Eagle 3 on the par 5 fourth Hole

Todd Empties the Eagles Nest winning 10 balls.



Todd Neilson has joined an elite group of golfers by becoming just the 15th person to score an eagle in a Sunday Leave Pass Competition. Todd is only 10 rounds into his SLP career but he has already etched his name into the record books having claimed a monthly title, beer wench, several NTP prizes and now an eagle. To put it into context Todd has achieved more in 10 rounds than Tony Mac has done in 99.

Todd's eagle was kept very hush-hush on Sunday, we didn't actually even find out about it until we were entering the scores into the data base and so when it was discovered that he had had a 3 for 0 putts on a par 5 we challenged it as a typo on both score cards.

Two credible witnesses came forward to vouch for Todd's eagle, but when he was asked why it wasn't mentioned at the bar to receive the appropriate kudos for the great effort his answer was as simple as this **"Yup! I got an eagle" "But I didn't want to pump my own tyre's up!"**

Perhaps the reason Todd was quiet about the eagle was because the shot didn't quite go according to plan. Evidently he hit Driver, 3 Wood, then a 9 iron to complete the eagle but the nine iron stroke was not quite as good as the previous two hits. According to Todd he was 90 meters out, when he hit his 9 iron but didn't get under it and the ball went a little lower than he imagined. As the ball bladed out only a meter or two off the ground he turned to Shanno Cummin (Cider) and said "That's not how I imagined that shot was gonna go. Shanno ever the optimist assured him that it was gonna be a great result anyway and true to his word the ball bee lined straight at the flag, skidded on the front edge then rolled up onto the green hit the pin and dropped into the hole for an Eagle 3.

Todd wins the Eagles nest prize which was at 10 balls and we reset the prize pool at 6 and start again.

Ringwood Golf Course Results

September

Todd was lucky in a way that he didn't have to share the eagles nest prize pool with someone else, Mick Harper missed an eagle putt on the same hole and Popeye (alias Will Fernie) gave away two eagle opportunities.

If you were not sure about Will's strength and ability to hit the big ball then let's put it into perspective. Todd hit driver, 3 wood then a nine iron from 90 meters out to make his eagle whereas Will hit driver, then a hybrid on the same hole and was on the green putting for eagle from 4 meters away. Will also hit his six iron onto the back of the green from the tee on to the 206 meter Par 4 ninth hole to give himself a very makeable eagle putt which just veered off at the last minute.

Popeye had a very good day on his home course, he blasted his way into first place to win his maiden SLP title with a score of 83 (Nett 64) which included a 9 on the 15th hole. Popeye claimed the crown of the club power house and SLP long driver by out driving Big Micks drives on the fly.

On the first hole Jamie Brunton eased into a 200 meter drive down the middle of the fairway, then Big Mick followed suit hitting the perfect draw to within 20 meters of the front of the green. Popeye then went one further and knocked his ball past Micks on the full and it finished on the front fringe of the green. With three great drives in a row the spectators looked on in anticipation when Big Beal Breasley stepped up on to the tee as the last player in the group. Could it be possible that every member of the foursome hit a perfect shot down the middle, and if the trend continued it was highly likely that big Ball Breasley would improve in his predecessor and knock his drive even further and therefore hit onto the green of the 303meter first hole. Unfortunately it wasn't to be the case, in fact Greg's Drive fell 302 meters and 90cm short of the mark as his big wind up did little more than splash enough mud to dislodge it from the tee. By the time he had walked off to collect his clubs Greg had maxed out on his fine jar. He had been hit up with \$2 for an airswing, \$5 for not passing the ladies markers, his next shot was a shank which cost him \$2 and even worse his shank travelled across 2x fairways (\$2) so it was certainly an adventurous start to his round of golf. Things didn't get much better and he finished in beer wench position after carding the worst score for the day.

Cliff Rowe hit the longest drive of the day and as it was on the longest drive hole he probably has a valid claim for the longest drive title although the prize was actually awarded to popeye. Cliff smashed a Stuey Cooper style long ball out over the lake on the 17th hole, and as it was a wild shot in the wrong direction he declared the ball lost and went on to play out the hole with his provisional ball. Things didn't quite go very well and he finished off completing the hole with a Newell (score of 10 or more) on the scorecard. Unbeknownst to Cliff his tee shot was not lost, it actually carried the entire lake and finished almost pin high to the 17th green but on the 15th fairway. Had he found the ball he would have been in prime position to set up a birdie opportunity but more importantly he could have made a case for the longest drive prize as arguably his ball was on the fairway and not in the rough even if it wasn't quite the correct fairway.

Newell was on holidays in England this month and therefore we didn't think he was able to turn up at Ringwood but as it happens there were everywhere. We had 10x Newell's (score of 10 or more) including Col Ewart who managed to rack up a dozen shots on the 13th hole. After his disastrous performance at Werribee Park, Newell was meant to be the Beer Wench this month so we gave him the option of posting a score from England on the condition that he provided evidence that he wore the pink vest while he played. True to his word Newell had a game over in England however we cannot honor the scores as he did not wear the beer wench vest. Whats more we cannot prove the validity of his score as it sounded a bit suspicious as the scores seemed a bit low for Highway's golfing prowess. It should be said that Stu Coops' reply to Newells post about his score was a classic slap down.

Unfortunately we were unable to accept Newell's score because his claim to have shot 107 after hitting 129 at Werribee Park seemed a bit farfetched and unbelievable without a creditable SLP member to vouch for him. Although once he posted some photos of the golf course that he was playing at we soon realized that he was playing on a course where each hole was only several meters apart and therefore for him to shot 107 was within the realms of possibility.



The Supercoach and his brother Chris both had a birdie on the first hole to start the day. It is probably the only time in his 44 years of life that Chris has been happy to do the same thing as Mark.

Greg Parsons had a horror day with the putter he had eight three putts and a four putt so it was little wonder he ended the day wearing the 3 putt monkey vest. We are yet to work out how he did it but Greg actually even managed to leave a 3 inch putt short. Tom Kellythorn also had a shocking day on the short stuff. Tom hit the ball brilliantly however once he got onto the green his game fell apart. Tom was seen wearing the three putt monkey vest for 17 out of the 18 holes so he will rue the memories of the Ringwood round because he came second and only lost by one shot so any one of his 6x three putts he can easily attribute as the miss that cost him his first monthly title. Tom missed on at least 3 holes where on a normal game the putt would have been called a gimmie.

Greg Breasley had the chance to hand over the yellow vest to Mick Harper, when all he needed to do was tap a four inch putt directly into the hole. Knowing how much of a miserable day Greg was having, Mick was even so kind as to suggest to Greg that his ball was covered in mud and to clean it before he putted so it doesn't slide off the face sideways. Never one to be told what to do Greg ignored the advice, and needless to say at the end of the hole, Mick had managed to avoid donning the monkey vest as Greg missed the 4 inch putt. Evidently as Mick had predicted, Greg's putter hit the mud and the outcome was a shanked putt that missed the hole to the left by about the same distance as he had hit it forwards.

Douggo had a solid round of golf and he finished in third place for the day, although it should be said that he was aided slightly by the fact that the Ringwood course was set up to suit a left hander.

There were some very commendable scores this month, to finish in the top 10 required a score of par or better. Will Fernie was the best of the bunch and had it not been for a brain fade on the 15th hole he could have scored into the high 70's. Tom Kellythorn will put Ringwood down as the one that got away, his ball striking was faultless so it is tragic to think that his lack of concentration with the putter cost him the top ranking in September. Peter Hutson and Todd Neilson were both able to play sub nett-par rounds and finished in 4th and 5th positions respectively.

Mick Harper is back where he is used to being, he's moved back into the bridesmaid position on the seasons points championship ladder and it is a question whether he will have enough time and the skills to reign in Andrew Clarke's lead.

As a new member of the Social Club the Callaway Handicapping system is used to give the player a daily played to handicap for the first couple of rounds. Once they have played 3 rounds they are given a temporary club handicap using the original AGU handicapping system. After 5 rounds they are then switched across to the current slope handicapping system.

This system is used for determining fair allowances for social golf events that attract novices or occasional golfers. A player's Callaway handicap is determined after each round by deducting from his/her 18 hole gross score the scores of the worst individual holes during the first 16 holes of the round.

In the computation of handicaps under this system:

- No hole may be scored at more than twice its par,
- half strokes count as a whole,
- the 17th and 18th holes are never deducted,

For example if a player scores 99 on the day their handicap would be calculated as the sum total of their (3 worst holes) +1

If a player scores 82 on the day their handicap would be calculated as the sum total of their (worst + ½ the 2nd worst hole) -1

If a player scores 120 on the day their handicap would be calculated as the sum total of their (five worst holes) +2

After 3 rounds they will be allocated a temporary handicap using the old AGU handicapping formula and then after 5 rounds they are elevated onto the official Slope handicapping system which was use thereafter for all club competitions.
