though it had the potential to surpass Newell Richards brilliant 17 which he scored last month on the Par 3 6th hole at Kingston Links.

Congratulations to Stu who actually racked up his 10,000th shot with the Sunday Leave Pass Social Club. Excluding provisional balls which would probably add an extra 800-1000 shots Stu has now hit the ball 10061 times from his 106 rounds of Golf in SLP competitions.

Shane Cumming only has 9981 shots to catch up to Stu however he has already proved himself to be very competent with the golf club. Shane shot the equal lowest score for the day (80 off the stick) despite standing on the wrong side of the club. Shane was allocated a very impressive Callaway handicap of 8. His round featured 7x pars, 9x bogies and a birdie and gave his mate SOS a lesson on how to play golf. The usually consistent SOS could handle the pressure of Shane's performance and was even forced to dig his hand into his deep pockets to find \$5-00 to pay the fine for failing to hit past the squatters tees.

Fitzy on the other hand was riding on the bow wave of Shane Cumming's excellent performance. Fitzy also played some inspired golf. He was sitting on just 27 shots for the back nine holes as he stood on the 16th tee. Unfortunately the pressure got the better of him and by the time he putted his ball into the hole on the 18th green he had racked up an extra 20x shots in the last three holes and had blown what could have otherwise been a very tidy round of golf.

Player of the day was most definitely Phil Plane who scored 15 championship points for his Nett 63. Even with the 1.3 shots the handicapper has taken off his handicap for next month he would still be a strong candidate for a win if he is able to shoot 93 again for the next round at Whittlesea. Stu Coops had a good day with the putter. He only had 27 putts for the day. Stu was very fortunate in the end especially since his Nett 67 was very lucky to beat Tony Grasso, Stuart Holbrook and Tony Grasso Junior on a count-back.

Stuart Holbrook may be the person to watch out for over the next few months. The handicapper has been very generous starting him off on a handicap of 17 when he obviously can play at a much lower handicap than that. Slinky played a very tidy round of golf finishing in 6th place with Nett 71. Shane Cumming and Mick Harper shot the equal lowest score for the day, hitting 80 with both guys playing off an 8 handicap.
