

Stuart has already amassed 25 points from 2 rounds so it will be interesting to see what happens next month when he will be given an official Sunday Leave Pass Club handicap to contend with.

Greg Parsons finished in 3rd place, despite scoring a 9 and an 8 in the first third of the golf course, Greg then played the remaining holes, (especially the back nine), brilliantly and gave us a sneak peak reminder of the form that won him the seasons championship way back in 2009.

Stu Coops also had a good back nine and finished the day with a score which was enough to satisfy the scorers to allocate him 4th spot for the month and elevate him up into 3rd spot on the order of merit having past Ben Nichols and Tony MacIsaac who were both no-shows for the Rosebud round.

Mick Harper and Phil Plane both scored 81 Nett, however Mick finished higher on a count back and therefor finished in 5th position.
