

Rosebud Golf Course Results July

The 5am rise for a 630 hit off in pitch darkness was a brave move but proved to be a worthwhile especially since two of the early starters finished in the top 5 rankings for July. It should be said that the pro-shop staff were completely perplexed when Dale, Stu and Mick arrived at Rosebud 45 minutes before daybreak and then armed with a heavy duty spotlight and a bag full of glow in the dark golf balls asked to be directed to the first tee. The lack of visibility did nothing to impinge on the golf. Dale smashed his drive straight down the middle of the fairway then hit his second shot to within 6 feet from the flag he missed the birdie putt but made an easy par on the first hole. Ignorant of the large bunkers encroaching into the fairway Mick Harper caressed his hybrid into a perfect position only a short wedge distance out from the green, he lobbed his next shot onto the putting surface and made the whole game of golf even in the dark look like a simple task. Stu Coops was wayward as always but the glowing golf ball made finding the ball a cinch.

Even when the dawn broke 40 minutes into the round the two boys continued to play brilliantly. Dale played his best round for 2014 and finished the round in fourth position and Mick completed the day with the best gross score (84) and the lowest Nett score and therefor was a worthy winner of the monthly title and Rosebud.

Perhaps there was an advantage to playing in the pre-dawn as it was the best time of the day, there was not a breath of wind for the first 14 holes but then about 830 -900am the wind picked up and made the difficult Rosebud course play even tougher than it already is.

The scorecards were reflective of the difficult nature of the Rosebud course. Not one player was able to play to their handicap and only 8 of 26 players were able to break Nett 80, which is usually the benchmark for an OK to average round. As testament to how hard the course played, the ever reliable and most consistent Gerard MacIsaac shot his worst ever round with the Sunday Leave Pass Social Club. We are yet to prove it was genuine however according to his scorecard Gerard's adventures resulted in a score of 104 off the stick featuring a fourteen on the 8th hole and included a 7xputt green.

Putting on the large undulations and lightning quick greens was a difficult task for many and Gerard wasn't the only one who struggled to cope the flat stick. The fine jar was full to the brim with contributions derived from 4 putt greens and even a few guys managed to hit the ball from on the green to off the green.

Special thanks to El Presidente "SOS" who stepped up to run the order of ceremonies in Stu Coops' absence, like a true leader he was also able to run a contingency plan for sorting out the playing groups when the designated groups coordinator "Highway" somehow got lost on the drive to Rosebud and failed to arrive to fulfill his duties on time.

Brett Meyer had no difficulties with his driving skills. Not only was he the first person in the car park ready to play but he also had full control of his drives around the fairways. On the 6th hole he smashed his ball a Rory Macillroy like distance off the tee and he was a clear cut winner of the longest drive title. To put Brett's drive in perspective even the inform Mick Harper was 40 meters short of the mark.

It was great to see Peter Hutson out on the fairways with his new baby jeep. The remote control buggy is just what Pete needed to help him to navigate the fairways and it also keeps him from grieving when he is away from his beloved Mamma jeep. The whole idea of using a motorized buggy is to conserve energy on the walk around the golf course and Pete should find the going easy now he doesn't have to drag his bag around. He will also get plenty of battery life out of the electronics going by what we saw on Sunday. Between his second and third shots on the 10th hole Pete didn't even need to move the buggy anywhere since his swat at the ball only managed to move it 3 feet in front of where he was standing.



Given that we weren't present to bear witness to the stories about the trials and tribulations of Sundays round it is very difficult to give an accurate account of the day's events so we have simply enclosed the place rankings and results for this month instead.

Congratulations to Mick Harper who managed to beat Peter Hutson on a countback. Perhaps the only shot between the two of them was Peter's 3foot duffed shot on the tenth hole. Remembering that the count back is calculated on the player's scores on the back nine and given Mick played the majority of the back nine in the dark he is a deserved winner for the day.

On a very challenging and difficult course Rick Turcinovic has produced a commendable round. He scored 106 off the stick, Nett 76 and finished in 3rd position for a return of 13 championship points just ahead of Dale on a countback. Interestingly Rick was the only player to lose some shots to the handicapper this month. Where most players either remained unchanged or were given a little bit extra, Rick lost 0.3 shots for next month.

Larry Campbell and Glenn Douglas as is often the case on the more difficult courses, under the Callaway Handicap system both featured at the pointy end of the leaderboard. Larry finished in 5th spot and Glenn with a handicap of 19 finished with 10 championship points for finishing in sixth pace.

After sixth the scores got progressively uglier. Conditions must have been very difficult especially when you see names like Gerard MacIsaac, Tony Grasso and even the Supercoach joining Newell at the tail end of the field. Let's just hope the Yarrambat game is a bit more user friendly for everyone.




