# **Keilor Park Results**

We managed to get through the entire Autumn & Winter without having to deal with any poor weather however the start of spring brought on an absolute shocker. 15 players turned up (plus yet again one no-show. There is no excuse for not turning up and not even calling to say that you aren't coming) and only 6 people managed to complete the entire 18 holes. Gale forced winds made the going tough, hitting into the head wind was near impossible, and once the driving rain and hail came into the equation mid way through the front nine everyone ducked for cover.

A special thanks to Inness and the staff at Keilor Park House of Golf, who put on a BBQ, while we sat around and waited for a break in the weather. After a good feed and a long wait we did get the opportunity to get back again to try and finish the round. Comforted by the fact that the two competition leaders Rick & Daniel had packed up their skirts and had gone home, everyone ceased the opportunity to go back out on the course and try to peg back what was otherwise quickly becoming an unassailable lead on the championship points tally.

Another torrent of bad weather on the back 9 was enough to end the round for most of the field, however insanity prevailed and Gerard, Matt, Tony, Adam, Dale and Stuey Coops all managed to drag themselves like drowned rats, down the 18<sup>th</sup> fairway to complete the round.

Damijan started the day off with a drive that allowed him to hit his first ever birdie. The only problem was that this birdie was one of the feathered kind. Damijan's tee shot was hit just as a pair of birds flew across the fairway in front of the tee. His cracking drive finished with a puff of feathers and his ball ricocheting into the bushes and the bird ceasing to exist, other than in spirit. This amazing stroke of misfortune set the trend for a barrage of birdies for the day. Rick putted from off the green to make birdie on the first hole, then sunk a 30foot put on the third hole for another birdie. (He was 2 under par after 3 holes, luckily the rain came and he went home early) Inness chipped in for a 2 on the Par 3, second hole, then Daniel DeMarinis hit his second shot on the Par 5, 3<sup>rd</sup> hole from an impossible position under bushes along side the Calder Highway, his shot went around and through several trees bounced off four sprinkler heads and finished 6 feet from the flag giving him an easy eagle putt. The opportunity to win the 20 golf balls from the Eagles Nest was all too much pressure for Daniel. He missed the eagle but made the simplest of birdies.

Despite several rain interruptions, a few reasonable scores were still posted. 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> place and 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> positions were all determined on a count back.

Points were allocated according to players rankings only for those 6 players who were stupid enough to finish the round whereas everyone else were given one point for turning up and giving it a go.

When players finish with the same Nett score the points distribution and place rankings are calculated using a formula that takes into consideration the players score on the back nine holes, this compares the total Stableford points scored on the back nine and then works backwards from the 18<sup>th</sup> hole until an outright winner is found.

E.g. Matt and Stuart both had a score of 71 but Stuart scored 20 stableford points on the back nine, compared to Matt who had 18 points, therefore Stuart finished with a higher ranking.

## Reminder

The ball must be clearly on the CUT surface of the green or fairway to win NTP or longest drive. If it is not on the fairway it doesn't count.

Each player won 1 ball each.

An extra golf ball has been added to the Eagles Nest since nobody won the  $2^{nd}$  and  $14^{th}$  hole nearest to the pins.

With Rick & Daniel not featuring in the top 10 this month, suddenly the points leader board looks a lot closer and competitive than it has been for a long time, 5 or 6 people are within reach of the lead. So the next two rounds will be very interesting. Hopefully, this year the Championship trophy will be determined by the scores on the final round at the Tocumwal Golf trip and there may still be a number of players will be still in the running.
