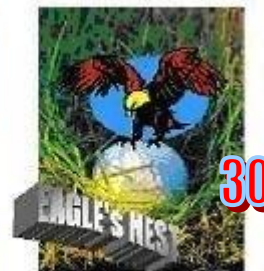

Rosebud Golf Course Results July

Yet another disappointing field this month, we need to work out whether the social club remains a viable organisation. Given the very poor attendance numbers during 2012 and even to some extent last year we need to decide what to do in 2013 and going forward. Our bookings for Sunday were only 13 players and when you take into consideration that of those there were 3x last minute withdrawals, and we could only replace one of them so it was a very poor showing indeed. We were lucky that 3x guys were committed enough to play on the Saturday afternoon just to boost the numbers a little bit for us. So thanks and well done to Dale, Rick and Phil for making your contribution to the Social Club event, even if your scorecards were so bad that the people in the Pro-shop threw them away before we had a chance to laugh at them.

It would be appreciated to hear some feedback from some of the guys who were once regular players and have remained on the email distribution list but have hardly played in the last 18 months. We want to know if there is a reason for your lack of participation and a pattern behind the declining numbers. We are interested to know if it is a cost issue, distance travelling, event timing or even if there is political or demographic reason why we are struggling to keep people playing. We would be grateful for all honest feedback or any suggestions.

For those that attended it was a magnificent day, a heavy fog lay across the farms as we drove down to Rosebud, so we knew we were in for a cracking day down on the Mornington Peninsula on a very calm, windless day. The course was perfectly dry and the greens were beautifully manicured, even if they were a bit roller coaster ride crazy at times. Despite the undulations they did run fast and true and the slight dew on the grass gave a good guide as to the size of the break just by looking where the ball marks were made from the groups who'd played before us.

Rosebud has been known for its challenging layout and traditionally it has always been the better golfers who win the event. Whereas the good players thrive, the rest of us hacks struggle to play anywhere remotely close to our handicap at Rosebud. In the early days it was gifted golfers like Daniel DeMarinis & Mark Fitzpatrick who found success on the difficult course and Big Mick has already claimed the title in 2010 & 2011 and not surprisingly he was on track to do it again this year too. Mick shot a blistering pace, hitting a one over par 37 on the front nine. The big fella had his hands, as good as on the trophy, but unfortunately with an "Adam Scott at the British Open" like performance he choked on the closing holes and squandered away a four shot buffer on the back nine to lose the monthly title by two shots.

Congratulations to Carl Schwarz who travelled all the way from Bright to join us and he was a deserved recipient of his first Sunday Leave Pass monthly title. Carl played his third round with the social club and therefore was awarded an official club handicap. It's hard to tell if Carl's handicap is a true representation of his golfing ability since there has been a 4 year gap since he played his first two rounds in 2008. Although the scores Carl has posted with the Sunday Leave Pass Social Club are reflective of a 23 handicap, it is rumoured that he is playing off single figures and is actually a representative for the men's senior Pennant at the Bright Golf Club. Carl played some wonderful golf, he kept the ball straight down the middle of the fairway for the entire day and therefore he never got into any trouble except when it came to the putting surface. He shot 92 off the stick and despite having 40 putts he still posted the lowest score for the day (Nett 69) two shots ahead of his nearest rival.

There were a few eyebrows raised when Greg Parsons volunteered his father-in-law as a starter for the Rosebud round and things were looking even more sinister when for the first time in 9 seasons the name Greg Parsons suddenly appeared on the nearest to pin markers on multiple occasions. Steve Powne summed it up so eloquently when he was collecting the NTP markers and he noticed Greg's name on both the 12th and 14th holes. "This can't be true, there is no way Greg could have won 2x NTP holes, he must be cheating or else they have the wrong name on the markers." Steve was correct, Greg never actually came close to hitting a green in regulation but it was Carl who was hitting his shots at the flagstick and he won two of the NTP prizes as a reward for his great efforts.

Gerard MacIsaac came within 2 inches of knocking Carl off for nearest to Pin on the 12th hole and proved he was also able to hit the ball at the flag stick too. Gerard chipped in for birdie from 50 meters out on the par 4, 16th hole and dropped putts from anywhere and everywhere. Incredibly Gerard got around the difficult Rosebud greens with only 27 putts including a back nine that consisted of only 12 shots with the flat stick. This magnificent putting performance elevated Gerard back to the top of the putting competition leaderboard, with an average of 32.07 putts per round. That's pretty good when you compare it to Greg Breasley who averages 40.33 attempts to get the ball in the hole per round.

Stu Cooper demonstrated to his playing partners that the easiest way to keep your putt scores down was to leave the ball so close to the hole that it is impossible to miss. On the 15th hole Stu had hooked his ball dead into a cluster of big old gum trees. He was faced with a 40cm gap of daylight between the trees and opted to take the challenge to try and get his ball moving toward the green rather than take the safer option and chip out onto the fairway. Stu grabbed his trusty six iron and punched his ball through the narrow gap. It bounced off the trunk of both trees like a pin ball and then ricocheted across to the other side of the fairway, it ran under Greg Breasley's golf bag and came to rest embedded in 6 inches of deep scrub in a greenside garden bed. Stu was still not perplexed by the difficulty of his new situation and for his next shot he chopped his sand iron through the thick grass like a farmer splitting firewood. His ball jumped out of the thicket and it flew high and fast. It landed about a meter in front of the hole, then bounced up into the flag pole, Stu's ball rolled up the stick, entangled itself in the flag then dropped straight back down and stopped 1½ inches from the cup setting him up for an easy tap in par. Big ball Breasley was rotable, in his opinion the ball was destined for more trouble and he reckoned it should have rolled off the green and finished in the bunker on the other side. I stand firm that I meant it and the hole had been played out exactly the way I had scripted it too.

Perhaps Big Ball Breasley was suffering from a bit of sour grapes, especially since he had already managed to conjure up fine jar contributions for his misdemeanours which included an air swing in the bunker on the 4th hole and a shank on the ninth hole.

The bunkers it seems were not the best place to be. Greg Parson discovered this when his approach to the green on the par 5, eleventh hole fell 100mm short of landing on the putting surface. Rather than having a good chance to putt for Birdie or worst case scenario Par, Greg was suddenly faced with a daunting splash shot from the deep cavernous sand trap. History shows that the industrious school teacher is not as proficient out of the sand as most people. Last year at Centenary Park they had to send out a search party to rescue him after he got buried himself up to his neck when he got stuck in the sand after duffing four shots in a row. Greg broke his own personal record on Sunday when he amassed a total of 6 shots to get his ball back out from the bunker and therefore converted a great score to a disastrous 11. Unfortunately for GP, those 6 strokes were ultimately the difference between finishing in 5th place and 10th place on the day.

It would not be surprising if Greg requests to play with Big Mick next month in an attempt to get himself a free bunker lesson. Mick has become an asset to his playing partners as he is very generous with his time while out on the golf course and he is always willing to offer some valuable tips or advice. On Sunday Mick took Tony Grasso Junior under his wing. With a handicap of 8 and the ability to shoot 37 off the stick, Mick is well qualified to pass on some of his expertise about the game. Having watched Junior butcher the ball for the first nine holes, Mick took it upon himself to help the young fella to improve his game. A pointer here and a little tip there and hey presto Tony Grasso Juniors golf improved dramatically. In fact the turnaround was quite remarkable when you consider he shot 72 for the first nine holes and then 52 on the home stretch. Any person who can improve a person's game by 20 shots is well within their rights to claim the title and call themselves the Supercoach. Congratulations and well done Mick.

Once again with the small field all participants were able to pick up plenty of championship points. Carl Schwarz took maximum points with his Nett 69. Big Mick choked on the back nine but still shot 80 and the lowest gross score for the day. Mick has moved to the top of the leaderboard at the perfect time as we are starting to get to the pointy end of the season. Stu Cooper finished the day in third place with Nett 74. Gerard MacIsaacs brilliant putting display kept him in the points, he shot 85 and finished in 4th position overall. Peter Engberg made an impressive debut performance, under the Callaway Handicap scoring system he was off 23 and shot 99 off the stick giving him 5th spot and 11 Championship points to start his club account.
