## Ringwood Golf Course Results

## September

Even before the first ball was hit, the entire golf course was well aware that the Sunday Leave Pass boys were in town. If the blue shirts were not a big enough give away then the announcement over the pro-shop PA system was sufficient to let all and sundry know that we had arrived. As we stood on the tee there preparing to take on the Ringwood Golf Course there was a loud announcement to actually wish Steve O'Sullivan a Happy Birthday. We are not sure who put them up to it, the message allegedly came from Mrs. O'Sullivan although the chances are it may have been Mick or Gerard who had been at the course from 7-30am that morning enjoying a romantic hearty breakfast before the golf got underway at 10am.

They say, you know you are getting old when your eyesight starts to go. SOS's start to the day certainly proved that this hypothesis is a truthful reality. Having moved yet another year past the wrong side of fifty, SOS is finding his eyesight is starting to wane. There was some very impressive golf played at Ringwood, Big Mick shot one over par 36 on the front nine including 3 birdies, one of those being a 2 putt birdie after he hit his second shot on the par 5 fourth hole onto the green giving him a genuine eagle chance. Unfortunately Mick then gave 10 shots back to the golf course on the back nine and therefore his round didn't quite finish the way it could or should have.

Gerard MacIsaac played a consistent standard of golf and his 9 hole scores of 38 and 38 (76) were easily the best for the day and ultimately he came with in fingertip reach of claiming yet another Sunday Leave Pass title.

The course played relatively easily and Stu Coops chirped in with a couple of birdies including a couple of outside eagle chances on the $6^{\text {th }}$ and $9^{\text {th }}$ holes although putting from off the fringe of the green doesn't really count as calling the eagle putts.

Phil Plane scored brilliantly breaking the century mark for the third time in his Sunday Leave Pass career. Geoff Cooper, Rick Turcinovic and even Highway were all in the low 100's. Given the quality of the scores it took a spectacular round to get the 15 championship points.

Dale Robinson would have been in the hunt for another win except that he crashed and burned on the $18^{\text {th }}$ hole. The prospect of winning concurrent monthly titles or the fact that he had to endure 17 holes with the Supercoach yapping in his ear all of the way was all too much for Dale and he choked and scored one of the few Newells (score of 10 or more (Dale had an 11)) on the last hole.

Interestingly Highway (Newell) didn't actually have a Newell for the day. This was only the second time in his golfing career that he has gone a complete round without notching up double figures at least once. It should be noted that he had golfed every day except for Saturday for the week leading up so his swing should have been in a pretty good place. In fact when we went into the pro-shop to collect the scorecards, the guy from behind the counter actually greeted Newell by name and said "good to see you here again," so the reality is Newell must have spent a fair whack of time getting to know the course in advance. The practice has
paid off as he hit 102 Nett 68 and almost drove the green on the par 4 ninth hole. Unfortunately his ball landed pin high in the green side bunker and he managed to skinny his ball across the green, hit a shank with his chip shot, and turned a certain par into a triple bogie in the blink of an eye.

Colin Ewart also came close to having an eagle, however his eagle attempt on the $7^{\text {th }}$ hole lipped out from 160 meters. Colin hit the perfect drive straight down the middle of the fairway and then he followed that up with a sweetly struck 6 iron which from the moment he hit it was always on target for the flag stick. Colins ball actually slam dunked into the back of the cup, and then bounced out sideways and ran back off the green. For those people who often question the information posted in the blurb as being the less than the truth we have included a photo of the pitch mark where Colin's ball hit the hole. If you look close enough you can actually see the dimple marks pattern in the soil.


Congratulations to Breandan Seagrave who was in a happy mood after carding the remarkable score needed to win the monthly title. Grumpy had a great score, 83 Nett 63 which gave him the September title and 15 Championship points. Interestingly he was still fined $\$ 2$ for kicking his club away in frustration, which was quite bazaar given that he played so well all day and he actually only played one bad shot for the entire round and still managed to throw a hissy fit. No wonder his friends and enemies call him Grumpy.

When asked what was the secret to his new found form Grumpy referred back to the cinematography masterpiece "Happy Gilmore" and told us that he had found his Happy Place. Evidently Grumpy is Happy when he is sitting on his grandmas crocheted blanket meditating with a beer in his hand and his golf is also better for it.

With so many great scores it was a difficult task to feature at the top end of the leaderboard. Grumpy in his happy place was the best performer shooting a score of 63 , Gerard was unlucky to only finish in $2^{\text {nd }}$ pace with a score of 76 off the stick. Highway continues to feature in the top three places, so we are hoping the handicapper starts to get into him based on the number of rounds he plays rather than the number of shots he plays. Phil Plane and Stu Coops shared a 69 together and Geoff Cooper and Tony Grasso both finished with Nett Par 70 and found themselves ranked in $6^{\text {th }}$ and7th position respectively.

## REMINDER HOW 3 PUTT MONKEY GAME WORKS


*As part of the putting competition this year, as a brainchild suggestion from Paul Blizzard we have introduced the Three Putt Monkey game. At the start of each round every group will be given a flouro yellow 3 Putt Monkey vest and whenever a person has a $\mathbf{3}$ putt or worse that player must put on the 3 Putt Monkey Vest and wear it until another player in the group has a $\mathbf{3}$ putt or more. The player wearing the 3 putt Monkey vest at the completion of the $18^{\text {th }}$ hole will be required to chip in an additional $\$ 2$ into the fine jar. If multiple players have a $\mathbf{3}$ putt or worse the player who was last into the hole wins the vest irrespective of whether the other player before them had a 3 putt, four putt or even a seven putt. The furthest player from the hole should always putt first on the green and that player is deemed as in control and therefore has the option of marking their ball if they miss the putt or putting out. If they chose to putt out and then the following person three putts then the last person to putt out gets the vest.

Handicaps were adjusted with brazen disregard, Adam Cooper was issued an extra half a shot even though it was only 2 rounds ago he finished with a Nett 58. Andrew Pugh has been given 2.3 shots for next month, Greg Parsons, Slinky and Stuart were all given a boost and while the handicapper is finally starting to take chunks out of Highways handicap he is reallocating them back to Colin Ewart.
